I am replying to your letter to President Reagan concerning the U.S. offer to pay compensation to the families of the victims of Iran Air flight 655. I regret the delay in this response.

The United States deeply regrets the tragic loss of life in the recent downing of Iran Air flight 655 by a U.S. vessel, and has conveyed its position to the Iranian Government and to the other governments of those on board the flight. As President Reagan announced, for humanitarian reasons, the United States will compensate the families of the victims in a way that does not involve the Iranian Government. The U.S. offer is voluntary and not a matter of legal obligation.

The arrangements for direct payment to the families are currently under study. No compensation will be paid to the Government of Iran for the loss of the aircraft itself, which was owned and operated by the Iranian Government. The United States has not made payment of compensation to the families contingent on changes of behavior by the Iranian Government because this would suggest that we are prepared to reward such changes by paying money to the Iranian Government. To make payment contingent on the release of our own hostages would reward terrorism and hostage-taking.

This tragedy underlines the urgency of ending the most dangerous and destructive source of regional tension -- the Iran-Iraq war. The United States supports the efforts of the United Nations Secretary General to find a negotiated settlement of this protracted conflict. Toward that goal, we led the effort in the U.N. Security Council that resulted in the unanimous passage of Resolution 598 on July 20, 1987. The Resolution establishes a solid basis to ensure a lasting peace by calling for an immediate cease-fire and withdrawal to international borders, the return of prisoners of war, and the establishment of a body to determine responsibility for the war. The United States strongly believes that implementation of Resolution 598 is the best means to achieve a comprehensive, negotiated settlement. Both sides have now accepted that Resolution. The urgent need now is to bring it into practical effect to end the conflict. The United States will continue to work with the U.N. Security Council and the Secretary General to bring an end to this tragic war. In the meantime, U.S. military forces will remain in the Gulf to protect our national interests.

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to you to express my strong opposition to any payment of compensation to Iran in connection with the downing of Iran Air flight 655. While I appreciate and understand the humanitarian concern you have expressed to the families of people who died of flight 655, I believe payment of compensation at this time is unjustified.

This tragic incident would never have happened if the government of Iran had not adopted a policy of preying on neutral shipping in the Persian Gulf, nor would it have happened if that government had not defied international diplomatic efforts aimed at achieving a ceasefire and a negotiated settlement in the war against Iraq.

Iran once again has shown a brutal indifference to the lives of its own people by permitting flight 655 to take off and fly into a hostile area. The downing of flight 655 occurred after a respected U.S. Navy commander and his crew issued <u>seven</u> warnings to the approaching aircraft to identify itself, and after the aircraft failed to do so.

No American has attempted to minimize this tragic mistake, and the United States has accepted responsibility for its actions. But, compensation implies liability for a negligent act by the United States. In no way can the U.S. Navy be blamed for carrying out its mission and protecting the lives of U.S. servicemen.

As long as the government of Iran is convinced it can gain its objectives in the Gulf and elsewhere by continuing this senseless war, compensation should not be considered. The time to consider compensation is during a political negotiation when the hostilities have ceased and when nine innocent Americans have been safely released from their pro-Iranian captors in the Middle East.

Mr. President, I appeal to you on behalf of the residents of my Congressional District to reconsider your decision to pay compensation for the victims of flight 655.



Dear Ms. Rountree:

I am responding to your letter to President Reagan of July 14, in which you asked him to reconsider his decision to pay reparations to the families of those killed in the downing of Iran Flight 655. The President believes that his decision, as hard as it was to make, was the correct one.

On August 19, the Secretary of Defense reported to the public the final results of the investigation into this tragic incident. The report bears out your contention that Iran shares the blame for this tragic accident in that it initiated the surface action, ignored repeated warnings of U.S. forces concerning potential hazards of flights in the Persian gulf, and allowed an airliner to take off from a joint "military/civilian" airfield and fly directly into the midst of a gunfight. Despite the culpability of the Government of Iran, the Air Bus victims were not terrorists; therefore it would be inhumane and contrary to American tradition to deprive the families of just, fair compensation for their losses. This said, however, you should be assured that we will not pay one cent to the Government of Iran.

The President's position is firm in laying blame for state supported terrorism, but also believes it would be equally inappropriate to deprive or use these innocent, bereaved families to blackmail a government with which we do not have normal relations. We cannot use the grief of Iranian families as "bargaining chips" to obtain compensation for Americans who have also lost loved ones to terrorism. The U.S. must lead by example and hope that if not this present leadership of Iran, maybe the next will acknowledge accepted standards of fairness. United States law provides for compensation in terrorist situations and this may be an avenue that your organization may want to pursue.

The Administration will not normalize relations with Iran until it does three critical things. First, it must use its influence with the terrorists in Lebanon to release Americans held hostage; next, it must change its present support for state supported terrorism; and finally, it needs to show a sincere desire to achieve a lasting peace with Iraq. While there are signs that peace may be coming, there is no indication that Iran has changed its present position on the issues of terrorism or the U.S. hostages. If I may be of further assistance on this matter, please let me know.

