

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

SUBJECT: Signing of the US-Thai S&T Agreement During the Thai Prime Minister's Visit

At Tab II is a memorandum from State recommending the signing of the S&T Agreement with Thailand while Prime Minister Prem is at the White House for an Official Working Visit, 13 April.

The Thai very much need the visible concrete manifestation of the relationship and given ASEAN sensitivities toward the PRC, the signing will demonstrate balance (in that we did it with the Chinese) before the President's travel.

The signing would probably take place between Secretary Shultz and Foreign Minister Sitthi with the President and PM Prem looking on.

What we need now is simply a verbal OK from Mike Deaver so we can do the necessary planning. Would visualize it taking place between Cabinet Room meeting and lunch, but their call.

SUBJECT: White House Signing of U.S. - Thailand Science and Technology Agreement during Thai Prime Minister's Visit

The Thai government has proposed that the signing of the U.S. - Thailand Science and Technology Agreement, the negotiations for which were concluded successfully in Bangkok on March 9, take place at the White House during Prime Minister Prem's call on President Reagan on April 13. We support this proposal.

The Science and Technology Agreement had originally been envisaged to figure prominently in the President's visit to Bangkok scheduled last fall. Such a signing ceremony would have symbolized the continuation of close relations, and the strengthening of those ties in new directions. We know that the Prime Minister attaches considerable importance to incorporating this signing ceremony in his call at the White House and we believe it would be an appropriate event for the official working visit of so good a friend as Prime Minister Prem. It would also match the precedent established by the recent signing at the White House of the extension of the U.S.-China Science and Technology Agreement.

We recommend that this event be included in the Prime Minister's visit to the White House. We will address the questions of appropriate signing level, and timing of the event later, but we would like your concurrence now in principle to the Thai proposal.

Whereas Thailand has since 1975 provided first asylum for refugees fleeing Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia;

Whereas the Thai Government and the Thai people have over nine years cooperated with the international humanitarian effort to care for and resettle these refugees; and


Whereas the visit of the Prime Minister and his delegation symbolizes the most friendly relationship which has existed for a century and a half between Thailand and the United States: Now, therefore, be it

Resoluce, That the Senate hereby heartily welcomes the visit of Prime Minister Prem of Thailand and his delegation to the United States.

SEC. 2. The Senate commends the patient efforts of Thailand over the years to deal humanely with the outpouring of refugees from Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia by providing first asylum, and notes the efforts now being made to suppress acts of piracy against boat refugees.

SEC. 3. The Senate, noting the intrusion of Vietnamese forces from Kampuchea into Thailand in recent weeks, expresses its strong support for the security of Thailand.

SEC. 4. The Secretary of the Senate shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States with the request that the President transmit such copy to the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand.



Dear Mr. President:

The Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service is a cooperative agency of five Lutheran church bodies. LIRS and the 18,000 congregations it works with have been committed to alleviating the plight of refugees since World War II. With the help of Lutheran congregations over many years, LIRS has resettled more than 80,000 refugees.

Since 1975, Indochinese have been fleeing violence and repression in their home countries. Lutheran congregations have assisted in the resettlement of many of these Vietnamese, Cambodian and Lao refugees. Tragically, the Indochinese refugee exodus has not ceased to this day. Thailand is one nation which continues to offer them temporary first asylum.

It is our hope that you will commend Prime Minister Prem of Thailand for his government's generosity toward the Indochinese refugees when you meet with him on April 13, and that you will assure him of U.S. interest and commitment to their continued resettlement.

We also ask you to address a related issue of tragic proportions. We are deeply dismayed that pirate attacks continue to take place in the Gulf of Thailand. Over 50% of refugee boats which landed in Thailand in 1983 had been attacked by pirates at least once. As you know, Congress has appropriated \$5 million in anti-piracy funds for FY 84. We ask you now to expedite the allocation of those funds to address the piracy problem quickly and effectively and to share with Prime Minister Prem our great concern about this chronic phenomenon and our resolve to bring piracy under control.

Thank you for your attention to this matter of profound humanitarian concern.
