

Gentlemen:

One often wonders, as did John Adams in "1776," whether anybody out there hears us. On the off chance that a constituant might make some sense, I'd like to share with you what one family feels on some of the more important issues that you are currently struggling with.

- 1. The President's economic package,
 - This is what we voted for. We are seriously tired of give-away programs, of government intervention in the private sector, of pork-barrel politics, of mismanagement and fraud in the government.

Some controls must be maintained to protect the unwary from the dishonest and the seriously poor, the sick and disabled must be cared for.

2. Taxation.

I'm a small businessman--free-lance writer, freelance public relations, some executive search. My wife substitutes in the public school system in Norwalk. We're not really making it, although we don't owe anyone anything except the mortgage. We've paid for four years of college out of operating expenses without a loan, but now face three years of law school and we'll probably have to go to the bank.

I didn't make enough last year to pay maximum social security. But that FICA tax, plus all the other burdens of taxation that we so-called "middle-income" people have to bear has virtually become unbearable.

If a tax cut is not forthcoming--and on a continuing basis for two or three years--I feel the economy will continue to debilitate.

> Today it is ever-more difficult to find public relations clients, writing assignments or executive search opportunities. Companies, simply, are holding back. And, of course, they are deadly slow paying. My colleagues in business and industry feel that the economic climate is just not correct for expansion or marketing promotion.

This nation has tried a number of economic ways to pull itself up and they haven't worked. Let's give equal time to "supply-side" economics and at least an honest chance.

3. Inflation.

It's tough on all of us and we've got to face it down. The Federal Reserve disturbs us with its forced interest rates. Printing more money than we take in is, of course, an invitation to disaster for us now and our children later.

Now the Congress is going to look at restricting the money market funds. Hey, gentlemen, that's my Keough-my retirement. If that doesn't keep pace with inflation then I should probably quit working now, sell the house, go on welfare and get some food stamps. Loosen up on banking regulation, if you want, but don't wipe me out.

We want people to save. Savings make for investment and construction. Give the banks a break, they're over-regulated anyhow, but don't stultify the one way people in our economic bracket can keep even.

4. Japanese car imports,

I own one. A Dodge Colt. Drives very well and gives a lot less trouble than the American car we've had for some years. Cost a lot less too. I agree with Lee Iacocca's Newsweek "My Turn," to an extent, but not to the point where Americans must be limited in choice. Free Trade is important to us.

However, the Japanese and other exporters must be made to play by the same rules as they find here. If they have import restrictions and tariffs, we should reciprocate until they loosen up.

5. Energy,

We still need nuclear power. Unfortunate, but true, We also realize that the major energy companies are in oil and coal and have little desire to look for alternate sources of energy, although they do give it some lip service. If the government must take the lead in seeding alternates, then it is tax money well spent. However, the energy firms should be jawboned somewhat.

6. Trust in our institutions.

It's at a low ebb, gentlemen. In our Congress, in government as a whole (particularly the civil service mentality that the individual occasionally must deal with), in business and industry and with the media.

Broken promises, shoddy goods, poor service, misrepresentation and misinformation are all too common. The people have been burned to the point where every poll reflects their mistrust. Big government seems to head the list which is where you come in.

We've still got the best, richest (in all senses) and most honorable nation in the world, but we have no confidence and little pride in ourselves or our institutions. Oh yes, we're proud of the President and the way he has acted and in what he believes. But of course, we wonder what the Congress will do to his programs.

'Nam and Nixon set us back. We think it's up to our elected leaders to get us going again, to make the country worth working for, to make living more than working for taxes with nothing at the end to show for it.

We elected the President on his platform (albeit the abortion plank is an abortion in itself) and his program to get the economics going again.

We elected you, Mr. Dodd, because you're bright and young and a reasonable man.

We elected you, Mr. Ratchford, because you have done a more than reasonable job.

Let's get things moving again for the United States.



A STRAW VOTE IN SELECTED STATES ON THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROGRAM

Dear Mr. Deaver:

We can go to the Electorate at once on a <u>non-partisan</u> basis in California, Massachusetts, Oklahoma, and several others of the 23 States* where the voters have the right of Initiative and Referendum, urging them to sign an Initiative Petition, and to cast a Straw Vote.

