Dear Mr. President,

It has come to my attention, that development has actively begun on your Presidential Library in Palo Alto, California. The design and construction of your facility has particular interest for me because my undergraduate thesis project, at the School of Architecture of the University of Southern California, was to design the Reagan Presidential Library.

I began work on your Library in the fall of 1984, with extensive research and design development. As a fifth year student, I was not only responsible for designing the actual structure, but also was responsible for discovering the issues involved and defining the boundaries of the solution.

At the conclusion of this research, I found that your library should include an archival depository containing the papers and documents of your Administration and a museum, capsuling your personal political career. In addition to these required elements, the Reagan Library would become a "Center for the Study of the American Presidency". This center would link your library (via satellite) with the seven other presidential libraries, giving the researcher a complete archive of the modern American Presidency.

The other critical element of my "Center for the Study of the American Presidency" is a debate studio. The Debate Forum, which would be a complete television studio, would serve as a location for national, regional, and local televised debates. This element would further emphasize how your library would become a center for learning and a forum for our most basic freedom.

I have included photographs of my project, both drawings and model. I would also like to extend the use of my presentation drawings, model, and any insight that I can offer to you or your committee.


Thank you for your letter of March 27 to the President. We appreciate the sentiments you expressed regarding the President's leadership of this nation.





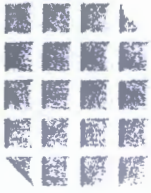

Please accept this letter as my statement of continuing interest to aid the Ronald Reagan Foundation and the Reagan's in the achievement of the **Ronald Reagan Library and Center for Public Affairs**. I am willing and able to commit the resources and creativity of The Hill Partnership, Inc. and Bechtel to your needs. As I have said since January, 1984, I am personally committed to seeing that President Reagan's Library is properly achieved including aesthetics, function, budget and schedule. Gary, you and every member of the Foundation know we owe nothing less to the President. The job is becoming harder to achieve everyday that goes by and I share your immediate sense of urgency.

With respect to site selection, I have explored two different opportunities - one of which the Foundation is discussing. I will provide the information I have on the Irvine Company and a thirty acre site in San Luis Obispo adjacent to the Cal Poly Campus under separate cover.

In the HPI/Bechtel submission of February, 1986, I noted those issues I felt to be the most critical factors. Those still are valid today. However, the last -- schedule -- has suddenly risen to the top of the list if you still feel the urgency to be able to move the President's papers in January of 1989. Under certain conditions I believe this goal is still achievable. Here's my plan:

1. Place the HPI/Bechtel team on your team immediately. Allow us to aid in site selection to best insure the site's physical and political constraints are proper for achieving the desired goals for aesthetic, function, budget and schedule. We understand Southern California land politics. That's what we do everyday! Please let us help you!

2. Work to a goal of identifying the site before the end of July. We will then begin immediately to site adapt Library drawings -- ours -- yours -- or new ones -- whatever is best for aesthetics, function, budget and schedule. At the same time we will begin the official procedures required to achieve the proper zoning, use permits, EIR approvals, etc. Unofficially we will have these political tasks strategized if not orchestrated, as best as possible during the land selection process.
3. By January 1988 we will break ground on the Archives portion of the Library and Center for Public Affairs complex. We will fast-track the procedures producing and gaining approval of drawings in stages to allow for the earliest possible ground-breaking. Our Computer Aided Design and Drafting capabilities make it possible for us to achieve contract documents in considerably faster time than the normal manual process.
4. In order to have the contractor on board and ready to begin grading and pouring of the foundations immediately upon approval of the drawings, I strongly recommend you consider a design/build approach with the HPI/Bechtel team, having Bechtel serve as the overall project manager and construction manager. A full team effort with all the players on board from the very beginning is your best hope to achieve a completion of the Archives by January of 1989.
5. In January of 1989 we will officially open the Archives portion of the complex ready to receive the Presidential papers and staff who will take charge of the collection. In the following next six months, we will be able to complete the public portion of the Library holding the ground opening mid-year 1989. Within another six months we will be able to complete the Policy Center. Its opening would be targeted for January 1990.
