Attached is a proposed letter from the Vice President to Dr. Brendan O'Regan, Chairman of Cooperation North, under whose auspices the Lord Mayors of Dublin, Ireland, and Belfast, Northern Ireland, will be visiting the United States this week.

The Vice President had been scheduled to meet with the two Lord Mayors on April 13, but curtailment of their trip forced cancellation of that meeting. Deputy Secretary Clark will be receiving the Lord Mayors and Dr. O'Regan on Friday, April 10.

The Lord Mayors are making a joint visit to the United States in order to demonstrate the existence of understanding and economic cooperation now growing between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland and to seek American support for the continuance of those ties. Cooperation North, which is coordinating their visit, is a non-governmental organization which seeks to promote reconciliation between the divided communities of Northern Ireland, as well as between that province and the Republic, through development and strengthening of such non-political relations as trade, travel, and investment.

Dr. O'Regan has written the President concerning the visit of the Lord Mayors (letter attached). The proposed letter from the Vice President would lend symbolic support to their message of cooperation and would be in keeping with US policy of encouraging peaceful means toward a solution of the Northern Ireland conflict.

We recommend that, if possible, the letter to Dr. O'Regan be signed before April 10, in order that it might be presented during the meeting with the Deputy Secretary.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

St. Patrick's Day is not only the feast day of a great man of God, it is a symbol of the commitment of the Irish people to freedom, to justice and to the values upon which western civilization is built.

We in the United States know the great contribution made by citizens of Irish ancestry. From our Revolution to the present day, Irish-Americans have been at the forefront of the defense of freedom. By their labor and by their sacrifices, they have been a major force in building our Nation.

It is therefore gratifying on this St. Patrick's Day to be able to pay tribute to the great role Ireland and the Irish have played in defending and renewing the values we cherish.

But we are also conscious of the violence, bloodshed and despair which now haunt all of the people of Northern Ireland. This tragedy cannot go unnoticed by the United States which owes so much and has such close ties to the Irish.

As an American proud of his Irish ancestry and as President, I recognize the vital importance to our Nation and the western alliance of a peaceful, just and swift solution to current problems in Northern Ireland.

The United States will continue to urge the parties to come together for a just and peaceful solution. I pray and hope that the day will come when the tragedy of history which now afflicts Northern Ireland will be overcome by faith, the courage and the love of freedom and justice of the Irish.

We will continue to condemn all acts of terrorism and violence, for these cannot solve Northern Ireland's problems. I call on all Americans to question closely any appeal for financial or other aid from groups involved in this conflict to ensure that contributions do not end up in the hands of those who perpetuate violence, either directly or indirectly.

I add my personal prayers and the good offices of the United States to those Irish — and indeed to all world citizens — who wish fervently for peace and victory over those who sow fear and terror.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. RICHARD V. ALLEN THE WHITE HOUSE

Subject: Appointment Request by the Lord Mayors of Dublin and Belfast

The Lord Mayor of Dublin, Ireland, Mr. Fergus O'Brien, and the Lord Mayor of Belfast, Northern Ireland, Mr. John Carson, will be making a joint visit to the United States April 9-16 to demonstrate the existence of understanding and economic cooperation now growing between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland and to seek American support for the continuance of these ties. Their visit is being co-ordinated by Cooperation North, a non-governmental organization which seeks to promote reconciliation between the divided communities of Northern Ireland, as well as between that province and the Republic, through development and strengthening of such non-political relations as trade, travel, and investment.

The Chairman of Cooperation North, Dr. Brendan O'Regan, has conveyed to us a request by the two Lord Mayors that the President receive them briefly at the White House. They feel strongly that such a visit would enhance their message to the people of Ireland and Northern Ireland, as well as the Irish-American community, that cooperation can be the only basis for bringing a peaceful end to the tragic sectarian conflict.

We do not believe that an appointment with the President would be necessary, but we do recommend that, if at all possible, the Vice President receive the two Lord Mayors for a brief office call. Such a meeting would lend symbolic support to their message of cooperation and would be in keeping with traditional US policy of encouraging peaceful means toward a solution of the Northern Ireland conflict. We will also be arranging meetings for the Lord Mayors with senior officials in the Department of State.

Cooperation North is holding in abeyance other plans for their North American tour (which includes New York, Chicago, Boston, and Toronto) pending decisions on the Washington schedule.

