The President today announced his intention to nominate Alan Greenspan to be United States Alternate Governor of the International Monetary Fund for a term of five years. He would succeed Paul A. Volcker.

Mr. Greenspan is currently Chairman and Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System. Prior to this he was President and Chairman of Townsend-Greenspan Co & Inc., 1954-1974 and 1977-1987. Mr. Greenspan served on the Council of Economic Advisers, 1970-1974; Chairman of the Council of Economic Advisers, 1974-1977; and was a member of the President's Economic Policy Advisory Board, 1981.

Mr. Greenspan graduated from New York University (B.S., 1948; M.A., 1950; and Ph.D., 1977). He was born March 6, 1926 in New York City and resides in Washington, D.C.

During his speech today at the IMF/World Bank annual meeting, Jim Baker made three proposals for improved management of the international economy.

The G-7 coordination process A New Economic Indicator. 1. agreed to at Tokyo and reaffirmed at Venice includes agreement on a group of economic indicators that will be used to discuss macroeconomic performance of G-7 countries. Indicators include growth rates, external imbalances, and exchange rates. Baker proposes that a new indicator be added: the relationship among G-7 currencies and a basket of commodities, including gold. His aim is to detect when coordination is producing inflation that reduces the real value of all G-7 currencies.

An External Contingency Facility (ECF). The ECF would help 2. cushion the adverse effects on IMF stand-by programs of external, unforeseen developments such as weaker commodity prices, lower export volumes, natural disasters, and sustained higher interest rates. The existing Compensatory Financing Facility, which provides the same cushion for commodity price movements, would be folded into the ECF.

Longer Review Periods for IMF Stand-by Agreements. IMF 3. programs are now reviewed quarterly. Since commercial financing is usually linked to compliance with IMF programs, even minor technical non-compliance often produces quarterly financing crises. Baker would shift to reviews every six months and focus the IMF on broader macroeconomic targets rather than specific technical targets.

The changes are positive, especially the proposed ECF. COMMENT. The additional indicator may be useful, but could also cause renewed speculation about U.S. intentions to move to a gold standard. We will be following international reaction closely.

The President today announced his intention to nominate Charles S. Warner to be United States Alternate Executive Director of the International Monetary Fund for a term of two years. He would succeed Mary Kate Bush.

Since 1986, Mr. Warner has been Deputy Director-General for the United Nations Industrial Development Organization in Vienna, Austria. Prior to this, he was Director for the International Trade Services for Coopers & Lybrand, 1984-1986. He worked at the Department of Commerce from 1981-1984 as: Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Economic Development Administration; and Director of the Office of Export Trading Company Affairs at the International Trade Administration. He was President and Chief Executive Officer of The Piedmont Land Company, 1976-1981; Director of Finance for the William P. Lipscomb Company, 1972-1976; and Chairman and CEO for Taconic Group, Inc., 1968-1972.

Mr. Warner graduated from the University of Virginia (B.A., 1954). He served in the United States Marine Corps, 1951-1957. Mr. Warner was born September 10, 1931 in Washington, D.C. He is married and currently resides in Vienna, Austria.
