

Dear Mr. Oglesby,

This letter comes to you in sincerity and with an earnest desire to obtain an autographed tie clip by President Reagan.

I suspect that your immediate reaction will be negative, but I am hoping that after you understand my predicament and realize how meaningful it would be to my father, you might be able to grant this desire.

First, you must know that I have every intention of paying for the clip, and I have tried every possible resource and person on the Hill that I am aware of who could help me before writing to you directly, because I really didn't want to bother you.

My mother sings with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir and was given an autographed tie clip as a gift for singing in a concert for the President. Unfortunately the clip recently broke, and I have not been able to locate a replacement anywhere. Since my father has been a loyal Reagan supporter for years and has the utmost admiration for President Reagan, I know that there could not be a man more deserving of such a gift. 

Did we ever tell you, Dr. McCrystle is also a professor at Santa Rosa State one night a week, he teaches animal husbandry and told us he read our letter to him, twice to his same class they appreciated it so. Hope you like it.

Little Doll-Lee-Joe our dear white poodle will be 17 June 25th and she's lost her hearing and most of her sight. Isn't it something, the dear little animals cope so much better with their problems than humans. Dr. McCrystle does everything for her for us, she's the oldest doggie we've had...like loved ones you miss them so when you lay them to rest...least ways our belief is we'll all be reunited in a land far better than earth, and we'll have our pets again. How could God be happy without a puppy by his side? Doll-Lee-Joe is still playful as a puppy, but she has six of her own kind to keep her happy. We have 7 dogs, boy you can tell your troubles to them, and they always listen so good.

P.S. Your Birthday token we made to match your Christmas belts -

When the two men came from the Chapel Oct. 17th to take Buzzy, would you imagine none of the 7 doggies acted up or barked...they always carry on so when strangers enter the property, but not then. They knew Buzzy had passed on, each one of the 7 dogs came to his side, laid their heads on his stilled form, gave one final lick to his face and ever so slowly filed from the room...they walked so very slow like they were experiencing our same sadness...and they say dogs don't talk.

Not goin' ask, goin' to do. Within the next few days we're returning to you your cowboy hat you had sent dear Buzzy. He loved it so. Now will you be so wonderful like you always are and do this for us? When you receive back your hat, would you autograph it to Buzzy from you and write something nice on it. The hat will be placed in Buzzy's Western part of his Memorial room in the museum. And for Buzzy's Memorial Western room, would you have anything Western you could present in your name to Buzzy. old boots, anything horsey, something anything Western? That would be Great!

When you and Nancy finally are able to visit our ranch, you'll find a strange form of peace and quiet in a land where God dwells in the beauty of nature and His handiwork.

Back to Dee-Ryius our 3 legged Dobeeman. When I say to her: "Shake-a-paw," you should see her reach out far as she can with that tiny stub, she swings her shoulder out until she places her shoulder in my hand. You can't help but want to puddle-up and turn the water-works on, but Bertha and the doctor says NOT in front of Dee-Ryius. Isn't animals the best? How they do whatever you ask of them.

Wish you could train Congress like this!

So you don't forget, we'll list:


- 1-- Write in your own handwriting 1 special invitation to your Inauguration Ball and write our three names on it, Sam, Buzzy and Bertha. It'll be lovingly placed in Buzzy's album.
- 2-- Do send Dr. McCrystle a letter of thanks after reading our copy letter..., thank him for being such a fine teacher and veterinarian.



Dear Ronald:

I know how busy you are and don't have time to read all the letters that are sent to you. That is why I don't write more often. I hope you have time to read this one. I was very happy to receive a letter from you letting me know that you got the pictures. I am writing to you now to inform you that Elsie^{Walters} is back in the hospital again. I don't know if you remember that she had a stroke on the right side which left her paralyzed on the same. She was getting along fine. This

happened Nov. 4-1961. She is
confined to a wheel chair most
of the time. She could walk
a very little with a cane. Well,
on Dec. 31-1962 she got up out
of bed to go to the bathroom
around 2:00 A.M. She fell and
broke her right hip. So she
is back in the hospital again.
I'm not sure now if she will
be able to walk again or not.
She gets depressed and sometimes
discouraged, but then she gets up
her hopes to get back home again.
We do not know yet when she
can leave the hospital. She may
have to come and live with us
for a while again.

I guess you were notified of the
death of Dennis Smith. That
fellow just thought the world
of you. He sure didn't have
much of a life. Nor did his brother
that passed away a few years
ago. That seemed such a shame
that Milford and Marian had 2
boys and both of them with such
a terrible disease.





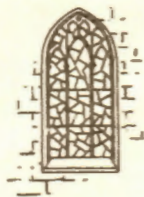
