Dear Mr. Reed:

I am replying to your message to President Reagan concerning the U.S. offer to pay compensation to the families of the victims of Iran Air flight 655.

The United States deeply regrets the tragic loss of life in the recent downing of Iran Air 655 by a U.S. vessel, and has conveyed its position to the Iranian Government and to the other governments of those on board the flight. As President Reagan announced, for humanitarian reasons, the United States will compensate the families of the victims in a way that does not involve the Iranian Government. The U.S. offer is voluntary and not a matter of legal obligation.

The arrangements for direct payment to the families are currently under study. No compensation will be paid to the Government of Iran for the loss of the aircraft itself, which was owned and operated by the Iranian Government. The United States has not made payment of compensation to the families contingent on changes of behavior by the Iranian Government because this would suggest that we are prepared to reward such changes by paying money to the Iranian Government. To make payment contingent on the release of our own hostages would reward terrorism and hostage-taking.

This tragedy underlines the urgency of ending the most dangerous and destructive source of regional tension — the Iran-Iraq war. The United States is working with states in the region and outside it to find a negotiated settlement of the bilateral conflict. Toward that goal, we led the effort in the UN Security Council that resulted in the unanimous passage of Resolution 598 on July 20, 1987. The Resolution establishes a solid basis to ensure a lasting peace by calling for an immediate cease-fire and withdrawal to international borders, the return of prisoners of war, and the establishment of a body to determine responsibility for the war. The United States strongly believes that implementation of Resolution 598 is the best means to achieve a comprehensive, negotiated settlement. Both sides have now accepted that Resolution. The urgent need now is to bring it into practical effect to end the conflict.

The United States will continue to work with the UN Security Council and the Secretary General to bring an end to this tragic war. In the meantime, U.S. military forces will remain in the Gulf to protect our national interests.

I WANT TO INFORM YOU OF MY UNCONDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR YOUR ACTIONS SURROUNDING THE UNFORTUNATE INCIDENT INVOLVING THE IRANIAN JET LINER. Dear Mr. President:

The terrible tragedy that has occurred in the Persian Gulf, in which a civilian Iranian airliner was accidentally shot down by U.S. forces engaged in defending themselves, underscores the need for securing a lasting peace in that area and the danger in that part of the world for civilians as well as military.

We applaud your initiative in promptly acknowledging this accident and expressing regret to the government of Iran. We are, however, concerned at recent reports that the Administration is considering making reparations to the families of individuals killed in this air disaster. While there may be justification for taking such a step, we believe it would be premature at this time, for a couple of reasons.

At the time of the incident, the U.S. ship was under attack from Iranian gunboats. It was actively engaged in combat from forces openly hostile to U.S. presence in the Persian Gulf.

Secondly, overall Iranian policy from the time of the taking of the hostages in 1979 has been one of calculated and methodical antagonism to the United States. To put it in perspective, while the United States promptly acknowledged this accident and expressed regret for it, when 241 Army, Navy and Marine troops were savagely murdered by terrorist forces in Beirut in 1983 there was no remotely similar reaction on the part of Iran. In fact, it was the government of Iran which imported and paid for the bomb that killed these soldiers.

We strongly oppose the payment of reparations while innocent Americans are being held hostage by forces allied with the Iranian government. Nor should we forget the murder of CIA agent Buckley by terrorists sympathetic with Iranian extremists. The President July 6, 1988 Page Two

Before one nickel is paid to Iran or these families, the Iranian government should effect the release of the nine American hostages now being held in Beirut. It would be a cynical conclusion to this event to have the United States pay thousands or even millions of taxpayers' dollars to Iran at a time it is overtly supporting terrorism against U.S. citizens around the world.

The issue of whether or not to pay reparations demands thorough and painstaking review, and we are making no recommendation as to that ultimate decision. We strongly urge you, however, to reject any proposal to make reparations without first having secured the release of the American hostages in the Middle East. It would be a shame to the Americans now being held and those who have died to do any less.

