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

Messrs. Chauney and de Sieno dropped by at my request to explain Peru's position on its border dispute in Ecuador. I did so because I have already gotten the Ecuadorean position from Sixto Duran on his recent visit from Quito.

The Peruvians as expected presented their views insisting the U.S. role is to remain a guarantor of the Protocol, and that by definition rules out any support -- active or passive -- of Ecuador questioning the legitimacy of the Protocol.

I made no observations on U.S. policy, but thanked them for the opportunity to get a firsthand look at Peru's position. They left with me appropriate documents for the file.


The frequent contacts between United States and Peru have adequately prepared the field and allowed to start a new phase of activities for research and development in the agricultural sphere.

SUBJECT: Cancun Task Force - Peru

In late October 1981, at the Cancun Summit, President Reagan offered to send Agricultural Task Forces to any less developed country that requested our assistance in solving its food production problems. On February 5, the President announced that the first Presidential Agricultural Task Force would be sent to Peru, headed by Clayton Yeutter. The formal request for such a task force came in the form of a letter from Peruvian President Belaunde to President Reagan (copy with translation attached).

It has been suggested subsequently that Clayton Yeutter personally deliver a response from President Reagan to President Belaunde. This suggestion was endorsed enthusiastically by Yeutter. I believe it would raise substantially the visibility of this initiative, as well as ensure that the first task force effort gets the appropriate attention and response at the highest level in Peru. A proposed letter from President Reagan is attached.
