



In the Young Irish disorders, in Ireland in 1848 the following nine men were captured, tried and convicted of treason against Her Majesty, the Queen, and were sentenced to death: John Mitchell, Morris Lyene, Pat Donahue, Thomas McGee, Charles Duffy, Thomas Meagher, Richard O'Gorman, Terrence McManus, Michael Ireland.

Before passing sentence, the judge asked if there was anything that anyone wished to say. Meagher, speaking for all, said:

"My lord, this is our first offense but not our last. If you will be easy with us this once, we promise, on our word as gentlemen, to try to do better next time. And next time -- sure we won't be fools to get caught."

Thereupon the indignant judge sentenced them all to be hanged by the neck until dead and drawn and quartered. Passionate protest from all the world forced Queen Victoria to commute the sentence to transportation for life to far wild Australia.

In 1874, word reached the astounded Queen Victoria that the Sir Charles Duffy who had been elected Prime Minister of Australia was the same Charles Duffy who had been transported 25 years before. On the Queen's demand, the records of the rest of the transported men were revealed and this is what was uncovered:

THOMAS FRANCIS MEAGHER, Governor of Montana
TERRENCE McMANUS, Brigadier General, United States Army
PATRICK DONAHUE, Brigadier General, United States Army
RICHARD O'GORMAN, Governor General of Newfoundland

THOMAS D'ARCY McGEE, Member of Parliament, Minister of Agriculture and President of Council of Dominion of Canada

JOHN MITCHELL, prominent New York politician. This man was the father of John Purroy Mitchell, Mayor of New York, at the outbreak of World War I.

Sean Donlon has asked, via the Irish Embassy, to meet with you on the afternoon of July 18. Donlon, who I believe you know, is a former Irish Ambassador to the U.S. and is currently Undersecretary for Political Affairs. I believe he is the top career official in the Foreign Ministry.

The Irish Embassy could not identified any special topic for discussion and tells us that Donlon is in the U.S. on a private visit. I suspect he will want to present Irish views on the status of the Irish-Anglo talks on Northern Ireland. These talks reportedly are going well and may lead to a FitzGerald-Thatcher Summit in the fall. Donlon may be interested in prospects of the U.S. helping to fund some sort of settlement. Tip O'Neill is on record as supporting U.S. funding.

MEETING OF THE FRIENDS OF IRELAND IN THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS
AND THE IRISH-UNITED STATES PARLIAMENTARY GROUP
WASHINGTON D.C. 24th July 1985

A joint statement on Northern Ireland (copy attached) was issued following today's meeting.

The Speaker of the House Of Representatives, the Honorable Thomas P O'Neill, Jr., and the Friends of Ireland in Congress had earlier welcomed to Washington as their guests the visiting delegation from the Irish Parliament led by the Ceann' Comhairle (Speaker) of Dail Eireann, Mr Tom Fitzpatrick, TD. The Irish visitors include senior representatives of the three main political parties in the Irish parliament who formed the Irish-United States Parliamentary Group in 1983 as a counterpart to the Friends of Ireland in the Congress. Both organisations are committed to increased cooperation and exchanges between Ireland and the United States and to working together for a peaceful and just solution of the Northern Ireland problem.

The link between Congress and the Direachtas (Irish Parliament) has been strengthened in recent years by a number of reciprocal visits. It was agreed that continued contact between the two legislatures would assist in producing an informed and constructive congressional approach to the Northern Ireland problem. The Ceann Comhairle, on behalf of the Irish delegation, thanked his American hosts for their interest in Irish affairs and hospitality during the visit and invited the Friends of Ireland to visit the Direachtas in Dublin at an early stage.

JOINT STATEMENT BY THE FRIENDS OF IRELAND AND THE IRISH-UNITED STATES PARLIAMENTARY GROUP WASHINGTON D.C., 24 JULY, 1985

The principal topic at the meeting between the Friends of Ireland and the Irish-United States Parliamentary Group was the discussion of improved methods by which the two organizations could work together to advance peace and stability in Northern Ireland and to strengthen the friendship between the Irish and American people.

The meeting highlighted the deep concern of the Friends of Ireland in the United States Congress over the continuing tragedy in Northern Ireland. The Friends of Ireland reaffirmed their commitment to peace in that troubled part of Ireland and their desire to assist a just and lasting political settlement. The Friends of Ireland will continue to work towards the goal of Irish unity achieved by agreement and by peaceful means.

Both delegations repeated their condemnation of violence, injustice and discrimination in Northern Ireland and re-iterated their strong belief that such tactics serve only to deepen divisions in Ireland, impede reconciliation between the Nationalist and Unionist traditions, and damage the cause of Irish unity. They appealed again to Americans not to support or assist in anyway those who advocate or resort to violence in Northern Ireland.

The Irish delegation briefed their hosts on developments in Ireland and in Anglo-Irish relations since the publication of the Report of the New Ireland Forum in May 1984. The presence on the Irish parliamentary delegation of representatives of three of the parties who had participated in the Forum facilitated a thorough exchange of views. The Friends of Ireland, who sponsored resolutions adopted by the full House of Representatives and Senate endorsing the Report in 1984, strongly reaffirmed their support for its approach towards a genuine reconciliation between the two political traditions in Northern Ireland.

The Friends of Ireland recalled their disappointment and that of many Irish Americans over the negative presentation by the British Government of the results of the Anglo-Irish Summit last November. They noted that, since then, detailed negotiations were initiated between the Irish and British Governments on the basis of the Report, and that these talks are continuing.

The Friends of Ireland expressed their hope for an early and positive outcome of the talks, and noted in particular the special obligation of the British Government, given its responsibility in Northern Ireland, to do everything possible to ensure a successful conclusion. They also expressed their hope that the Congress and the Administration would provide appropriate support for such an initiative.

The Irish delegation thanked their hosts for their continuing commitment to the New Ireland Forum process and the warmth of their hospitality on this

visit to Washington. The Ceann Comhairle, Mr Tom Fitzpatrick TD, as Chairman of the Irish-United States Parliamentary Group, invited the Speaker, Tip O'Neill, to send a delegation from the Friends of Ireland to Dublin at the earliest appropriate opportunity.
