### Current Iran Crisis

Dear Mr. Ger:

As you I believe the above offices, located in Washington and New York, are aware of my, due to my prior research activities during the mid-1970's, extensive knowledge of the country of Iran. I have followed the Iranian / American relations developments since that time, with of course more of an in-depth, personal understanding of socio-political developments of

The following is a short background of my findings in the 1970's, based on analysis of the current situation which has developed.

\* \* \*

My initial research involving Iran delved on the potential of future marketing various types of computerization with respect to infrastructure (medical, business, medical and scientific usages). As I researched demographic and social trends, there turned up various points of contention, due to the rapid change of the culture from one of agrarian means to one of social industrialization.

What I found was a type of 'displacement' of the population, in a less than natural progression of industrialization. I saw that there was an enormous potential due to the goals of the 'Shah' (Shah Reza Pahlavi). However, I had to note a major caution. As of a matter of your understanding, my statement at that time was such as follows.

"There is great potential for the importation of various computerization for the country of Iran. However, the Shah has pushed the people very fast, and according to his views. The Shah's economic infrastructure is largely based on oil revenues to fuel growth, and support the peoples 'material needs'. This is kind of like a 'shell'. If the Shah can not meet the people's 'new-found' material needs, the shell will start to crack. Then the people will start to look towards religious areas of fulfillment. If this happens, the citizenry may not further support the Shah's ideals, and goals. They may not be able to support our type of Western ideals, and they may 'choke' (actually used the word choke) and reject us."

During the height of the first Iran Crisis I was in New York, and made several trips to the offices of the Iranian 'Permanent Mission to the U.N.' with further updates in an attempt to do my part in letting these 'new-found' politicians/statespeople see that there were indeed people in the United States who understood that the culmination of the 'revolution' was an outburst of decades of pent-up 'hurt', and 'frustration' at having religious/cultural history just 'swept aside' when the Shah, followed by Shah Reza were 'put into power' by U.S. 'might and will'.

\* \* \*

Following is an overview, which MUST be checked/researched with respect to chronology. You will find that chronology of events with respect to this current 'crisis' is crucial to understanding what happened, and of great importance to 'why' such came about.

\* \* \*

Even though back in the U.S., 'we' chastised Mr. Reagan over the Marine catastrophe in Lebanon, the U.S. (because of Mr. Reagan's action) gained much respect. For the U.S. to gain respect from area countries is a fete in itself. We gained not just for our actions, but also for our restraint after the incident, and following incidents such as that which involved the loss of top eschelons in the area CIA staff.

Approximately two years ago it became apparent that Iran could, and would eventually 'win' a 'war' over Iraq, because Iran could (human quantity) and would (religious/political) pursue such without question as to the 'use' (or waste) of its resources (here, mainly emphasizing its own citizenry).

It begs to be researched, that a major reason for the U.S. giving 'its' tacit approval to support of Iran from our allies was to enhance Iran's ability to offset the superior capability of Iraq, through its strategic attacks on the Iranian infrastructure, to delay an Iranian 'inevitable victory'. The aim of our concealed support is not to ensure an Iranian 'victory', but to hasten an Iraqi 'settlement'.

The support (aka shipment of certain arms) to Iran is akin to the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Around one-hundred thousand Japanese islanders lost their lives, . . . to save at least the one-half million allied lives (not to mention at least another one million Japanese) if a prolonged 'war-like' invasion were held.

Enhancing Iran's capability to reach an 'end' which was certain to come about anyhow, would result in a great shortening of the war.

Why? It may lie with Afghanistan. At approximately the time that our Israeli and Saudi people hinted that we (U.S.) should start making inroads with Iran, the Soviets made it official that Russian would be the official language and the cultural language of the Afghan people would be lost.

Also, noticed was that the Soviets were starting to master techniques on engaging, and 'whittling down' the resistance forces. Given the geographic limitations (especially with respect to the locations of refugee populations in strategic fighting corridor areas) it became apparent that eventually the guerrilla forces would loose.

It is becoming apparent that it is essential that the Iranians 'be able' to offer full support to the Afghan movement. Not just on their own, but 'together in accepting assistance from outside powers (including Western) in meeting this very, very serious problem.

If the Soviets are successful in solidifying this 'wedge', the results could prove catastrophic. To Iran itself, this poses a much more serious threat than Iraq ever did, or will, whether Saddam Hussein stays or not.

