

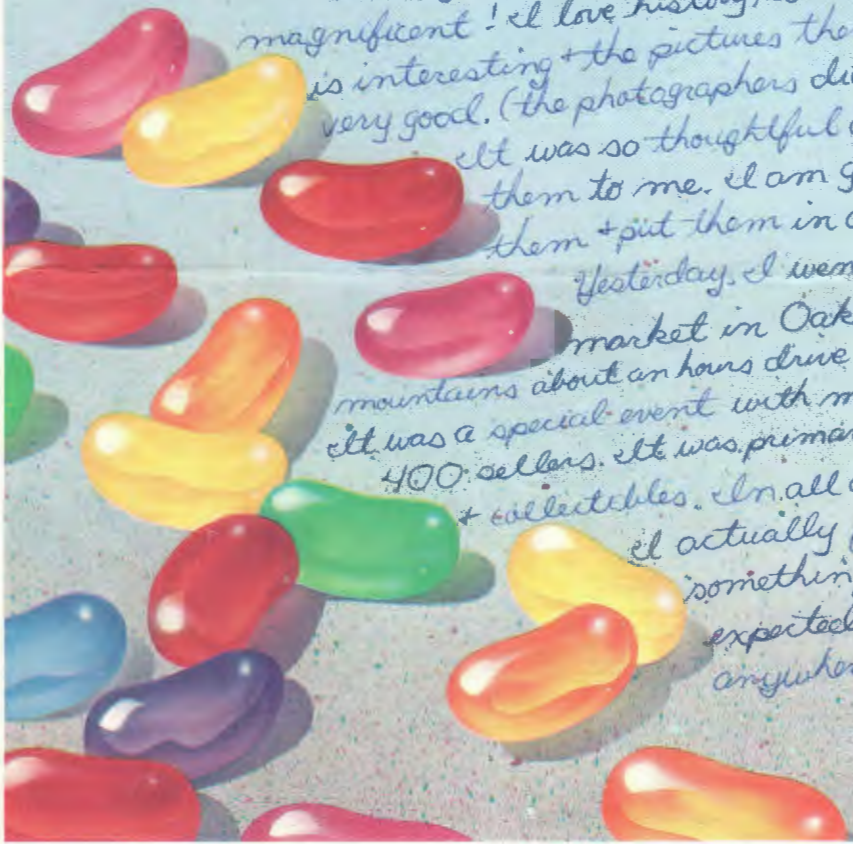
Thank you for the photos of China. They are magnificent! I love history, so the subject matter is interesting + the pictures themselves are very good. (the photographers did a great job)

It was so thoughtful of you to send them to me. I am going to frame them + put them in a place of honor.

Yesterday, I went to a flea market in Oakhurst (in the mountains about an hour drive from Fresno) it was a special event with more than 400 sellers. It was primarily for antiques + collectibles. In all of that mess

I actually found something that I never expected to find anywhere!
