DEAR MR. PRIME MINISTER:

THANK YOU FOR YOUR THOUGHTFUL LETTER OF OCTOBER 24 CONCERNING YOUR UPCOMING VISIT TO WASHINGTON. NANCY AND I LOOK FORWARD TO WELCOMING YOU AND MRS. GORIA TO THE WHITE HOUSE ON DECEMBER 16.

I SHARE YOUR VIEW THAT THE MOST CRITICAL ISSUES FOR OUR DISCUSSION WILL BE THE PERSIAN GULF, EAST-WEST AND ARMS CONTROL. WE WILL WANT TO CONTINUE OUR CLOSE COLLABORATION ON THESE AREAS AND YOUR VISIT HERE IS A

WELCOME OPPORTUNITY TO DISCUSS THEM IN DEPTH. WITH RESPECT TO THE PERSIAN GULF, I BELIEVE IT IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT THAT WE WORK TOGETHER URGENTLY TO IMPLEMENT UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 598, IF NECESSARY THROUGH PASSAGE OF AN ENFORCEMENT RESOLUTION. WE CANNOT AFFORD DIPLOMATIC INACTION--WHICH ONLY PROVIDES A COVER BEHIND WHICH THE IRANIS ARE ACCELERATING THEIR PREPARATIONS FOR ANOTHER MAJOR GROUND OFFENSIVE AND CONTINUING THEIR ATTACKS ON NONBELLIGERENT SHIPPING. I WILL BE EMPHASIZING THESE POINTS TO GENERAL SECRETARY GORBACHEV NEXT WEEK, AND WELCOME THE CHANCE TO DISCUSS THEM WITH YOU LATER THIS MONTH. IN THE MEANTIME, IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT WE CONTINUE OUR STEADY, PARALLEL EFFORTS TO HELP PROTECT FREEDOM OF NAVIGATION IN THE GULF. THESE EFFORTS CLEARLY BOLSTERED THE CONFIDENCE OF THE MODERATE ARAB LEADERS AT THE AMMAN SUMMIT, AND REMAIN AN IMPORTANT COMPLEMENT TO OUR DIPLOMACY. AS YOU NOTED IN YOUR LETTER, THE INF AGREEMENT I WILL SIGN WITH GENERAL SECRETARY GORBACHEV NEXT WEEK RESULTED IN GREAT PART FROM THE COHESION AND

STEADFAST DETERMINATION THE ALLIANCE DEMONSTRATED. I PARTICULARLY VALUE THE IMPORTANT ROLE ITALY PLAYED IN MAINTAINING WESTERN SOLIDARITY. YOUR VISIT HERE WILL PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR ME TO SHARE WITH YOU PERSONALLY THE RESULT OF MY MEETINGS WITH GORBACHEV, NOT JUST ON ARMS REDUCTIONS, BUT ON BILATERAL, HUMAN RIGHTS AND REGIONAL CONCERNS AS WELL.

I LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU IN THE VERY NEAR FUTURE AND TRUST THAT YOUR VISIT WILL BE A SPLENDID TESTIMONY TO THE EXTRAORDINARY TIES THAT BIND OUR TWO COUNTRIES.

BEGIN TEXT OF LETTER TO PRESIDENT REAGAN

DEAR MR. PRESIDENT:

I HAVE LEARNED WITH GREAT PLEASURE THAT DECEMBER 16 HAS BEEN AGREED UPON AS THE DATE FOR MY VISIT TO WASHINGTON. I AM SURE THAT IT WILL BE AN OCCASION OF GREAT IMPORTANCE

FOR US TO DISCUSS IN DEPTH THE SUBJECTS OF GREATEST INTERNATIONAL MOMENT AND TO STRENGTHEN THE HISTORIC TIES OF CLOSE FRIENDSHIP WHICH CHARACTERIZE THE RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES.

I AVAIL MYSELF OF THE OCCASION TO THANK YOU FOR THE LETTER WHICH YOU SO KINDLY SENT THROUGH VICE PRESIDENT BUSH AND IN WHICH YOU INFORMED ME ON THE BASIC AGREEMENT REACHED WITH THE SOVIET UNION ON INTERMEDIATE AND SHORT-RANGE NUCLEAR FORCES.