If Iran bogs down in a further 'entrenchment', instead of ending the war, and ending this 'strategic death sentence' in a historical sense, the Soviets will have nothing to stop them from toppling Pakistan.

We here in the U.S. do not necessarily accept the type of rule of Zia al Haq. However, he recognizes the urgent threat the Soviets present, and it appears that if the Soviets can gain a quick 'bashing' of the Mujadeen (freedom fighter) guerrillas, there will be such a confusion in this region (don't forget there are alot of exiles from Bangladesh here also), and given the bad relations Pakistan has with India (no alliance of military support), that Pakistan may be a cakewalk, or another Ethiopia.

Possibly that is why the Soviets are pulling missiles away from the European theatre. They have possibly identified a more advantageous 'offering of weakness'. Like the game of Risk. Weakness caused by 'others wars/problems' can be taken advantage of by another, if the other sees it as to their advantage.

Do you remember how fast the Soviets moved into Kabul. If they wanted Pakistan 1) They must do it before Pakistan develops a nuclear arsenal, 2) They must have a mobile group of nuclear missiles to 'ward off' possible allied nuclear response, if allied powers psychology is of that nature.

Why would such a nuclear umbrella be necessary . . . Simple, with no conventional threat from Iran or India, the Soviets would be prepared to meet the only real threat, if the allies felt an immediate strike was necessary to halt a Soviet advance.

We can not count on India to launch a nuclear attack against the Soviets in their own right. However, India would enter in a conventional way, if there was full regional support. We can only have true, and meaningful full regional support, if Iran is capable, and in position to offer an immediate conventional deterrence.



If the Iran/Iraq war is ended even in six months, it will take time to re-deploy its forces in a effective manner.

We (all free nations) need the Iran/Iraq war to be ended very quickly. Mr. Reagan put his Presidency on the line in a strategic manner, not in a 'warlike' or 'arms merchant' manner. He put his presidency on the line. The embargo was correctly established. Mr. Reagan's conduct with Iran had to be secretive. This has be going on secretly for some years now. If the Soviets knew of our long term aims, that of 'thwarting their potential plans', this too could be catastatrophic.

However, due to the events in Iran, and Mr. Reagan's lack of insight and understanding, and his many comments during his first presidential race, Mr. Reagan did not have the necessary respect to even contact the Iranian hierarchy. Mr. Reagan had to wait until our 'connections' said the time was right. Two years ago they said it is time to begin contacting Iran.

At a strategic moment, Mr. Reagan sent a personal envoy, Mr. MacFarlane, and a personal message, a Bible. This book, Mr. Reagans Bible, is the key in letting the key people in Iran know, that now Mr. Reagan understands their plight, their historical fight, . . . and he is not trying to use Iran and its people. He respects Iran, its people, cultures, and religion.

death. A strict religious adherent, and a pragmatic. Also, the son-in-law of the zealot happens to 'chair and head' the entire Iranian terrorism network.

This 'chief' finds out about MacFarlane and has him arrested. However, its too late. Mr. Reagan's message, and understanding got through. MacFarlane was freed, and the 'chief' was arrested. The hostages ? Yes it is my belief that they were a by-product. A serious by-product or more serious happenings. And yes, I believe that if these dealings were kept secretive, current embarrassment by many governments would have been supplanted more quickly by other settlements, . . . Iran/Iraq . . . leading to others in the Mid East, and eventually, and hopefully, a somewhat quick resolution of the 'genocide' taking place in Afghanistan.

Also, if by any chance Mr. Buckley (now widely confirmed as the former CIA station chief in Beirut), it is only through direct order from the highest persons in Iran that his fate, and hopefully return will become a reality.

Mr. Reagan, even though events recently went awry, due to our friendly zealot, that bible may still end up saving possibly millions of lives.

Research will qualify and verify this chronology and analogy of past and potential events. Just look at the seriousness of potential threats, and it is easy to understand 'why' so many people would put so much on the line. Putting the presidency on the line, takes guts, whether you agree or not with the methods or outcome. Let us hope that the final 'facts' support the goodness of what seems to be a very good person.

P.S. This is not a Watergate, Irangate, or any gate. We still don't know if Nixon knew beforehand of potential doings of his men (his were henchmen, and petty at that). Lets say that he did not. The difference is that when Nixon found out, he covered it up, as an accessory. Mr. Reagan did not. He lead the charge in setting up the network of judicial and legislative inquiries to let the facts fall as they may. He stood right up and took the brunt force. If there is any 'gate' developing here it may well be 'JournalismGate'. 'Failing to research the history and look at the environment, and instead having the President run through a gauntlet of bamboo sticks'.

