I have been asked to respond to your letter to President Reagan of October 16 concerning the arrest and detention of Andrew Kayiira, Ugandan Minister of Energy. As you know, Mr. Kayiira and eighteen other individuals were charged with treason October 7 for allegedly conspiring to overthrow the Government of Uganda. A date for a trial has not yet been set.

The U.S. Embassy in Kampala has reported that, to the best of its knowledge, Mr. Kayiira and the others charged with treason have not been mistreated while in detention. Your concern for the welfare of Mr. Kayiira is understandable, and you can be assured that the U.S. Embassy will continue to monitor Mr. Kayiira's detention and expected trial to help insure that due process is followed and a fair trial is held.

Please feel free to contact my office if you have further questions regarding the arrest of Mr. Kayiira.

Dear President Reagan,

I am writing to express my grave concern about my colleague, Andrew Kayiira. Dr. Kayiira, currently on leave from his position as professor of criminal justice at Marist College, has been serving as Minister of Energy in Uganda. On October 3, he was arrested in Kampala and charged with high treason. It has been reported that he was in illegal possession of arms, and is accused of planning to overthrow the government of Yoweri Museveni, who has served as Uganda's president for the past eight months.

Those of us who know Andrew are convinced that the charges are groundless. We know that he recognized the element of risk he assumed when he decided to answer his country's call for his assistance. We know that Andrew hoped to introduce some stability and perhaps the seeds of true democracy to that volatile nation. We feel certain that he would neither jeopardize the work he had accomplished thus far, nor imperil the well-being of his wife and six children, by actions as flagrant as harboring a cache of arms.

Andrew faces the death penalty if convicted of the crimes with which he is charges. I know that your intervention can make the critical difference for him. Your colleagues in the House and in the Senate acknowledge you as the expert in matters such as this, which require profound knowledge of foreign affairs and diplomatic skill of the highest order. Your record of success is a source of hope to all those at Marist who fear for Andrew's safety. We look to you for direction, and stand ready to assist you in any way you indicate.

Along with Dr. Kayiira's colleagues, students, and friends, I await your reply.

On October 3, he was arrested in Kampala and charged with high treason. has been reported that he was in illegal possession of arms, and is accused of planning to overthrow the government of Yoweri Museveni, who has served as Uganda's president for the past eight months.

Those of us who know Andrew are convinced that the charges are groundless. We know that he recognized the element of risk he assumed when he decided to answer his country's call for his assistance. We know that Andrew hoped to introduce some stability and perhaps the seeds of true democracy to that volatile nation. We feel certain that he would neither jeopardize the work he had accomplished thus far, nor imperil the well-being of his wife and six children, by actions as flagrant as harboring a cache of arms.

Andrew faces the death penalty if convicted of the crimes with which he is charged. I know that your intervention can make the critical difference for him. Your colleagues in the House and in the Senate acknowledge you as the expert in matters such as this, which require profound knowledge of foreign affairs and diplomatic skill of the highest order. Your record of success is a source of hope to all those at Marist who fear for Andrew's safety. We look to you for direction, and stand ready to assist you in any way you indicate.

Along with Dr. Kayiira's colleagues, students, and friends, I await your reply.

Dear Mr. President:

I am most pleased to hear that you are planning to meet with President Yoweri Museveni of Uganda when he visits Washington later this month. Having been involved with Ugandan refugee and human rights for some years, we at the U.S. Committee for Refugees can assure you this is a most important meeting.

The people of Uganda have suffered untold agony at the hands of ruthless leaders for many years. Three and a half years ago under former President Milton Obote, as many as a quarter of a million civilians died from violence and enforced starvation at the hands of the Obote army. In August of 1984, Mr. President, your Administration—alone among the governments of the world—reacted to this tragedy. Elliott Abrams, then Assistant Secretary of State for Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs, forcefully condemned human rights practices in Uganda as among the worst in the world.

By late January 1986, the Obote government and the brief military regime that followed it were gone. The National Resistance Movement (NRM) government, with Mr. Museveni as President, was in place. Since then, for the vast majority of Ugandans, security and human rights conditions have dramatically improved. Two years ago Ugandans constituted the fourth largest refugee group in the world. Now most of those who had fled to the surrounding nations and many who fled to North America and Europe have gone home. To have refugees "voting with their feet" in such numbers is a good omen for Uganda's future.

There are, however, major problems. In the north and east of Uganda, some disaffected groups continue to commit acts of thuggery and rebellion. Opponents of these events are alleging breakdowns in army discipline in conflict zones. Having been in Uganda on numerous occasions, including in some of the conflict zones, I am convinced these allegations are exaggerated and, to the extent such acts occur, they are violations of government policy.

Perhaps of an even more serious nature in the long run is the incredible weakness of the Ugandan economy and infrastructure after decades of violence and mismanagement. Many nations, including the United States, are helping to rebuild that nation.

More important than aid, however, is the need for U.S. diplomatic understanding of the changes taking place in Uganda. The NRM officials whom I know well are intense nationalists seeking to rebuild a devastated nation. They pursue an independent, nonaligned policy in geopolitical terms and are reaching out to other nations who will deal with them respectfully and on the basis of mutual benefit.

I earnestly hope you will use the meeting with President Museveni to reach out to them in return on behalf of the American people. Uganda's future is being formed right now. This is an opportunity Uganda and the United States can not afford to miss.
