Thank you all very much. As you know, encouraging greater citizen participation has been a priority with me throughout my life and a major part of our Administration.

One of the first things I did when I became President was to establish a Private Sector Initiatives program which would encourage charitable giving, voluntarism, corporate social responsibility, and the development of public/private partnerships.

During the 6 years I've been in office, we've seen Americans respond to our challenge in overwhelming numbers. And we've realized that we had something good in America -- something we might share with other countries.

This past November, my Private Sector Initiatives Board of Advisors organized the first International Conference on Private Sector Initiatives in Paris. That conference, attended by business and government leaders of seven countries, marked an historic beginning. And in the months since, we've seen programs develop not only in the countries which participated in the conference, but in a number of others.

We have seen that, regardless of their history, all governments can encourage their own citizens to solve problems that government alone could never fully address.

One achievement I'm especially pleased about is the resolution of a dilemma that was developing over the patent for

an AIDS vaccine. In the rush to find some treatment for this dreaded disease, doctors in France and the United States worked simultaneously. A question then arose about which country would be entitled to hold the patent and receive the recognition for the development of the new vaccine.

A member of my Board of Advisors on Private Sector Initiatives, Dr. Bill Walsh, worked with French and American doctors to reach a mutual agreement. In fact, during the Paris Conference, Bill met with Prime Minister Chirac to discuss the issue.

Prime Minister Chirac and I are pleased to announce today, the cooperative efforts between our two countries concerning this important advance. And our hope is that the continuing partnership between French and American doctors will someday find a cure for this fatal disease.

Mr. Prime Minister, I am aware that your leadership in all proved crucial -- and I thank you. The Paris Conference has served only as a beginning. Several country delegations represented have remained active, and I am looking forward to a private sector initiative that I will be participating in while in Italy for the Economic Summit in June.

Now, in order to share ideas about private sector initiatives still more widely, we have prepared this special report -- a report that will be distributed to government officials, business leaders, and academic institutions around the world. And, Mr. Prime Minister, I am pleased to present the first copy to you today with my sincere gratitude.

Thank you, and God bless you all.

We have seen that, regardless of their history, all governments can encourage their own citizens to solve problems that government alone could never fully address.

One achievement I'm especially pleased about is the resolution of a dilemma that was developing over the patent for

an AIDS vaccine. In the rush to find some treatment for this dreaded disease, doctors in France and the United States worked simultaneously. A question then arose about which country would be entitled to hold the patent and receive the recognition for the development of the new vaccine.

A member of my Board of Advisors on Private Sector Initiatives, Dr. Bill Walsh, worked with French and American doctors to reach a mutual agreement. In fact, during the Paris Conference, Bill met with Prime Minister Chirac to discuss the issue.

Prime Minister Chirac and I are pleased to announce today, the cooperative efforts between our two countries concerning this important advance. And our hope is that the continuing partnership between French and American doctors will someday find a cure for this fatal disease.

Mr. Prime Minister, I am aware that your leadership in all proved crucial -- and I thank you. The Paris Conference has served only as a beginning. Several country delegations represented have remained active, and I am looking forward to a private sector initiative that I will be participating in while in Italy for the Economic Summit in June.

Now, in order to share ideas about private sector initiatives still more widely, we have prepared this special report -- a report that will be distributed to government officials, business leaders, and academic institutions around the world. And, Mr. Prime Minister, I am pleased to present the first copy to you today with my sincere gratitude.

TUESDAY, MARCH 31, 1987 87 MAR 26 P 6:46

Thank you all very much. As you know, encouraging greater citizen participation has been a priority with me throughout my life and a major part of our Administration.

One of the first things I did when I became President was to establish a Private Sector Initiatives program which would encourage charitable giving, voluntarism, corporate social responsibility, and the development of public/private partnerships.

During the 6 years I've been in office, we've seen Americans respond to our challenge in overwhelming numbers. And we've realized that we had something good in America -- something we might share with other countries.

This past November, my Private Sector Initiatives Board of Advisors organized the first International Conference on Private Sector Initiatives in Paris. That conference, attended by business and government leaders of seven countries, marked an historic beginning. And in the months since, we've seen programs develop not only in the countries which participated in the conference, but in a number of others.

We have seen that, regardless of their history, all governments can encourage their own citizens to solve problems that government alone could never fully address.

One achievement I'm especially pleased about is the resolution of a dilemma that was developing over the patent for

an AIDS vaccine. In the rush to find some treatment for this dreaded disease, doctors in France and the United States worked simultaneously. A question then arose about which country would be entitled to hold the patent and receive the recognition for the development of the new vaccine.

A member of my Board of Advisors on Private Sector Initiatives, Dr. Bill Walsh, worked with French and American doctors to reach a mutual agreement. In fact, during the Paris Conference, Bill met with Prime Minister Chirac to discuss the issue.

Prime Minister Chirac and I are pleased to announce today, the cooperative efforts between our two countries concerning this important advance. And our hope is that the continuing partnership between French and American doctors will someday find a cure for this fatal disease.

Mr. Prime Minister, I am aware that your leadership in all proved crucial -- and I thank you. The Paris Conference has served only as a beginning. Several country delegations represented have remained active, and I am looking forward to a private sector initiative that I will be participating in while in Italy for the Economic Summit in June.

Now, in order to share ideas about private sector initiatives still more widely, we have prepared this special report -- a report that will be distributed to government officials, business leaders, and academic institutions around the world. And, Mr. Prime Minister, I am pleased to present the first copy to you today with my sincere gratitude.