There was no benefit of the doubt in the profession's handling of this matter. No innocence until proven guilty. If there ends up being an impeachment proceeding, should the President ask for a change of venue, to Canada, or Iran?

The Contras. This aspect should be looked at with respect to the timing/chronology of money flow. When did the funds arrive in the Swiss accounts, 'for Lt. Col. North's usage'. Is this another by-product, which was put to what a 'small administrative clique' felt was good usage. Given that there is involvement with the NSC and CIA, it appears that just keeping the Soviets busily involved in military matters in this area may point to understanding the 'why' as to their decision making.

It must be noted that at that time when the Contras were 'weakened' by the Congressional actions, the Soviet backed and led Nicaraguan military actually made an 'attack incursion' into the Honduras. Do we want to have similar occurrences happen further, like Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Angola. It seems that the bear is on the prowl, and so are the bear's cubs.

**RE: Follow-up commentary, & request for further research, review, & feedback on current Iran crisis, relating to review with respect to certain historical significances:**

a) An historical and somewhat brazen departure for a U.S. administration from strongly 'practiced' policy, into new understanding of foreign policy at a 180 degree turn, due to a 'learned' acceptance of another's view. This particular event, when taken into view with other demonstrative administrative alterations in 'tactics' to effect positive foreign policy progress, is in historical relativity even more eventful than the re-opening of relations with China under their Communist indoctrinated structure during the Nixon years. Subsequent development of this re-directed methodology, is aimed at resolving differences in a manner which is (from 'a' above) intended to preserve the integrity of state and cultural independence of involved nations and peoples. We effect positive results, without intent of creative or generating influences relating to 'hegemony'.

b) Evolving directions by the Soviet Union also in setting foreign policies, developing strategies to pursue them, and implementing tactics to obtain desired results. a) Unfortunately, we in the U.S. are looking at this (and artificially developing) Iran 'related' crisis, as in gawking in awe at the aftermath of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, and not working to understand the processes involved in the development, analyzation, and subsequent decision making processes which led to such tactics being first deemed necessary, and then either implemented, or 'testing the waters'.

Mr. Reagan's initiative(s) were bold steps to effect progress using new understandings of foreign nations (other cultures with respect to past history and daily living) needs in initiating venues to promulgate this new understanding and acceptance of respect of foreign nations laws and cultural sovereignty.

Again, and of historical importance, are that these series of initiatives were not targeted with an intent to resolve the 'problems' with an 'eye' on having part of the results (outcome) being such that the U.S. would gain in a way of having an 'influence' in the aftermath, 'hegemony'.





Dear Mr. President:

Once again the silent majority of the Iranian population held hostage by the Khomeini Regime in Iran and the exiled Iranian Communities around the world are experiencing devastating emotional shock because of the current influential support provided by the Western Governments to the so-called Islamic Marxist Group of Mojahedin. On behalf of my fellow Iranian officers, enlisted military personnel and the silent majority of the Iranian population, it is my responsibility to brief your office again with pertinent information outlined in this letter regarding the Mojahedin Group. Furthermore, I am offering the Western World a sound and rational alternative for resolving the dangerous situation in Persian Gulf.

As it was described to your office in my letter of 2-3-86, this particular group are true believers of Marxism and they are the initiators of terrorism in Iran. Because of this groups previous terrorist activities in Iran, several hundreds of innocent Iranians (including women and children) and tens of foreign citizens lost their lives. Among the foreign citizens, were several technocrats of the Rockwell International Company who were innocently sacrificed for the leftist ideological satisfaction of Mr. Rajavi (the President of Mojaheding Group). During President Nixon's visit to Iran and just to embarrass the Iranian Government, the same group had planned and ignited a bomb on General Harold Price's daily car rout. The Soviet Government had and has sincere interest in Mr. Rajavi's life to the extend that with direct intervention and pursuance of Russian President Mr. Padghony, the death sentence of Rajavi was forgiven and reduced to life in prison by the late Shah of Iran. The USSR interest in Mojaheding, had placed a great deal of pressure on the Saddam Hussein's Government so that at first this group was provided with \$11,000,000.00 cash assistance and later on an invitation was extended to this terrorist group to establish a base in Iraq. In doing so, Mr. Rajavi and his followers betrayed their country and sold the blood of hundreds of thousands of young Iranian to the cash sum idicated above and as well as to the USSR's and their personal political ambitions. We are certain that not only the Iranian Nation shall not forget the madness of Iraqi leader but also they shall always remember the collaboration of this dangerous group with Iran's enemy Iraq and its brainless leader Hussein. We can assure you that there is no