AS I TOLD VICE PRESIDENT BUSH IN PERSON, ITALY HAS GREETED THIS AGREEMENT WITH GREAT SATISFACTION SINCE IT REWARDS THE EFFORTS UNDERTAKEN BY THE U.S. ADMINISTRATION AND CONTRIBUTES TO CREATING A DIFFERENT INTERNATIONAL CLIMATE, WHICH WE HOPE WILL BECOME EVER MORE RELAXED AND TRUSTFUL. WE ARE CONVINCED THAT THIS RESULT WAS MADE POSSIBLE ALSO BY THE COHESION AND STEADFAST DETERMINATION DEMONSTRATED BY NATO FROM THE MOMENT OF THE 1979 DECISION TO DEPLOY THE INF IN THE EUROPEAN COUNTRIES.

AS I STRESSED TO VICE PRESIDENT BUSH, WE ALSO APPRECIATED THE CLOSE AND CONSTANT CONSULTATIONS WHICH THE UNITED STATES MAINTAINED WITH ITS ALLIES IN THE COURSE OF THE ENTIRE COMPLEX NEGOTIATIONS. THIS PROCESS OF CONSULTATION AND COHESION ARE FUNDAMENTAL ELEMENTS FOR ANY FUTURE DEVELOPMENT IN THAT THEY REAFFIRM THE CLOSE AND IRREPLACEABLE TIES IN THE FIELD OF SECURITY LINKING THE TWO SIDES OF THE ATLANTIC. THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT HOPES THAT THE FINAL INF AGREEMENT CAN BE REACHED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND THAT THE LAST REMAINING OBSTACLES WILL BE OVERCOME.

I WOULD LIKE TO AVAIL MYSELF OF THE OCCASION TO TOUCH ON THE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS IN THE GULF SITUATION AND THE IRAN-IRAQ CONFLICT. I RECEIVED YOUR ORAL MESSAGE, FOR WHICH I THANK YOU, INFORMING ME BEFOREHAND OF THE ACTION WHICH THE U.S. ARMY WAS ABOUT TO UNDERTAKE AGAINST A LIMITED IRANIAN MILITARY TARGET IN RESPONSE TO THE ACTIONS BY THE TENERAN GOVERNMENT AND THE RECENT

LAUNCHING OF A MISSILE AGAINST THE U.S.-FLAGGED TANKER "SEA ISLE CITY".

AT THE CABINET MEETING WHICH TOOK PLACE THAT DAY, I GAVE A POSITIVE ACCOUNT OF THE LIMITED CHARACTER OF THE ACTION AND OF YOU AND YOUR GOVERNMENT'S REPEATEDLY STRESSED INTENTION TO AVOID A FURTHER EXACERBATION OF THE SITUATION IN THE GULF AND TO ACT ONLY IN THE EXERCISE OF THE RIGHT TO SELF-DEFENSE RECOGNIZED IN ART. 51 OF THE

UNITED NATIONS CHARTER. I ALSO PARTICULARLY AND POSITIVELY STRESSED THE FACT THAT THE U.S. FORCES OPERATED IN SUCH A WAY AS TO SAFEGUARD THE LIVES OF THE PEOPLE ON THE PLATFORM THEY ATTACKED.

ITALY IS ESPECIALLY COMMITTED TO PROBING THE EXISTING MARGINS FOR ARRIVING AT A CEASE-FIRE ON THE BASIS OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 598. IN THIS CONTEXT, AND WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES WHICH ARE INCUMBENT UPON US ALSO IN CONNECTION WITH OUR TURN AT THE PRESIDENCY OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL, FOREIGN MINISTER ANDREOTTI IS HOLDING A GREAT NUMBER OF MEETINGS THESE DAYS IN SUPPORT OF THE U.N. SECRETARY GENERAL'S EFFORTS IN THE HOPE THAT A SOLUTION WHICH IS ACCEPTABLE TO BOTH CONTENDING PARTIES CAN BE FOUND.

IF THIS EFFORT, TOO, SHOULD FAIL, NEW INITIATIVES MUST CERTAINLY BE SOUGHT, TO BEGIN WITH THE ADOPTION BY THE SECURITY COUNCIL OF AN ARMS EMBARGO AND OTHER MEASURES OF AN ECONOMIC NATURE.

I AM COUNTING ON BEING ABLE TO ENTER INTO A USEFUL RELATIONSHIP OF CLOSE CONSULTATION WITH YOU ON THESE AND OTHER SUBJECTS OF COMMON INTEREST. END TEXT. SHULTZ



While extending you every good wish for the Summit and looking forward to seeing you in Washington on December 16 to examine together the international and bilateral issues of mutual concern, I convey to you, dear President, my best and most cordial regards.
