Dear Mr. President:

In October of 1979 the Director General of the World Health Organization held a conference regarding the infant formula controversy. This conference followed years of public and professional outcry concerning the aggressive marketing of infant formula in Third World countries. Also, prior to this conference, the U.S. Senate held a series of hearings on this problem. The tales of childhood malnutrition, starvation and death discussed at hearings prompted recommendations to the World Health Organization that strict guidelines be adopted limiting marketing practices in this area. The October 1979 conference did in fact call for action. A recommendation was given that a code of ethics be adopted in this area. After four revisions and a name change (to a code of marketing practices), this code was finally acted on this week.

The United States should have been in the forefront on this critical human rights issue, not, as we must shamefully admit, providing the single vote against adoption of these guidelines.

The issues here are not whether the United Nations should be involved in restrictions on international commerce. The infant food producers had already formed a coalition (International Council of Infant Food Industries (ICIFI)) which had adopted guidelines. Unfortunately, these guidelines have proved totally ineffective.

The number of children affected by the misuse of infant formula through water contamination, lack of refrigeration or over dilution (among other problems) is unknown. Experts place

the numbers in the millions. One leading expert in the field of child nutrition, Dr. Derrick Jelliffe of UCLA School of Public Health at one time "guestimated" that perhaps as many as 10 million babies could be saved from permanent impairment and death if the trend toward bottle feeding could be reversed.

Experts from around the globe have agreed that breast feeding is nutritionally superior to bottle feeding even if the formula is prepared under the best of conditions. The trend toward bottle feeding can be causally linked directly to the aggressive marketing techniques employed by infant formula producers. In the past this has included granting of free supplies to hospitals and clinics so their products would be recommended by medical personnel; use of so-called "milk nurses" dressed in white uniforms to promote their products; the use of free samples and the promotion of the "western" mother as one who bottle feeds, are merely some of the past techniques. Many have now been abandoned or modified, but corporations are still utilizing every available avenue to get women to use their product.

In light of the urgency and importance of this issue, we the undersigned members of the California Legislature implore you to reconsider this vote taken at the WHO Conference, and to immediately take a leadership role in this crucial human rights issue and implement the WHO guidelines in the United States without delay.
