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

Dear Mr. Baker:

Our Government is writing to you about the continued aggression against the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads by the Republic of the Philippines, Communist Victnam, Communist China and Taiwan. These countries have no right to occupy any part of the sacred territory of Morac-Songhrati-Meads.

Our country is one of theoldest in theworld, having been formed in the 1860s and originally called the Territory of Captain James George Mead, later the Territory of Franklin M. Meads, then the Kingdom of Humanity and now the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads. Captain James George Mead was British, Franklin M. Meads was American, and the latter's grandson is now the President and Chief of State.

Other countries frequently appear in the news and thus the average citizen learns much about various countries of theworld. However, Communist China, Nationalist China, Philippines and Communist Vietnam suppress all news about the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads because it gives rise immediately to questions about those countries' aggression and illegal military occupation of several of our sacred islands — and the U.S. State Department aids this suppression because it does not want to face the problems, for which it has no solution other than burying its head in the sand.

These aggressors were never interested in our territory, territorial shelf, and exclusive 300 mile economic zone until oil was found in our sovereign jurisdiction. These aggressors are nothing but oil this -- especially since the Government of Morac-Songhrati-Meads has already leased all of its territory and territorial shelf and economic zone to American companies exclusively, two of which are the Flying Tigers Oil Co. Inc. and the Macarthur International Minerals Co. Inc.

Because of the hatred of the American people for vulturous aggressors, it is hoped that you will take all possible action to bring to an end the aforecited aggression; open diplomatic relations with our country; and allow our Government to establish a military base in the United States.

You may not believe the latter possible — but Russia is making increasing geopolitical progress in the world and will soon be in a position to mount an attack in the Americas. If theoccasion was appropriate, the armed forces of the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads could act as proxy toops for the ree World in someplace where Communist Russia, Vistnam and their allies are also using proxy troops. This would be possible at a much lower cost than that for American personnel.

Your State Department is too often sympathetic and cooperative with the aggressor nations cited in paragraph one - usually because it is bureaucratically safe to be so. The do-nothing position of yourState Department will eventually result in the defeat of the Free World, and you should do everything possible to guard against the gradual sell-out of the American people and interests by the State Department.

For your better understanding and consideration several documents are enclosed. We appreciate the sympathy and support of many of your members and hops that one day it will be unanimous.

The Philippine has no legal or moral right to encroach on our exclusive sovereign territory. While it hasoften cried out against aggression in the past, it is not above taking advantage of a weaker neighbor. None of the statements of the Fhilippines can or should be believed, and it is wrongfully andillegally trying to

invoke the Philippine-USA mutual defense treaty to cover Philippine aggression. If this is allowed to happen, a precedent will be set making it utterly impossible for other nations to trust theUnited States in any matter at any time, or to negotiate mutual defense treaties — for fear that such partner will then engage in aggression and demand that the USA defend the new territory as part of the territory under the mutual defense agreement. Thismakes a fool of the American people. ThePhilippines, through its President, admitted that they have no right to be in or occupy any of the islandsof Morac-Songhrati-Meadsin Southeast Asia. That admission should be enough for any moderately educated member of the U.S. Congress.

You should not be misled by the propaganda of the Philippines about being the ally of the United States. Maybe a allyability but not an ally - except when the feed trough is full and open to the Philippines. An example is theVistnam war. President Johnson asked the Philippines and its President (Marcos) to join with South Korea, Thailand, Australia, New Zealand and the United States to protect non-communist, South Vietnam. The Philippines and Marcos refused -- but as usual they tried to create the appearance that it was a combat ally fully committed but actually only contributing a medical unit and non-combat engineers -- while receiving millions in 'combat pay in dolkars' from the United States. If you will check with your General Accounting Office, you will find that the lump sum check from the United States Government for many millions of dollars to cover the 'so-called combat differential' for Filipino soldiers which the U.S. undertook to pay even though the Filipino soldiers in Vietnam were non-combat was encashed by a high Philippine Government official and deposited outside the Philippines. TheFilipino soldiers involved were never paid that 'overseas or so-called combat differential' provided by the U.S. Government. This is the allyability that you can expect from the Philippines. And now that it is cuddling up to Washington and U.S. Officialdom again -- you can expect that she is seeking a big pay-off -- one that is in violation of United States laws and a menace to the American people.

One of the reasons that the Philippineshas become more friendly in recent years is because the tremendousnumber of illegal Filipinos in the United States in the first place and the many Filipino dissidents seeking asylum in the U.S. in the second place. she needs the United States Government to control the Filipino dissidents in the U.S. on theorehand and to tolerate millions of illegal Filipino entrants to relieve the tremendous population pressure in the Philippinesin thesecond place. Smuggling Filipinos into the United States is a better solution to the Philippines' great unemployment and excesspopulation problem. It is a better solution than birth control, especially male sterilization considering developments in India-But this is not all that the Philippines wants, and she will be back in middle 1981 to reap even greater benefits — for the use of onenaval and one air force base of the United States in the Philippines.


The continued existence of U.S. military bases in the Philippines should not worry the United States Government and its leaders — for they are very secure and safe from elimination by any Filipino politician. Thereason is that there is already a strong and widespread movement in the Philippinesto separate approximately ten provinces and a few western islands from theCentral Government and declare their independence preparatory for requesting Statehood in theUnited States. Thisindependent area includes the U.S. Naval, Air Force and Communications Stations or Bases. Thus the United States should not feel that it is vulnerable to Philippines blackmail to force the United States to approve and protect the aggression and territorial aggrandizement of the Philippinesoutside the territorial boundaries of the Philippines set by the Treaty of Paris of 1898 and subject of the U.S. PhilippinesMutual Defense Treaty.

In view thereof, it is respectfully requested that you pass a resolution against the aforecited aggression and urge the immediate withdrawal of the armed forces of the aggressor nations — and that you demand that your President apply and support such resolution of Congress. 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

Foreign office launches move to occupy at least one inhabitable isle; Garcia says threat to country must first be clarified

Marcos restates RP position on Spratley Islands

President Marcos stressed again yesterday that the Philippines was not laying any claim on the Spratley Islands. The Chief Executive

The Chief Executive made the statement in the wake of Communist China's charge that the dispatch of Philippine troops to Nansha Island (Spratleys) was an "open violation of China's sovereignty by the Philippine government "

Red China said that the sending of Philippine troops to the island was "absolutely not to be toterated by the Chinese govemment and people."

Red China's belligerent posture on the Spratleys underscores the threat to Philippine national security of the presence of Nationalist Chinese troops on Itu Aba, one of the bigger Spratley islands.

The Philippines had already requested the Talpeh government to pull its troops on Itu Aba as their presence there might invite hostile moves by other major powers claiming the islands. Red China, for instance, considers all possessions of Nationalist China as its own, and thus might attempt to grab the Spratleys just to spite the Taipeh government.

The Philippine government had admitted sending troops to Freedomland, which it claims is not part of the Spratleys. Freedomland, which Tomas Cloma claims having discovered and occupied. is some 40 miles away from the Spratleys.

It is only Freedomland which the Philippines is claiming by virtue of Cloma's claim to right of discovery.

In his statement yesterday. President Marcos also pointed out that Freedomland is not part of the Spratleys.

He also reiterated that the Philippine position on the Spratley was that these Islands are trust territories, and should not be occupied by any country. Including the Philippines. except with the approval of the other allied powers.