Dear Mr. President:

The downing of an Iranian airliner by the USS Vincennes is a human tragedy, and we deeply regret the loss of any innocent life.

We should not second guess the actions of our serviceman in a war torn area. The details of this tragedy are still unfolding and only a thorough review will reveal all the facts.

One thing is certain, Captain Will Rogers and the crew of the USS Vincennes acted to protect their ship.

There has been much speculation about the U.S. paying some reparations to the Iranian victims of this tragedy. The American people are compassionate and it is instinctive for us as a free society to want to make things as right as possible.

This, however is not the time to grant reparations. Under no circumstances should the U.S. provide reparations without assurances that the Iranian government will act as a responsible nation-state, rather than the international gangster we have come to know.

The American people have had to live with the reality of the terrorism that is generated from Iran. Iranian officials have built the world's largest state-run terror apparatus, one with the capacity to strike virtually anywhere. Terrorism remains an important element of Iran's foreign and defense policy.

It is this same Iranian regime which a short while ago launched an all out attack against our fleet in the Persian Gulf. It is the same Iranian regime which has mined commercial shipping lanes in the Persian Gulf. It is this same regime which supported the hijacking of a TWA flight in 1985 by a pro-Iranian Lebanese

Shiite militia group. The hijackers wielded two hand grenades and a pistol in seizing the TWA aircraft and shot U.S. Navy diver Robert Stethem in the head while holding him in the plane's doorway. They dumped him on the tarmac where he subsequently died.

It is this same Iranian regime which assisted in the destruction of the Marine Barracks in Beirut.

In each and every case the U.S. has been victims of this regime and in each case the Iranians never discussed reparations to American victims.

And in spite of the highest U.S. officials publicly considering granting reparations, we witness Iranian government officials openly speculating about what kind of terrorist response they will launch against the U.S. or our allies. There is also concern that Iran might encourage its allies in Lebanon to execute some of their nine American hostages, who include Marine Lieutenant Colonel Richard Higgins.

Mr. President, before you consider any reparation, the United States should demand that:

- a. all American hostages be released by the Iranian Shiite Moslem groups.
- b. the Iranian government grant reparations to the American families of the victims of the Beirut Marine Barracks disaster.

Dear Dr. Cleaves:

I am replying to your message to President Reagan concerning the U.S. offer to pay compensation to the families of the victims of Iran Air flight 655. Our offer is voluntary and not a matter of legal obligation.

We deeply regret the tragic loss of life in the recent downing of Iran Air 655 by a U.S. vessel, and have conveyed our position to the Iranian Government and to the other governments of those on board the flight. As President Reagan announced, for humanitarian reasons, the United States will compensate the families of the victims in a way that does not involve the Iranian Government. The arrangements for direct payment to the families are currently under study.

No compensation will be paid to the Government of Iran for the loss of the aircraft itself, which was owned and operated by the Iranian Government. We have not made payment of compensation to the families contingent on changes of behavior by the Iranian Government because this would suggest that we are prepared to reward such changes by paying money to the Iranian Government. To make payment contingent on the release of our own hostages would reward terrorism and hostage-taking.

This tragedy underlines the urgency of ending the most dangerous and destructive source of regional tension — the Iran-Iraq war. The United States is working with states in the region and outside it to find a negotiated settlement of the bilateral conflict. Toward that goal, we led the effort in the UN Security Council that resulted in the unanimous passage of Resolution 598 on July 20, 1987. The Resolution establishes a solid basis to ensure a lasting peace by calling for an immediate cease-fire and withdrawal to international borders, the return of prisoners of war, and the establishment of a body to determine responsibility for the war. The United States strongly believes that implementation of Resolution 598 is the best means to achieve a comprehensive, negotiated settlement. Both sides have now accepted that Resolution. The urgent need now is to bring it into practical effect to end the conflict.

The United States will continue to work with the UN Security Council and the Secretary General to bring an end to

this tragic war. In the meantime, U.S. military forces will remain in the Gulf to protect our national interests.
