1. Brief background including date of establishment.

The World Health Organization was created in 1946. It currently has 155 member states. Its Executive Board consists of 30 members. The World Health Assembly elects the governments who are entitled to name members of the Board. Although the Board members are supposedly independent from national government, in fact the U.S. member is always instructed according to governmental positions. The United States is normally off the Board for one year between three-year terms on the Board. We are currently off the Board but expect to be reelected at the Assembly in May 1981.

2. Specific function/purpose of organization and dates and places of meetings.

The Executive Board determines the basic policies of WHO, and prepares the groundwork for the annual Assembly. The Board meets twice a year -- for three weeks in January and for two days following the Health Assembly in May. All meetings are in Geneva.

3. Composition and compensation of board/commission (to include names of present incumbents, date of appointment and their expiration dates as well as existing vacancies).

Membership on the Board is prepared on a regional basis. The members of the region for the Americas (North and South America) are expected to nominate the United States for the one vacancy from the Americas that occurs this year. The new U.S. term would be May 1981 to May 1984.
