

Dear Mr. President:

I am replying to your kind letter of February 13, concerning the events in the Security Council related to the Iran-Iraq war as well as the necessity that a follow-up resolution to Resolution 598, which would impose sanctions, might possibly be adopted within this month.

I agree with you that the dangers inherent in the conflict and the deadlock to which the Secretary General's efforts have come call for the adoption of a new position by the Security Council, now that about seven months have already elapsed since the decision of July 20, 1987.

I am indeed convinced that a lack of action by the international community would result in encouraging a continuation of the hostilities and would also amount to a

serious setback for the Security Council itself. On the other hand, it follows from the logic of the United Nations proceedings that new pressures to put an end to the war cannot be brought to bear without maintaining the unity of the major body of the organization and without taking into account the necessity that the negotiating capabilities of the Secretary General himself be strengthened.

In my opinion, it is for the Secretary General himself to draw a negotiating conclusion based on proposals which would emerge from a platform developed and expressed, in the first place, through the consensus of the Five Permanent Members of the Security Council. On the other hand, this procedure would follow the same road that proved fruitful last July 20th, when Resolution 598 was adopted, and would eliminate the risk of vetoes, which would render ineffective the only channel that has so far kept open a possibility for a solution with the participation of both of the parties concerned.

I wish to express once again my warmest thanks for the very friendly welcome I received during my visit to Washington last December, of which I cherish the best memories. I also take this opportunity to express my most heartfelt and friendly greetings.

If some metal parts of a U.S. missile and a Soviet missile, chosen among those that will be destroyed under the Agreement, were donated to the University of Florence, we would ask an artist to utilize them to make a monument to be considered as a symbol of peace by all the students that will attend our University, a token to remind all of us of this first important event, an invitation and a spur to seek always new ways - on the political, economic and cultural plane - so that by the end of our century we may assist to the birth of a new Humanism, one of a level and dimension adequate to the third millinnium.

Hoping that you will consider my request favorably I send you my best regards and wishes for the New Year.
