VENEZUELAN FOREIGN MINISTER JOSE ZAMBRANO AUGUST 1-2, CANCUN, MEXICO

MAIN OBJECTIVE

- 1. To reaffirm importance which USG attaches to continuing dialogue with GOV.
- 2. To restate that U.S. is looking to Venezuela to play mediating role in discussions of Caribbean Basin.

BEAR IN MIND

- 1. President Herrera Campins will make State Visit in mid-November.
- 2. Venezuela is our principal ally on El Salvador and plays constructive role throughout Caribbean area.
- 3. Venezuelans are leaders in Group of 77 and strong supporters of N/S dialogue and concept of global negotiations.
- 4. GOV is interested in acquiring as many as 48 F-16A's. P&R data were released week of July 27.
- 5. U.S. is strictly neutral in Venezuela-Guyana border dispute.

CHECKLIST

- 1. Express your satisfaction for cordial and frank bilateral meeting in Nassau.
- 2. Restate USG appreciation for GOV support of David Rockefeller's initiative in Jamaica and continuing assistance in El Salvador.
- 3. Emphasize that President Reagan looks forward to meeting President Herrera Campins at Cancun and to welcoming him to Washington in November.
- 4. As appropriate, stress importance of reaffirming agreement to have no agenda and no communique at the Cancun Summit. Express our hope that it will change tone of multilateral consultations.
