WHITE HOUSE  
SITUATION ROOM

Former French President Valery Giscard d'Estaing is currently planning to be in the United States during the period July 21-24 to attend the Bohemian Grove encampment near San Francisco. The Department recommends that the President receive Giscard for one-half hour on a date convenient to the President on one side or the other of Giscard's weekend at the Bohemian Grove. Secretary Shultz, who is a friend of Giscard and met with him in Paris last week, personally supports this recommendation.

Giscard last visited the United States during the April 25 - May 8 period to lecture in New York and at Harvard. The President's schedule precluded his meeting with Giscard on the one working day Giscard was free to come to Washington. We received some indication at that time that, in principle, the President would be receptive to receiving Giscard at another, mutually convenient time. Secretary Shultz' Middle East trip similarly prevented his seeing Giscard in late April.

Elements of the French press portrayed Giscard's non-reception in Washington as a deliberate rebuff on our part. We were unfairly charged with favoring Paris Mayor Jacques Chirac (who is a political rival of Giscard and with whom the President met when Chirac was here in January) as our privileged interlocutor in the French political opposition.

Giscard remains one of three principal opposition leaders; it is widely assumed that he has ambitions to be a presidential candidate in 1988. The President's meeting with Giscard would dispel the notion that we are favoring one opposition leader over the other. It would also be a courtesy to a former French President. Secretary Shultz believes that the President would find Giscard a worthwhile interlocutor and that he would enjoy renewing an acquaintance with Giscard that dates from their meeting two years ago at the Ford Library dedication ceremonies.

The Department therefore recommends that, if at all possible, the President agree to receive Giscard for one-half hour on either Wednesday, July 20 or Tuesday, July 26. Alternatively, Monday, July 25 may also be a possibility for this appointment.

# The big franc fiddle in France

FRENCH people subjected to rigorous austerity measures for the past three months have been given an insight into massive nationwide fraud, waste and negligence in the past year.

France's financial watchdog, the centuries-old Cour Des Comptes, yesterday issued a 200-page report which unearthed examples of blatant mismanagement of taxpayers' money.

The report was drawn up by 400 magistrates and inspectors into 4,800 state-run enterprises as well as ministries, social organisations and local and regional councils.

At a time when France has a disastrous foreign trade balance, the report noted, it is exporting coal for 169 francs (\$46.64) per tonne less than its production cost of an average 427 francs.

The study wondered whether it would not be better to close down certain pits and indemnify the jobless miners, as such a step would be less expensive.

## Never produced his thesis

It also reported some waste at the prestigious Paris-based National Centre of Scientific Research (CNRS). One member there has been drawing a salary for 20 years and has never produced his thesis — he will retire in five years on pension if nothing is done about him by then.

The CNRS had to take drastic steps to discover the whereabouts of one of their staff whom they had not seen for several years — they stopped paying his salary into his bank and he promptly reappeared, the study said.

The report said some CNRS staff often worked a 35-hour instead of a 39-hour week, and that in one seaside laboratory staff took 11 weeks' holiday annually.

It also noted some so-called business trips to destinations that seemed

to have little relation to their purpose.

The Auguste Comte Institute in Paris had sent researchers to the United States to study French marsh conditions, to the United Arab Emirates to study hovercraft flights and to Indonesia to work out a telecommunications project for France's Massif-Central region.

The institute was recently closed down.

The most flagrant swindles hit the Unedic Unemployment Benefits Board, which has an annual budget of 90 billion francs for about 1.7 million jobless.

For example, in the Gers region of south-western France four brothers took turns in hiring and sacking each other, enabling them to be paid allowances for loss of jobs.

A redundant 58-year-old manager was paid his full previous monthly salary of 28,000 francs for one year while he was taking a course of three German lessons weekly.

A ghost firm went bankrupt and Unedic paid its 400 non-existent workers a total of 5.5 million francs in indemnities.

## Offered to pay for damage

Two unemployed men aged 55 and 61 in Marseilles quite legally obtained 16,000 francs monthly while they took a correspondence course in German.

The government was also swindled when it offered to pay for damages caused by the December 1961 floods in south-western France. A furniture factory was paid 1.3 million francs — though it had closed down three years previously.

The report also singled out the publicly-owned National Railroad Company (SNCF) for particular criticism, blaming its 6.1 billion franc 1982 operating deficit on unrealistic revenue forecasts, uncontrolled management costs and salaries and poor organisation of its debt repayment programme.

The country's education system came in for its knocks, especially on the hidden perks doled out to some of its employees.

More than 230 "part-time teachers and professors" were found to be holding down two other jobs at the same time. — Agencies.