The Initiative Petition will be for the usual purpose of placing on the State's ballot at the next general election the Advisory Referendum we call National Proposition One ("NPOne") enabling the voters to increase their influence over their representatives in Washington, by voting "Yes" or "No" on this question:

"Do you want your two United States Senators and your Representative in Congress to do all in their power to enact an Economic Recovery Program providing for curbing Government spending, taxes, and deficits yearly, and to achieve a Balanced Budget in 1985 and a Surplus of more than \$20 billion in 1986?"

The Straw Vote can be cast by those who sign the Initiative Petition, and who want their wishes to be known and made effective now. It will state:

"I wish the two United States Senators from this State and my Representative in Congress to know that I have signed an Initiative Petition to place the following Question on the ballot:"

[The Question above will be inserted], followed by:

"If I now had the opportunity to vote on that Question, I would vote as I have shown below:"

[Space will be provided on one line for a signature, address, and the words "Yes" "No" with room for a check mark before each, arranged to prevent voters from seeing how others have voted.]

Our aim is to give the voters, for the first time in history, greater participation in the Federal Government by unambiguously informing their representatives, of their wishes. We expect elected officials will not block such participation or oppose those wishes. Shortly after the Initiative Petition and Straw Vote are put in circulation in one or two States, we will see their effect on the Hill.

Please give us the benefit of your highly esteemed suggestions in any area, including the texts of the Petition and the Straw Vote.



Mr. President:

I note with alarming concern the lack of activity in the Congress and the resistance to your program for economic recovery. Most distressing to me is the lack of support on the Republican side of the aisle. The senior minority members of the House of Representatives do not fully comprehend the American public's demand for a change and willingness to accept your program now.

You and I were elected to help change the direction of our country. This may well be our last opportunity as a nation, I fear, unless we responsibly exercise the leadership roles entrusted to us. The American economy is in much worse condition than any of us had any reason to believe before our election to office.

The American public, if our mail is any indication, is overwhelmingly in support of your program. I applaud you on your leadership, courage and the potential this represents. However, we cannot delay. The American public is ready now. They may not be ready in six, nine or 18 months. I urge you to declare an economic emergency.

A continuation of your hiring freeze would show an eye toward even greater reductions in the government payroll.

A pay cut for yourself and your request that Congress follow suit would show leadership begins at the top. During FDR's Administration, America faced an economic crisis. A courageous Congress took an historic step by cutting salaries by 10% in 1932 and another 5% in 1933. It is a precedent we should be willing to accept.

When my businesses faced tough economic times, I looked for ways to cut back. I called creditors and informed them that their payments would be reduced or delayed. I cut back the benefits to myself and my staff, and certainly I did not hire more people. Additionally, when cash flow was a problem, I put a halt to capital construction that was desired, but not required. The President Page 2

These steps are common place and common sense approaches. Too often in the creation and management of public policy, common sense is squeezed out for the sake of "public good." Our "public good" has us on the brink of economic disaster.

We must ensure that we do not monetize any more debt in this country. That was the message the American voter sent with us to Washington: stop the inflation; stop the printing of money. The only true way to solve fiscal crisis is to pay the bills with real dollars.

Even though we were elected to provide new leadership, the first bill we put through the Congress was the raising of the national debt ceiling which allows your administration to "pay the credit card slips of the Carter Administration."

I voted against the increase. We must not raise the debt ceiling again. If we do, we will be no better than any of our predecessors.

America's crisis is real, yet we are seeing your recovery program eroded in every way at the subcommittee and committee levels by the minority members of the House. In the Senate, the Republican majority is not in unison.

Those of us who are new here recognize this and we are shocked. This is not what the American people want and it is not what they deserve.

I am deeply concerned with the coalitions building against your program. This is an opportunity for you to use some of your great personal leadership to demand compliance and loyalty from those members in our own party.

The crisis we face demands outspoken leadership. I stand ready to help you.