I. OBJECTIVES

- 1. Explain to FitzGerald our policy on El Salvador.
- Call to his attention President Reagan's March 17 policy statement on Northern Ireland.
- 3. Seek his assessment of prospects for an Irish general election this spring.

II. SETTING

Former Irish Foreign Minister Garret FitzGerald is visiting Washington for Trilateral Commission meetings on the Middle East. His trip here comes at a time of increasing speculation that Irish Prime Minister Haughey will call for general elections in May. FitzGerald, as the widely popular leader of the major opposition party (Fine Gael), might emerge as his country's new Prime Minister. Current polls show his party and its possible coalition partner, the Labor Party, running even with Haughey's governing Fianna Fail Party. Whether he takes over government leadership or remains in opposition, the intelligent, energetic, and outspoken FitzGerald will remain a major force on the Irish political scene and an important influence on Irish public opinion. His contacts with US leaders take on added importance given the direction he might exercise over Ireland's voice as a UN Security Council member during the coming year.

III. DISCUSSION OF OBJECTIVES

1. Explain to FitzGerald our policy on El Salvador.

FitzGerald, Foreign Minister Brian Lenihan, and Labor Party leader Frank Cluskey have sharply criticized our support for the Government of El Salvador. Our Ambassador to Ireland, William Shannon, has met with all three to explain our role and

to register our strong concern over the tone of their statements. Only Lenihan was receptive to this approach, as both Fitzgerald and Cluskey were unyielding in their assertions that the US is totally mistaken in its El Salvador involvement.

FitzGerald believes the central fact about El Salvador is the exploitation of the great majority by the ruling few. He concedes that the junta had good intentions when it came to power in 1979, but he argues that the liberals have since been forced out and that Duarte is only a figurehead for an oppressive right-wing dictatorship. He disputes our contention that the insurgents are Marxist terrorists with little popular support and contends that communists are only one element in the rebel coalition and not the dominant group. He believes that our policy does not reflect any prior consultation with our European friends and has little support in Western Europe.

We are seeking to arrange further briefings by our experts on El Salvador for FitzGerald while he is in Washington. We want to convey to him a comprehensive and accurate view of the situation in El Salvador, to make clear the basis of our policy, and to reaffirm our determination to pursue it.

3. Seek FitzGerald's assessment of prospects for an Irish general election this spring.

There have been indications that Prime Minister Haughey might call for general elections this spring, probably in May. Haughey's personal standing has recovered strongly from a low point last fall, but he might yet calculate that the troubled economic scene weighs in favor of postponing elections. Both the Fine Gael and Labor Parties have been preparing for spring elections and have professed confidence about the outcome. The two parties governed as a coalition from 1973-77, but the Labor Party's 1979 decision ruling out a pre-election compact with Fine Gael somewhat hinders the two parties' credibility in offering an alternative government.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

St. Patrick's Day is not only the feast day of a great man of Cod, it is a symbol of the commitment of the Irish people to freedom, to justice and to the values upon which western civilization is built.

We in the United States know the great contribution made by citizens of Irish ancestry. From our Revolution to the present day, Irish-Americans have been at the forefront of the defense of freedom. By their labor and by their sacrifices, they have been a major force in building our Nation.

It is therefore gratifying on this St. Patrick's Day to be able to pay tribute to the great role Ireland and the Irish have played in defending and renewing the values we cherish.

But we are also conscious of the violence, bloodshed and despair which now haunt all of the people of Northern Ireland. This tragedy cannot go unnoticed by the United States which owes so much and has such close ties to the Irish.

As an American proud of his Irish ancestry and as President, I recognize the vital importance to our Nation and the western alliance of a peaceful, just and swift solution to current problems in Northern Ireland.

The United States will continue to urge the parties to come together for a just and peaceful solution. I pray and hope that the day will come when the tragedy of history which now afflicts Northern Ireland will be overcome by faith, the courage and the love of freedom and justice of the Irish.

We will continue to condemn all acts of terrorism and violence, for these cannot solve Northern Ireland's problems. I call on all Americans to question closely any appeal for financial or other aid from groups involved in this conflict to ensure that contributions do not end up in the hands of those who perpetuate violence, either directly or indirectly.

I add my personal prayers and the good offices of the United States to those Irish — and indeed to all world citizens — who wish fervently for peace and victory over those who sow fear and terror.
