BIOGRAPHY - Luis Ernesto MARCHAND Stens

Republic of Peru

An able career diplomat, Luis Marchand has served as Peru's Permanent Representative to the Organization of American States since April 1977 and earned a reputation as an effective parliamentarian. His overall effectiveness is weakened by a tendency to become a playful showoff at inappropriate moments and by his somewhat inflated ego, which can easily be bruised. Marchand has always been loyal to his government's policy line. Cordial and outwardly cooperative with U.S. diplomats, he considers good relations with this country to be important. However, he has not been effective in controlling his OAS Mission staff, which has been generally more Third World-oriented than he and often adopted positions antagonistic to the U.S.

Marchand joined the Ministry of Foreign Relations in 1954, after receiving a law degree. He rose rapidly through hard work and merit and has held the following important assignments in recent years: Alternate Permanent Representative to the UN European Office in Geneva, Minister Counselor in Washington and Director of Economic Affairs, Under Secretary of Economic and Integration Affairs and Under Secretary for Foreign Policy at the Foreign Ministry. From 1975 until he assumed his current position he was Secretary General of the Foreign Ministry—the Ministry's second highest post.

Marchand, 52, is intelligent and knowledgeable. He has taught international law in Lima and is the author of several books on the subject. He is married to the former Cecilia Pastor, also a lawyer. Both Marchands speak some English. They have a son, who is about 14 years old.

A thorough search of U.S. Government sources reveals no grounds for objection.
