Many thanks for all the courtesies you extended in our meeting on Monday, September 21.

Our Italian friends were much impressed and understand the policy regarding the Iran-Iraq situation. What they want you to understand is that should the policy change they are prepared to perform the repair work on the Iranian helicopter engines. It may take up to several months before the work could get underway, so the work could be cancelled if necessary.


What is being sought from the United States is neither a "yes" nor a "no" answer as the United States does not have to be involved. If the United States does not object, then Piaggio could proceed on its own. The only USA connection is the fact that Piaggio operates under a Lycoming franchise, and Lycoming is a United States corporation.

With regard to the second point they mentioned, it is their feeling that when the President is in a position to receive an Italian political leader, he should first receive Mr. Flaminio Piccoli, secretary of the Christian Democratic Party and a Member of the Italian Parliament. They feel a second visit by Mr. Bettino Craxi of the PSI Party should then follow. If these two parties should get together they could form a strong pro-Western government.

(Thursday, October 8)

Rinaldo

Rinaldo Petrignani, recently arrived Ambassador from Italy, will be primarily interested in paying a courtesy call and establishing contact with the White House. At the same time, however, he is likely to have three specific subjects in mind:

● Presidential Trip to Italy. During his UN meeting with Al Haig in New York, Foreign Minister Colombo extended an official invitation for the President to visit Italy. I recommend you convey our thanks for the invitation but hew to our usual line, namely, that as much as the President would love to visit Italy, we do not anticipate any foreign travel before next spring, and in the meantime the Italian invitation will be given every consideration. (e)

● Italian VIP Visits to the U.S. In a similar vein, Petrignani may press for official invitations to Italian President Pertini and Prime Minister Spadolini, both of whom hope to visit here as the President's guests (on separate occasions). Again, it would be well to remain non-committal on this subject pending completion of State's revised list of State Visit priorities. (Petrignani may also note that it would be "awkward" from the standpoint of Italian domestic politics if the President should receive any other prominent Italian (e.g., Senate President Fanfani) before Pertini and Spadolini). (e)

● "Guadeloupe Syndrome." The Italians are still smarting from what they consider a major loss of face administered by the Carter Administration when the latter excluded Italy from the January, 1979 four-power summit in Guadeloupe. Since they seldom miss an opportunity to remind us of that event and the internal difficulties it caused, Petrignani may well allude to Italy's stalwart performance on the TNF front and pointedly suggest that we could not count on its continued support for major security issues should another Guadeloupe be permitted to occur. You should simply tell Petrignani that we intend to treat Italy for what it is, a faithful and indispensable Western security partner with which we will at all times responsibly deal. (e)

It would be useful to make the following additional points:

- We appreciate Italy's vital role in the TNF program and admire the determination with which the Spadolini government has pressed ahead on identifying and developing the deployment site (Camiso, Sicily); (C)
- In the aftermath of the Sadat assassination, Italy's help in providing contributions to the MFO is all the more essential; we hope the Italian government can see its way clear to assisting this vital component of the peace process in the Middle East. (C)

You could conclude the meeting by congratulating Petrignani on the highly successful fashion-show evening he hosted last Sunday night (it featured work of the Milanese designer Valentino). (U)

ITALY: PORTENTS OF MAJOR POLITICAL CHANGE

If the Christian Democrats (DC) do not regain political momentum soon, Socialist Party (PSI) leader Craxi may become Prime Minister in the next year. But if Craxi falters with his "anti-communist" approach, the socialists might be driven to seek a governing coalition with the Communist Party (PCI). In the face of such a challenge, the DC would be desperate to retain its role as arbiter of Italian politics and might attempt to form its own governing coalition with the PCI.

* * *

Having led his party since 1978 on a course markedly divergent from that of the communists, socialist leader Bettino Craxi hopes to gain support from leftward-oriented voters otherwise inclined to cast "safe" anti-communist votes for the DC. His strategy coincides with the appearance of various favorable factors, including the stagnation of the Communist Party. The communists have been hurt by their failure in the limited national governing role which they had during 1976-79 and by their perceived subservience to the Soviets, as exemplified by their double standards on "peace" and other issues.

Craxi's strategy is also favored by Spadolini's unprecedented, non-DC prime ministry which has prepared the way psychologically for an eventual social premiership. Moreover, the socialists have profited from local and regional governing coalitions with the communists (which the DC has refused to form) to garner important patronage support--even while agreeing with the DC to exclude communists from the national coalition.

Although still resisted by some of the PSI rank and file, Craxi's anti-communist stance has significant potential. If, in the next national election (possibly next spring), the socialists can match the 14.5 percent of the vote they received in last June's administrative elections, the DC's long dominance could be fundamentally weakened.

A socialist opening to the communists, however, cannot be ruled out. Many observers view Craxi as an opportunist who has enjoyed a run of luck. If his strategy falters, he might lead the PSI back to a traditional embrace of the communists, or be replaced by someone who would. The socialists' willingness to work with the communists in local alliances exemplifies a calculated refusal to burn all bridges to the PCI.

The DC could decide to offer a national governing role to the communists in preference to losing its central position in Italian politics. Perhaps of significance in this connection are the DC's recent signals that it might be willing to form local coalitions itself with the communists.


I am writing to propose several ideas for activities during the scheduled state visit of President Pertini of Italy in late March of this year.







Whereas United States Brigadier General James L. Dozier was kidnaped on December 17, 1981, from his apartment in Verona, Italy, by members of the Red Brigade terrorist group;

Whereas the Red Brigade has been responsible for committing numerous acts of terrorism in Italy, including the kidnaping and murder in 1978 of former Italian Premier Aldo Moro;

Whereas General Dozier is the Chief of Staff for Logistics and Administration for the Southern Command of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO);

Whereas Italian police conducted an intensive search through much of northern Italy looking for the general and his captors;

Whereas the Italian special antiterrorist police, acting on information from an undisclosed source, made a daring daylight raid on an apartment in Padua, Italy, and rescued General Dozier, unhurt, after 42 days of captivity;

Whereas the Italian police delivered a major blow to the Red Brigade and other terrorist groups through their rescue of General Dozier and their capture of more than 20 suspected terrorists during the period of his captivity; and

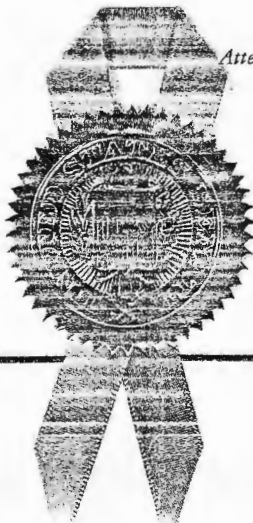
Whereas the Government of Italy has again demonstrated its dedication as an ally and friend of the United States and its commitment to eliminate terrorism while upholding its free and democratic institution: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate hereby expresses its profound sense of relief at the safe rescue on January 28, 1982, of Brigadier General James L. Dozier; commends General Dozier and his family for their courage and strength in this difficult period; and extends its heartfelt congratulations and gratitude to the Government of Italy for its dedication and effective efforts to rescue General Dozier and for its success in dealing a major blow to terrorism.

Resolved, That it is the sense of the Senate that the United States should take effective measures to protect American diplomatic and military personnel serving this Nation abroad, and should work closely with friends and allies to combat all forms of international terrorism.

Sec. 2. The Secretary of the Senate shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the President with the request that he transmit such copy to the Government of Italy.