Despite the culpability of the Government of Iran, the Air Bus victims were not terrorists; therefore it would be inhumane and contrary to American tradition to deprive the families of just and fair compensation for their losses. This said, however, you should be assured that we will not pay one cent to the Government of Iran.

There is no one in the United States who feels more strongly than I do on the subject of state supported terrorism, but I also believe it would be equally inappropriate to deprive or use these innocent, bereaved families to blackmail a government with which we do not even have normal relations. If we used the grief of lost loved ones as bargaining "chips" to obtain compensation for Americans who have also lost loved ones to terrorism, we would be lowering ourselves to their standards, not doing what is right. We are better than that - we need to lead by example and hope that if not this present leadership of Iran, maybe the next will raise itself to our level of decency and fairness. United States law provides for compensation in terrorist situations and this may be an avenue that your organization may want to pursue.

I can assure you that as long as I am your President, we will not normalize our relationship with Iran until it does three critical things. First, it must use its influence with the terrorists in Lebanon to release those Americans held hostage; next, it must change its present position on state supported terrorism; and finally, it needs to show a sincere desire to achieve a lasting peace with Iraq. While there are signs that peace may be coming, there is no indication that Iran has changed its present position on the issues of terrorism or the U.S. hostages.

I hope this explains my position on this very difficult and personally troublesome subject.

On behalf of Leadership Foundation and its large influential membership throughout America, I am writing to ask that you reconsider your decision to pay reparations to the families of those killed in the downing of Iran Air Flight 655.

Americans are a good and generous people, Mr. President, and you admirably reflect their best instincts and highest aspirations. Like you, Leadership Foundation mourns the loss of any innocent life. However, Iran Air Flight 655 was destroyed through mistaken judgment at a time when the U.S.S. Vincennes was engaged in combat with the military and terrorist forces of Iran. This loss of life was an unfortunate result of Iran's own terrorist activities in the Persian Gulf and throughout the Middle East region.

We urge you to withhold reparations until Iran has made reparations for:

- * Holding and torturing 52 Americans for 444 days in 1979-1980 after seizure of the U.S. Embassy and other American property.
- * The April 1983 car bombing at the U.S. Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, which resulted in the deaths of 174 Americans.
- * The October 1983 car bombing at U.S. Marine barracks in Lebanon which resulted in the deaths of 241 young Americans.
- * The January 1984 murder of Malcolm Kerr, president of the American University of Beirut and the presumed murder of Peter Kilburn.
- * The September 1984 car bombing murder of 2 Americans at the U.S. Embassy Annex in East Beirut.
- * The airline hijacking and murder of 2 U.S. Agency for International Development (AID) officials in December, 1984.

We believe, Mr. President, that the payment of reparations to Iran would be a grave injustice and deeply offensive to all those American families whose sons and daughters have been murdered at the hands of this criminal nation. It would be particularly wrong and offensive for the U.S. taxpayers to compensate Iranians while that nation is today holding under cruel conditions nine American hostages after murdering two others.

For the sake of justice and common sense, Mr. President, and out of concern for so many Americans who have also suffered, we urge you to abandon any thought of paying reparations to Iran.

On behalf of President Reagan, thank you for your letter concerning compensation to the families of the victims of Iran Air flight 655.

The United States deeply regrets the tragic loss of life in the recent downing of Iran Air flight 655 by a U.S. vessel, and has conveyed its position to the Iranian Government and to the other governments of those on board the flight. As the President announced, for humanitarian reasons, the United States will compensate the families of the victims in a way that does not involve the Iranian Government. The United States offer is voluntary and not a matter of legal obligation.

The arrangements for direct payment to the families are currently under study. No compensation will be paid to the Government of Iran for the loss of the aircraft itself, which was owned and operated by the Iranian Government. The United States has not made payment of compensation to the families contingent on changes of behavior by the Iranian Government because this might be interpreted that we are prepared to reward the Iranian Government for change. To make payment contingent on the release of our own hostages indirectly rewards terrorism and hostage-taking.

This tragedy underlines the urgency of ending the most dangerous and destructive source of regional tension -- the Iran-Iraq war. We are working to find a negotiated settlement of the bilateral conflict. Toward that goal, we led the effort in the UN Security Council that resulted in the unanimous passage of Resolution 598 on July 20, 1987. The resolution established a solid basis to ensure a lasting peace by calling for an immediate cease-fire and withdrawal to international borders, the return of prisoners of war, and the establishment of a body to determine responsibility for the war. The United States strongly believes that implementation of Resolution 598 is the best means to achieve a comprehensive, negotiated settlement. Both sides have now accepted that Resolution. The urgent need now is to bring it into practical effect to end the conflict. The United States will continue to work with the UN Security Council and the Secretary General to bring an end to this tragic war. In the meantime, U.S. military forces will remain in the Gulf to protect our national interests.


