Sir:

Dear Ron:

Thank you very much for your letter of July 9, 1988, concerning the Security Council deliberations on the Iran Air 655 incident.

It is an extremely tragic and unfortunate incident. My Government strongly desires to see that it does not lead to an escalation of the existing tension in the Persian Gulf. Accordingly, I highly appreciate the sincere attitude and prompt action you have taken upon its occurrence, as evidenced by your expression of regret over the loss of precious lives, initiation of an investigation to bring forth all the relevant facts, readiness to cooperate with an investigation by the International Civil Aviation Organization, and offer, from a humanitarian point of view, of ex gratia compensations for the bereaved families.

In addressing this unfortunate occurrence, I agree to your basic line of approach in the coming Security Council deliberations, which is, as I understand, that it is important for the Council to discuss the need to prevent a recurrence of a similar incident and to make its deliberations as constructive as possible, by focusing its attention on the basic problem of the tension in the area resulting from the Iran-Iraq conflict, and that the Council should not be utilized as a means of disturbing the interests or the military presence of the West in the Gulf or obstructing the full implementation of Resolution 598. I believe in the meantime that it is also important to preserve the unanimity of the Security Council on the conflict. From these considerations, it seems to me that the issuance of an agreed statement by the Security Council President as you suggest is an idea worthy of careful consideration.

On the other hand, my Government considers it a matter of great importance for the West to maintain some sort of communication with Iran, in order to prevent that country from becoming isolated at this time when it is beginning to make moves for improving its relations with the West. It will indeed enable us to sustain the international momentum toward an early implementation of Resolution 598, without losing sight of our primary objective of ending the Iran-Iraq conflict.





I am an Iranian Journalist living in exile in the UK and despite my age I am in constant opposition and struggle against the present regime in Iran and its fanatical leader, Khomeini and his false brand of Islam, its fanatical teachings and lack of respect for human rights and freedom of speech.

The Moscow summit between President Reagan & General Secretary Gorbachev gave the world much hope for peace and prosperity it was like a light at the end of a dark tunnel for all peace lovers of the world, and for the first time in many decades the church bells in the Soviet Union rang and people freely went to worship and give thanks for peace and freedom. There were only a few short comments in Iran in the news services no pictures of the new warmth and friendship were shown as Iranian network television.

In Iran, its fanatical rulers are more dangerous than any nuclear warhead that the super powers are trying to eliminate, because they are full of hatred and contempt for progress of the world, achievements in education, sanitation, technological advances and any improvements in struggling nations who are trying to rid themselves of old superstitions and enter the new era, as all these improvements will result in their inability to spread their teachings.

These people claim victory in Iran, as an outside conqueror may have done, they are committing such crimes in the name of Islam and Shiyate whose effect are worse than any nuclear radition and will spread to all over the Middle East and Gulf regions very shortly. I am sending you a cutting from an Iranian newspaper which shows the pictures of many of its rulers, there are many more of these people spread all over Iran, every town, village and city, they are also spread in many parts of Afghanistan, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Kuwait, U.A.E., Bahrain, Lebanon, the Persian Gulf State, Tunisia, Iraq, Sudan, Syria, Egypt and under different guises in many European and U.S. cities, they are worst than any nuclear warhead and God forbid, if they succeed they will cause a greater catastrophie and genocide than Hitler and Nazis.

In the name of humanity and all that is good and decent in this world, please help us to rid our country and the world of this parasites, the first step is stop selling them arms and put pressure on them by accepting the U.N. resolution for ceasefire, the rest will be done by the Iranian people and the remnants of a once great and glorious armed forces of Iran.