room for Mojaheding in Iran and in fact this group is hated, detested and abominated by the vast majority of the Iranian population. The leaders of the Western World have our assurance that if Mojahedin is brought into power, its leaders for the purpose of stabilizing their leftist regime will immediately use the content of the CENTO agreement and ask for the Russian troops for military assistance. We all have observed this in the case of the newly established Aghanistan leftist regime and others. As it was outlined in my September 14, 1985 report to your office, then the long time dream of Russia would be materialized in a relatively short period. In conclusion, Rajavi and his group will hand over Iran and the rest of the Middle Eastern oil producing countries to Russia. Obviously, Western Europe and Japan because of their dependence on Middle Eastern oil shall fall within the political influence of the USSR.

One can not ignore that Rajavi and his group not only are rejected by the majority of the Iranian Population, but also this group falls short in providing a real opposition force to Khomeini regime. History has shown that Iranian nation always follows a strong and respectable leader where Mr. Rajavi lacks both of these qualifications.

Our records indicate that in all correspondence during the past several years to the White House and American Governmental organizations, we always recognized that the Khomeini regime was doomed and we advocated its overthrow. Now that the leaders of the Western World are in agreement with us, we believe that the leadership of overthrowing the Khomeini regime must be carefully analyzed and selected so that its success with minimum risk and sacrifice could be attained. As we all recognize the Khomeini regime could be a strong catalyst for the III World Conflict and any minute error could easily result in a permanent dangerous situation. Furthermore, it is equally important to support only a future rational and legitimate government for Iran. We all appreciate your personal philosophy in attaining a strong position and hence achieving both the peace and freedom for the Central American countries and seriousness of the negotiation of nuclear arm reduction with the Soviet Union. Similarly, it is our assessment and sincere belief that the Khomeini regime could only be overthrown by an opposition led by a respected, honored and knowledgeable soldier like myself who has the support and understanding of the majority of Iranian people. To substantiate this statement, I am providing the following facts:

As a son of a supreme court justice, I was indoctrinated from childhood with the laws of Individual Rights, Freedom of Press, Law & Order and known duties toward the mother land. Just for the honor of serving my home country, I entered the military academy and took the oath of service but requested that my salary for several years be distributed among the needy enlisted groups. My membership as a faculty in the military academy and personal anti-communist philosophy, led the late Shah's regime to assign me to some delicate missions. Among these important missions were the discovery/control of both the military and civilian network of the communist Todeh Party who had infiltrated in Dr. Mossadeg's governmental organizations, investigation of Moslem Brotherhood Organization and dealing with Mr. Navab Safavi known as

Khomeini's boss & ideal and again the discovery and control of the Kurdistan's leftist Democratic Party. Our information indicates that my name is among the nineteen top hit list of Khomeini regime. In addition, numerous posters of Navab and I are posted as the most wanted person(me) around the country. It is unfortunate that due to the similarity of identities, my own brother General B. Amjadi and another General Amjadi with less influential positions have lost their lives in the hand of Khomeini regime. The reason that Khomeini regime fears strongly from me is not only for my previous dealing with their former organizational boss(Navab) but also following:

1) He is certain that my military service record, experience in implementing Law & Order, personal charisma and several commandship positions in the past could easily unite the Iranian officers and enlisted personnel behind me.

2) He knows that 15,000,000 Azarbayejanians would wellcome their favorite son to librate Iran.

3) It is obvious to Khomeini and his regime that my personal contact with the majority of the Iranian officers as their respected instructor in the Military Academy or as their commander of either of the Artillery Division, Gazvine Base, Tabriz Base, Esfahan Base, Ahwaz Base and as well as the member of the Suprem Command Staff will regain their confidence in a reliable, respectable and strong leader like myself.

4) Khomeini and his subordinates know that my name is a well known "hous-hold" name in Iran, therefor, I could easily call and attain the national support through out the country.

5) In addition my personal relationship and contact with the leaders of the major Iranian tribes could present another unique and devastating threat to the Khomeini Regim.

