The question of Australian participation in Economic Summit meetings has been raised with us from time to time. The United States and Japan in particular have indicated support for this.

As a result of a conversation I had with Mrs Thatcher in India late last year the question was discussed recently at an officials meeting in London - the meeting of personal representatives of Heads of Government of participating Summit countries which Allen Wallis attended. Mrs Thatcher has recently written on behalf of Summit countries to say that in the light of the soundings taken at that meeting it is not intended to invite Australia to participate in the London meeting. Her letter refers to the view that if Australia were invited it would be impossible to resist requests from a number of other countries which would feel that in terms of size and economic development they had no less strong a claim; and the reply also refers to the difficulties of maintaining the informal and wide-ranging freedom of discussion with such an increase in numbers.

I have written to Mrs Thatcher to acknowledge her advice, and I have taken the opportunity of observing that the discussions on this matter seem to have been based on the erroneous assumption that allowing Australia to participate means opening up the membership to other countries. I referred to the observation made by other members from time to time that there would be merit in achieving more of a balance, in geographic terms, at Summit meetings; and that in GDP terms amongst OECD countries Australia ranks next after Summit member countries with the exception only of Spain - which is an applicant to join the European Community and has its interests already well represented by the present membership. I referred also to Australia's economic development, its importance in terms of resources,

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its commitment to Western political ideals and principles, and its close links with countries in the Asia-Pacific region. I have said that I hoped that the question of Australian participation at future meetings can be pursued at another time.

Historical File

In writing to Mrs Thatcher I have been conscious of the support the United States has given for some time now to the idea of Australian participation in Economic Summit meetings. This is greatly valued as a very real example of the close relations between the United States and Australia, and I hope that the United States will continue both with its support and its active advocacy. I believe Japan will also give active support, as will some other member countries.

To be realistic however, and in the light of the advice conveyed to me by Mrs Thatcher, it is clear that Australia will not be a participant at the London meeting. However it may be that in respect of the Bonn Summit meeting next year, and I would certainly hope in respect of the Tokyo meeting in two years' time, the question can be looked at again and will be settled in Australia's favour.

Meanwhile your offer to keep in close consultation on Summit issues is very much appreciated. In line with this, George Shultz arranged for Allen Wallis and Bob Morris to visit Canberra for discussions. I have been very interested to have the background they were able to give on Summit preparations, and I have given them my observations on various Summit agenda items. In addition we shall be in contact with your senior officials following the regional meeting to discuss a possible new MTN round to be held in Bali late next month with a view to making views of Western Pacific countries on a new MTN round available to Summit participants.

Subject: London Economic Summit

Yesterday I received a memorandum from Mike Deaver informing me that it would not be possible for me to accompany you aboard Air Force One to this year's Economic Summit. The reason Mike gives, if I understand the exchange FGOI8 of memoranda attached, is that there will not be enough room FG021 on the helicopters during your stop in Ireland on the way to FG022 the Summit. Therefore, he has told me to find my own way to the Summit.

I must say that I am offended not only by the decision to exclude me from the traveling party itself, but also by the brusque and offhand manner in which the decision was communicated. I certainly had no reason to expect this decision and was not consulted or warned beforehand that it might be coming. So naturally, I wonder what I have done, or not done, to deserve it. You will recall that I accompanied you on the trip to each previous Summit --Ottawa, Versailles, Williamsburg, and even Cancun. On each trip there were discussions on the plane regarding late developments on Summit-related topics, as well as briefings on the anticipated Summit topics. By not having your "Finance Minister" with you on this trip, you will be clearly sending a message to your counterparts, and to mine, that someone else is conducting your economic briefings. The decision is also personally disappointing to me because I had thought that you considered my advice and counsel helpful. I am surprised to learn that it apparently is not.

Just for the record, I must also admit that I was looking forward to joining you in Ireland to look up the records of our mutual family tree.

Knowing that you prefer cordiality and consensus among your advisors, I have never before come to you on a point of personal privilege. I do feel strongly about this matter, however, which is why I am bringing it to your attention. I will, of course, abide by your decision.

Presidential Trip - June 1, 1984

I have your memorandum of March 28th concerning the President's trip to Ireland. It raises more guestions than it answers.

I had understood the trips to Ireland and Normandy, France were to be in connection with the Economic Summit in London. Given this memo, should I expect to be invited or disinvited to attend the Economic Summit? If I am expected to go to the Economic Summit, should I expect to go with the President aboard Air Force One? If I am to travel on Air Force One, what should I plan to do while the President is in Ireland, if I am not supposed to go to Ireland? Also, are you planning to invite wives to this year's Summit? If you will recall the Versailles foul-up, my wife was the only one who was not invited to attend. Is the President still planning to go to France, and if so, what will my role be?

This memo comes on top of my inability to get an answer to my involvement in the President's trip to China before my departure. To put it mildly, this is not the kind of treatment that I've been accustomed to from your office.
