SUBJECT: Extension of the Iranian National Emergency

Under section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (NEA, 50 U.S.C. § 1622(d)), any national emergency declared by the President shall terminate on the anniversary of the declaration unless the President publishes in the Federal Register and transmits to the Congress a notice stating that such emergency shall continue. On November 14, 1979, the President declared a national emergency to deal with the Iranian hostage crisis. This declaration triggered broad authority under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA, 50 U.S.C. §§ 1701-1706) to impose economic sanctions against Iran. If the emergency is not continued, these IEEPA authorities will terminate on the anniversary of the declaration -- November 14. The national emergency for Iran was previously continued on November 12, 1980, November 12, 1981, November 8, 1982, November 4, 1983, November 7, 1984 and November 1, 1985.

Since the IEEPA authorities are still required to deal with Iran (e.g. claims settlement), I have prepared the attached memorandum to David L. Chew to indicate that we concur with Treasury's recommendation that the President extend the national emergency for Iran.

Dear Mr. President:

Under the National Emergencies Act, the November 14, 1979 declaration of national emergency with respect to Iran will terminate on November 14, 1986, unless, prior to that date, you publish in the Federal Register and transmit to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect. If the Iranian emergency were allowed to lapse, the present Iranian sanctions would also lapse, impairing our Government's ability to apply economic pressure on the Iranian government to continue to take actions pursuant to the Claims Settlement Agreement of January 19, 1981, and to take all other necessary actions leading to a return of normal relations.

For these reasons, I recommend that you sign, transmit to the Congress, and publish in the Federal Register the necessary notice of extension.

- The proposed notice of extension; and
- A proposed letter transmitting the notice to the Congress.

The crisis between the United States and Iran that began in 1979 has not been fully resolved. Although the international tribunal established to adjudicate claims of U.S. nationals against Iran and of Iranian nationals against the United States continues to function, full normalization of commercial and diplomatic relations between the United States and Iran will require more time. In these circumstances, I have determined that it is necessary to maintain in force the broad authorities that may be needed in the process of

implementing the January 1981 agreements with Iran and in the
eventual normalization of relations with that country.

On November 14, 1979, by Executive Order No. 12170, the President declared a national emergency to deal with the threat to the national security, foreign policy and economy of the United States constituted by the situation in Iran. Notices of the continuation of this national emergency were transmitted by the President to the Congress and the Federal Register on November 12, 1980, November 12, 1981, November 8, 1982, November 4, 1983, November 7, 1984, and November 1, 1985. Because our relations with Iran have not yet returned to normal, and the process of implementing the January 19, 1981, agreements with Iran is still underway, the national emergency declared on November 14, 1979, must continue in effect beyond November 14, 1986. Therefore, in accordance with Section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622(d)), I am continuing the national emergency with respect to Iran. This notice shall be published in the Federal Register and transmitted to the Congress.