6) Furthermore, it is crystal clear to Mr. Khomeini that the Iranian population always follow strong, reputable and capable leaders. I as an Ideal leader could gain the confidence and support of the majority of the Iranian officers, enlisted military and security personnel, civilian workers, general public and even some of the revolutionary gaurds. Therefore, as far the Khomeini Regime is concerned, I am the most strong candidate who could assume the leadership of overthrowing that regime. As the late General de Gaulle wished only a free France for the French population, this soldier too wishes only a free Iran and a form of a civilized and rational government for the Nation of Iran. I must state that I have enjoyed all anyone could of position, wealth and respect provided me by my homeland. Discharging the soldier duties and complying with my oath are remained to be satisfied.

In order to librate Iran from the Khomeini Regime, eliminate the strong hold of international terrorism and stop the aggression of communism toward the Persian Gulf, my Fellow Freedom Fighters and I are ready to enter Iran and implement our Iran, General Liberation Plan.

Mr. President , we know that your time is precious and have already spent a great deal of it on Iran matters. But, we ask you to grant us an audience for half an hour so that we could brief you with our plan. It is our desire to implement this plan without American involvement but your political support is essential to our success. We are available at any time and any place to present our briefing.

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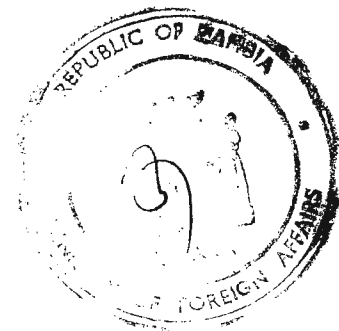

# One Hundredth Congress of the United States of America

## AT THE FIRST SESSION

*Begun and held at the City of Washington on Tuesday, the sixth day of January,  
one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven*

### Joint Resolution

To support a ceasefire in the Iran-Iraq war and a negotiated solution to the conflict.

Whereas the conflict between Iran and Iraq has resulted in more than 400,000 fatalities on both sides, including tens of thousands of adolescents since its beginning in September 1980;

Whereas both sides have resorted to periodic attacks on the civilian population of the other country, including Iranian missile attacks on Baghdad and Iraqi Air Force bombing raids on Iranian population centers;

Whereas more than 75,000 prisoners of war are being held on both sides;

Whereas Iraq has resorted to the use of chemical weapons, in violation of its obligations under international law not to use such weapons;

Whereas attacks on neutral shipping in the Persian Gulf threaten to limit the access of the United States and its allies to oil supplies from the region;

Whereas Iranian troops continue to occupy Iraqi territory;

Whereas the possibility of a decisive Iranian breakthrough cannot be precluded as long as the war continues;

Whereas such a breakthrough would be destabilizing to a number of friendly countries in the region, which would be increasingly vulnerable as a result of an Iranian victory both to direct Iranian attacks and to Iranian sponsored subversion and terrorist activities;

Whereas a continuation of the conflict will inevitably lead to tens of thousands of additional casualties, including large numbers of civilians; and

Whereas the Iraqi Government has called for an immediate ceasefire and a negotiated solution to the conflict, including a withdrawal to the internationally recognized border: Now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

#### SECTION 1. CONSEQUENCES OF CONTINUATION OF IRAN-IRAQ WAR.

The Congress finds that continuation of the Iran-Iraq war—

(1) would produce unacceptable levels of death and destruction which would be incompatible with the humanitarian concerns and values of the American people; and

(2) could result in an Iranian breakthrough which would threaten the stability of the entire region and would not be in the strategic interests of the United States.

#### SEC. 2. SUPPORT FOR A CEASEFIRE AND A NEGOTIATED SOLUTION TO THE CONFLICT.

Accordingly, the policy of the United States Government shall be to support—

H. J. Res. 216—2

(1) a ceasefire and a negotiated solution to the Iran-Iraq conflict, including a withdrawal to the internationally recognized border, and

(2) the establishment of an international tribunal to investigate the origins of the conflict.

**SEC. 3. INTERNATIONAL MEASURES IF NEGOTIATIONS AND CEASEFIRE REJECTED.**

It is the sense of the Congress that if either party to the Iran-Iraq war rejects peace negotiations and an internationally sanctioned ceasefire, including a withdrawal to the internationally recognized border, the United States should support internationally approved political and economic measures against that country, and maintain existing limitations on trade.
