Dear Miss Osborne,

As I do, from time to time, wearing my political hat, I'd like to offer the following.

Many of the President's loyal supporters, myself included, have been deeply concerned over the ongoing flap over the Iranian affair. Our concern is not over what was done, we have sufficient faith in the President's good judgement to accept his position that it was the right way to go, given the circumstances. Dear Mr. President:

I emphasize with you during the present unpleasantness and wish that I owned a chain of newspapers, television stations, a few magazines and a passel of preachers (not necessarily religious) to straighten out the manipulated mindset of the well read but thoroughly confused, upper-class American.

But they did print the details, so there's hope. for evening listening and watching I was amazed at the array of "offensive players" our enemies selected to lead their present game plan. I have given the Congress and the press all the information we have. That's why we are bringing in a Special Counsel. These are things about which we don't have the answers. I approved the plan of entering into dialogue with those Iranian individuals. When the leak led to the press exposure, I told them all I knew. The money problem was not known by me and was discovered by the Attorney General in his investigation. He told me what he had found out at 4:30 on a Monday afternoon. On Tuesday morning I told the leaders of Congress and the press what I had learned. Now there will be a House committee and a Senate committee, as well as the Special Counsel searching for whatever additional facts there may be.
