

As John Phelan, Chairman of your Board of Advisors on Private Sector Initiatives, mentioned to you in December, discussions have been taking place about a possible British-American Conference on Private Sector Initiatives. I am pleased to report that arrangements have been reached for a Conference in London on May 2-4, 1988. It will be attended by business leaders and government officials from England and the United States. Prime Minister Thatcher and Prince Charles have both indicated their interest in this meeting and have agreed to attend.

This Conference will follow up on the first International Conference on Private Sector Initiatives held in Paris, France, in November 1986. The Italian-American Conference on Private Sector Initiatives held in Milan and Venice, which you attended last June, was the first official follow-up meeting. As you recall, at that Conference the Italians announced that they were forming their own task force on private sector initiatives.

There is currently great interest in England in developing successful private sector initiatives. Many positive developments are already occurring and the British and American delegations could learn much from each other's successes.

As an example of private sector initiatives, all costs for organizing this Conference are being provided by private sector donations.

In the past you have extended an invitation to a limited list of individuals encouraging their attendance at these conferences. We would again like to extend the invitation for this Conference under your signature. A draft letter is attached for your review.





As John Phelan, Chairman of your Board of Advisors on Private Sector Initiatives mentioned to you in December, discussions have been taking place about a possible British-American Conference on Private Sector Initiatives. I am pleased to report that arrangements have been reached for a Conference in London on May 2-4, 1988. It will be attended by business leaders and government officials from England and the United States. Prime Minister Thatcher and Prince Charles have both indicated their interest in this meeting and have agreed to attend.

This Conference will follow up on the first International Conference on Private Sector Initiatives held in Paris, France in November of 1986.
