The Treasury Department concurs in the substantive positions and meeting formats suggested in Mr. Bremer's memorandum to Mr. Allen for the Visit of Prime Minister Begin.

The meeting format in which the Treasury Secretary meets with the visiting dignitary with subcabinet officials of other departments is satisfactory for the Begin visit. Secretary Regan, however, will want to review meeting format proposals for other Mid-East countries visits on a case by case basis. The State Department paper implies the format used for this visit will apply to visits from all other Mid-East countries. We cannot agree to this. Treasury has a special relationship with several Middle Eastern countries such as Saudi Arabia. A joint meeting format in these cases would not be appropriate.

Various approaches have been explored, including: Israeli adherence to the Government Procurement Code, the striking of a bilateral side arrangement, broader application of the Buy America waiver, and expansion of the MOA. Inform the Israelis that the completion of a review under the circumstances does not prejudice the rights of either the U.S. petitioner or the Israeli exporters, since the petitioner or exporter may protect its interests by requesting an injunction to halt the actual collection of duties pending the outcome of the litigation and any instruction by the Court. (U)

BACKGROUND

On September 4, 1980, following a lengthy investigation, the Department of Commerce (DOC) determined that the Government of Israel provided subsidies to producers and exporters of roses under a variety of programs. The total amount of these subsidies was equal to 2.02 percent of the value of exported roses. Shortly after that determination, both the U.S. petitioner and the Israeli exporter filed suit in the Court of International Trade, alleging that the DOC had erred in its determinations as to whether or not specific programs were subsidies, and challenging the methods by which DOC calculated the value of subsidies. (U)

This litigation is still pending and DOC is proceeding with its administrative review of this determination as required by statute. This is consistent with DOC practice in other cases. The Israeli exporters asserted that DOC should not begin its review until one year after the original determination, and, further, that DOC should not conduct a review with respect to a case under litigation. DOC rejected these arguments on legal and administrative grounds, and review is proceeding normally. A verification trip to Israel is scheduled for September 14. (U)
