

Dear Mr. President,

Throughout world history the Merchant Marine has been instrumental in the development of every nation. Before America was a nation it was a maritime power. Through all the years since the American Revolution the United States Merchant Marine has been crucial in our evolution into a world power.

A few decades ago during World War II the United States Merchant Marine was called again to support this nation. Millions of men and women united to build the world's greatest fleet of ships - the Liberty Ships. Let us not forget, that, were it not for these Liberty Ships there would be no Liberty.

Today, the United States Merchant Marine is shipping 2% of America's bulk cargo and less than 20% of container cargo on American ships. In fact, Russian ships are moving more American cargo that American ships. This situation is not in our strategic defense interests.

While it is true that, traditionally, America has allowed its Merchant Marine Fleet to deteriorate and then to respond by a major shipbuilding effort, what is of great concern today is that the moral of this industry has been broken. Even the most optimistic maritime leaders question whether the United States Merchant Marine can survive.

The issues surrounding the United States Merchant Marine are very complex and many conflicting interest groups are exerting pressure with minimal regard for national interests. This is further complicated by the fact that few of the post-war generation are even aware of the existence of the United States Merchant Marine. Thus the Merchant Marine has an apparent small constituency, despite its crucial importance to national security, commerce and defense.

In order to address this situation I have produced the enclosed film 'The Last Liberty' to focus on America's and the world's greatest maritime achievement. Through this truly historic document essential points can be stressed without becoming lost in the labyrinth of current maritime affairs.

To date, this film has been funded by a modest donation from the Crowley Maritime Corp. and my own personal resources - rather than relying on government support. As you may well imagine securing the additional funds to complete this film is not easy. Thus I would appreciate if you could review this intermediate edit of this film. If you find this a worthy effort I would appreciate a letter of support such as the enclosed letter from Commodore Patterson at Kings Point.
