Dear Mr. Carlucci:

It is pleasing to know that you and I were both at Harvard; indeed I note that you were at Princeton and Harvard while I was at Yale and Harvard. I of course grew up in America but have for some years been based in Britain. Lately I have been doing a lot of work in that vast land of Indonesia, which one sometimes forgets extends even farther East to West than the U. S. and contains enormous resources.

Indonesia was the fourth country in the world to establish a comprehensive satellite communications system--a real logistical breakthrough. And she is the only country which has decisively defeated both Communism and Islamic extremism with her own resources. I have carefully studied how the Indonesians achieved it.

Earlier I was for four years in Iran, where I watched Islamic extremism growing apace. The Indonesians have solicited my continuing advice on how to avert such an outcome there. The experience gained--both in the Middle East and the Far East--is something that I could share with you and your friends.

I believe that we have the duty to codify and apply the experience already gained--for the sake of our continued national leadership. Could you encourage me to visit Washington to provide a formal or informal input? It would be splendid to join forces in this way.

Please treat this letter as if it were classified. It will be a pleasure to be in touch on this important matter.





SUBJECT: Special Air Mission Support

Indonesia Sultan Hamengkubuwono IX died Monday, October 3, in the George Washington University Hospital, after receiving treatment for a lengthy illness. President Suharto of Indonesia has requested that the United States provide assistance in transporting the Sultan's body to Hawaii where the Government of Indonesia will take possession of the remains. I believe that honoring the Indonesian request would be in our national interest. Therefore, I recommend that we transport the Sultan's remains and a small delegation of Indonesians, including the widow and the new appointed ambassador to the United States, to Hawaii. This aircraft support should be provided on a non-reimbursable. The White House Military Office concurs with this recommendation. The Department of State also supports this request.



Subject: Indonesia: Special Military Aircraft

The October 2 death in Washington of Sultan Hamengkubuwono IX, former Indonesian vice president and hero of national independence, has prompted a high-level Indonesian request, reinforced by a diplomatic note from the Embassy of Indonesia, that the United States assist with the return of the remains to Jakarta. The Department of State understands that the Department of Defense has recommended that a special Presidential mission aircraft be provided for this purpose. The Department of State strongly endorses the Indonesian request and urges the National Security Council to direct the Department of Defense to provide a special aircraft on a non-reimbursable basis to return the Sultan's body.

We believe that meeting the Indonesian request is in our national interest because:

- it will be widely seen in Indonesia as a gesture of American goodwill and respect for a man who combined the roles of hereditary Javanese ruler and national hero, independence fighter and post-independence vice president and Governor of Yogyakarta; and
- Hamengkubuwono's death in Washington, where he came for medical treatment at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, makes it prudent that we demonstrate a special concern for his status and importance in Indonesia.

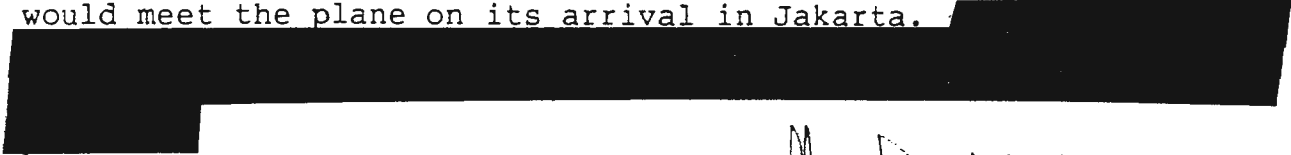
SUBJECT: Presidential Mission Aircraft Needed for Indonesia (U)

(U) Indonesia's Sultan Hamengku Buwono IX died this morning in the George Washington University hospital, after receiving treatment for a lengthy illness. According to the Indonesian embassy, President Suharto has requested that the United States provide assistance in transporting the Sultan's body to Indonesia.

(S) The 76-year old Sultan was a unique and popular figure in Indonesian history. A highly respected senior statesman, the Sultan was a major figure in Indonesia's revolutionary struggle and held significant posts, including Minister of Defense, in several post-independence governments. He was Vice-President of Indonesia from 1973-1978. Because of his unique place in Indonesian history, the Sultan was held in high esteem throughout Indonesia and is probably second only to President Suharto himself in the respect and esteem of the Indonesian public at large.

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(S) The Department of Defense, therefore, recommends that a Presidential Mission Aircraft be assigned to carry the Sultan's remains and a small delegation of Indonesians, including the widow and the newly appointed ambassador to the United States, to Indonesia. We have been informed that President Suharto would meet the plane on its arrival in Jakarta.
