Dear Miss Osborne,

As I do, from time to time, wearing my political hat, I'd like to offer the following.

Many of the President's loyal supporters, myself included, have been deeply concerned over the ongoing flap over the Iranian affair. 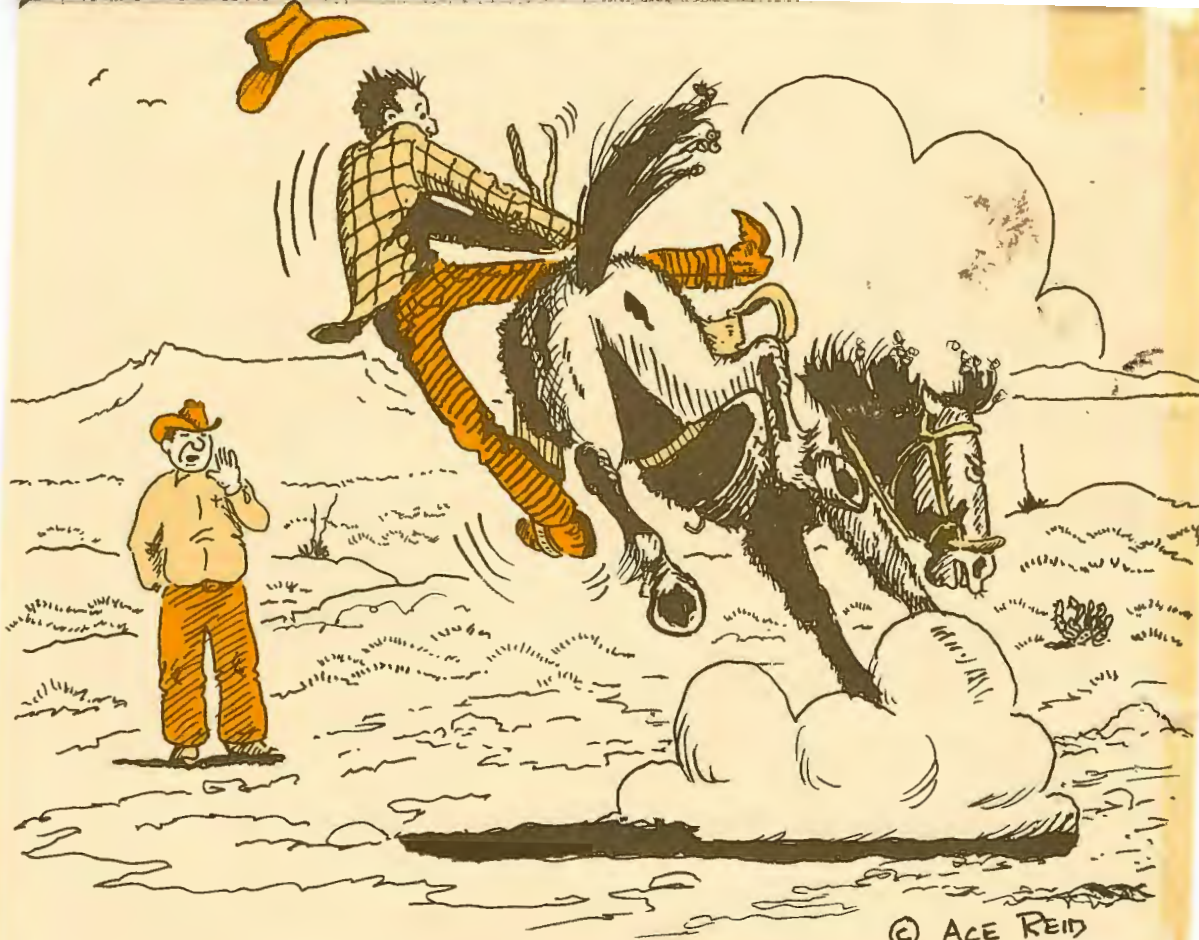

