

Dear Mr. President:

I wish to register my strong disapproval of your actions which brought about the "arms—for—hostoges" situation now in the headlines. Although attempting to initiate a dialogue with Iran was a worthwhile goal, shipping arms to that regime was morally and politically wrong, no matter how good the intentions. In my view, much of what you've tried to accomplish in defense and foreign affairs these past six years is endangered and the credibility of the United States in the eyes of other countries will be difficult to recoup. It seems to me that the ability of your administration to shape domestic and international affairs will be hampered for the remainder of your term in office.

What's called for now is forceful action to control damage, viz:

- 1. Admit fault.
- Messrs. Regan, Shultz and Poindexter out. Replace them with respected men of known competence in the respective field. For example, Mr. Baker might come back as Chief of Staff, while Senator Laxalt may not be suitable as Secretary of State.
- Get the NSC staff out of direct operations; have it resume the important planning, coordination and advisory role.

My reading of the situation tells me that this storm will not blow over easily. As a Republican, I therefore urge you to take immediate, forceful action to restore confidence in the Presidency and your administration.

I have just returned from a trip to Israel where I received only partial information concerning the sale of arms to Iran. I watched the press conference today and was pleased with the manner in which you and Attorney General Meese handled the affair. I regret our having to do business with Iran, but if such will bring a release of hostages and benefit the state of Israel, I am wholeheartedly in support of the arrangements.

There is one aspect of this entire affair that is being overlooked and that is the security of the state of Israel. As long as Iraq and Iran are at war, Israel has a high degree of safety. Dear Mr. President:

I beg your leave to write to you concerning the recent furor vis a vis the administration regarding Iran. In time, sensitive people will come to understand that the security of our country is based on the "in-camera" decision making process. However, I am very concerned that you and your administration will become over burdened with the partisan pressure that will emerge from this incident as Congress prepares to reconvene and reorganize.

I would, therefore, like to make the following suggestions for the Administration to consider:

In 1987 we will be observing the bi-centennial of the constitution. The last thing we need is any partisan ammendments emerging to further control the office of the President. I believe it is advisable to form a "Hoover-Type" convention that would include the following:

Past Presidents , past Secretaries of State, past National Security Council Directors to develop standards and procedures in which " in-camera " decisions can be made without a full review before the Senate, Congress, and ultimately the Media. Making this pre-empted move at this time would eliminate others from acting without the counsel of the Administration.

Dear Mr. President:

I want to commend you for supporting the appointment of a special prosecutor to investigate the Iran arms sales. This, along with appropriate investigations by the Congress, can get the facts on the table and enable us to refocus attention on the critical issues of arms reductions, the farm economy, and the trade-budget deficits.

It is clearly not in the country's interest to have a failed presidency, so I want to see this crisis resolved and put to rest for good. Only then can we press ahead with our common agenda. At the same time, I want to underscore that the Iran arms sale and contra funds transfer were terrible mistakes and I think you should admit that. It is very likely that both actions involved serious violations of federal law and neither represents the right kind of action which advances our national interests in those regions of the world.

The American people are a generous people who would accept an admission of an error in judgment on the Iran arms sale and the contra funds diversion. I urge you to make such an admission and to fire any personnel tainted by this mistake. You have already taken some steps to reorganize your White House and National Security Council staffs and I hope that you will take speedy action to complete this effort. I believe that you need a reorganization which will ensure that you are fully informed about such important matters.

Unless you take quick, effective action this crisis will deepen and mire all of us in unending investigations. I respectfully say that we cannot afford this—especially when we need your leadership on critical legislative issues. I thank you in advance for your consideration on these vital issues.
