THE PERSIAN GULF AND ENERGY COOPERATION - TALKING POINTS

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Proposed Communique Language

Recognizing the high priority of overall energy security and noting the threat to the well-being of our nations' economies that could arise from a serious disruption of Middle East oil flows, we agree to continue present efforts through the IEA/OECD to strengthen energy emergency preparedness by assuring effective strategic stock levels and adopting mutually supportive actions early in a crisis, including early coordinated stock draw if circumstances warrant.

Explanatory Notes

- -- Reference to overall energy security reaffirms May 1983 IEA and OECD Ministerial Communiques (i.e. development of indigenous energy resources, gas security, etc.)
- -- All studies show serious oil supply disruption can threaten well-being of our nations' economies and impede recovery.
- -- Important to encourage <u>continued efforts in IEA/OECD</u> (latter takes in French) to achieve progress on stocks, such as recent informal meeting at St. Germain en Laye.
- -- Assuring effective strategic stock levels recognizes we are in good shape with 400 million barrels in SPR and estimated usable stocks at 122 days of imports (SPR plus private stocks above minimum operating levels). But a number of allies (Japan, Italy, France) have less than 60 days usable stocks.
- -- Effective is both quantitative and qualitative -- high enough to make a difference and actually available. Not certain how company-held stocks can actually be put on market in crisis. Strategic means available for use in major supply disruption.
- -- Mutually supportive actions means we cannot count on Congressional and public support for SPR drawdown unless others are visibly sharing burden, and their governments and companies are not rushing to the spot market as we draw SPR. This notion also anticipates allies' claim that their demand restraint measures (which we consider wholly unquantifiable) constitute equitable contribution.
- -- Early coordinated stock draw comes from our analysis showing early draws in large volumes by U.S. and allies can eliminate between 50 and 100 percent of price increases that would otherwise occur. (We omit reference in communique to large volumes as probably non-negotiable since most countries lack large volumes of usable stocks.
- -- If circumstances warrant provides some flexibility on timing and extent of stock draw (depending on depth and likely duration of disruption and each country's circumstances) and thus makes the concept easier to negotiate with allies.
