### Working Lunch: Introduction

- -- Mr. President, today want to focus on the Summit political agenda, which will be the topic of discussion for tonight's dinner for Heads of State/government.
- -- I know it has never been easy to obtain meaningful political declarations. This year's task made even more difficult by fact that Italians -- with uncertain domestic political situation -- are hosts. 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

To brief you on key economic issues that will likely be raised at the Venice Economic Summit.

### II. BACKGROUND

This briefing is the last scheduled for you in Washington before your departure for your European trip. It will be devoted entirely to an issue-by-issue consideration of economic topics you will confront in Venice, supplementing the briefing you received earlier this week and the briefing book materials that have been given to you.

The Economic Summit agenda in Venice will not be too different from what you have seen at previous Summits. One difference will be a focus on the agriculture issue which you first raised last year in Tokyo. Because Secretary Lyng and Under Secretary of Agriculture Amstutz are out of town, we have asked Clayton Yeutter to bring you up to date on developments in this area. On other Summit topics: monetary issues, debt, and trade, your Sherpa team (Allen Wallis of State, David Mulford of Treasury, and Stephen Danzansky of the NSC) will make short presentations.

Handling Terrorism at the Summit

The attached memo from Secretary Shultz (Tab I) is in full accord with our suggested handling of the issue at the summit. We agree with his assessment of the Sherpa draft and the need to seek a strong Summit statement on terrorism.

The talking points we drafted for the President take care of Shultz's wish that the President intervene at the Sunday dinner. We agree he will have to make a strong pitch. If he does, the Brits and Canadians assure us they will support us. Also, we have talked to the Italians and, if the President says the Sherpa draft is weak or unsatisfactory, we are told Fanfani - as chairman - will recommend a redraft to strengthen it. Our informal consultations with the Italians indicate agreement on the main points that a stronger statement would contain.

The President's talking points with Nakasone, Kohl and Fanfani cover this aspect of terrorism, as Shultz recommends.
Fritz Ermerth concurs.