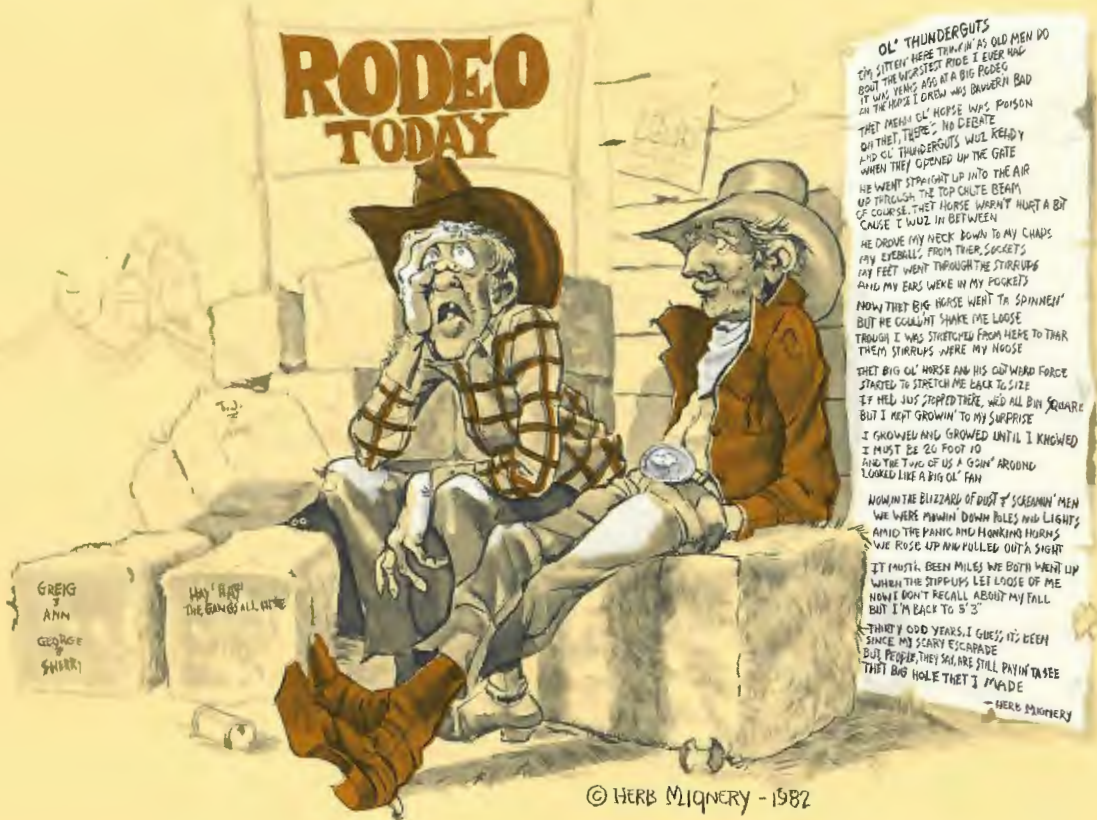

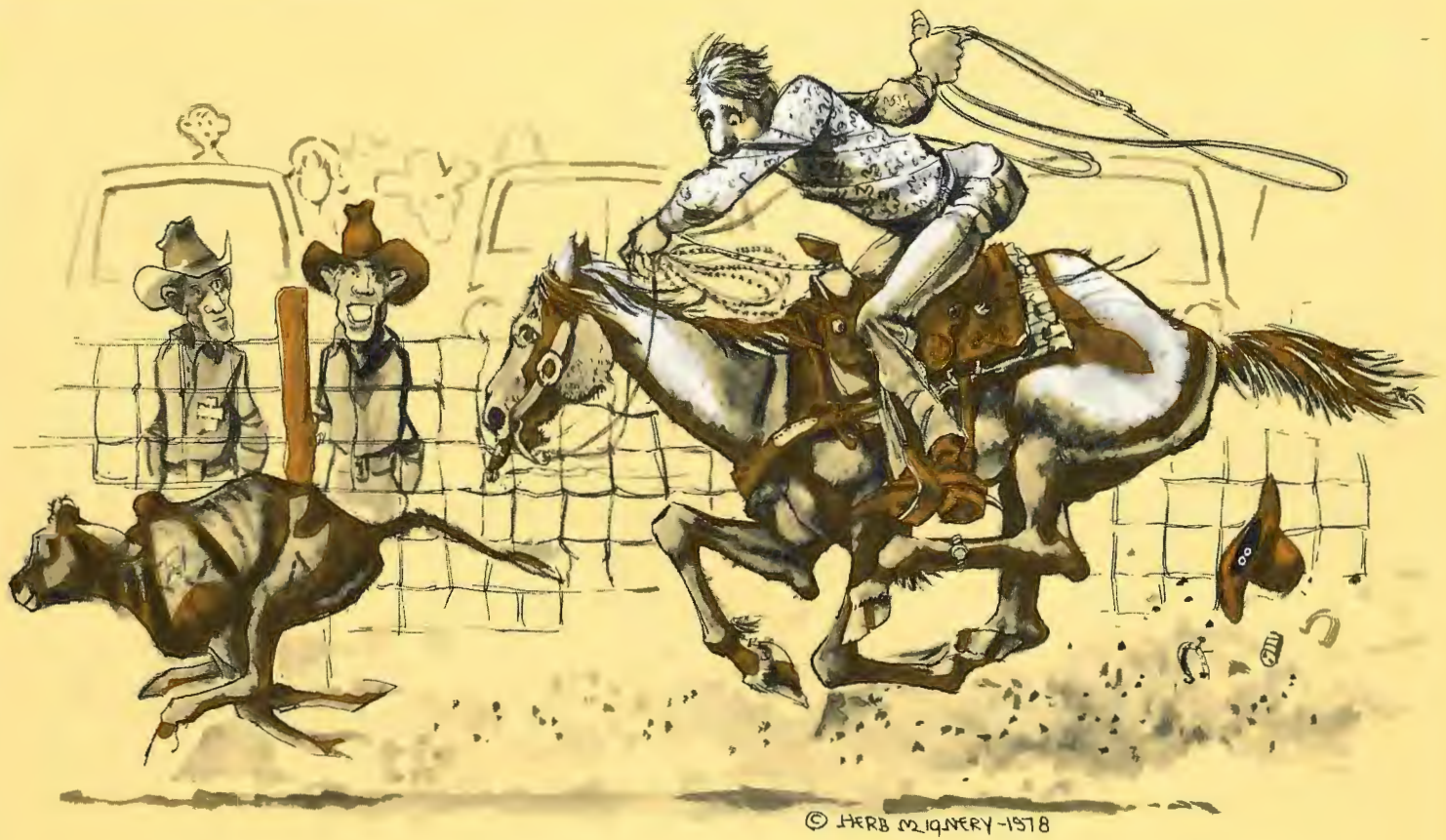

Dear Mr. President:

I emphasize with you during the present unpleasantness and wish that I owned a chain of newspapers, television stations, a few magazines and a passel of preachers (not necessarily religious) to straighten out the manipulated mindset of the well read but thoroughly confused, upper-class American.

As one of your "Eagles" I want you to know that I am on your side. The using of power is not a science, the sharing of it is impossible.


Corporations pay me and my company very large sums for advice on quality and "getting things done right the first time". We teach them simplicity.
