State will be forwarding a recommendation for a short meeting (10 minutes) between the President and Foreign Minister Siddhi of Thailand during his visit to the United States in April (Tab II).

Foreign Minister Siddhi has been one of our strongest supporters in Southeast Asia and has taken great political risks to stand with us on regional/global issues. Such a meeting would not only reinforce him at home, but provide an opportunity for us to help solidify the U.S.-Thai relationship that has recently deteriorated due to budget cuts, refugee matters and the protectionist provisions of the U.S. farm bill.

Should we be denied time through the normal scheduling procedures, given the importance of this signal, we would request that General Powell favorably consider NSB time.

Subject: Call on the President by the Thai Foreign Minister

The Foreign Minister of Thailand, Siddhi Savetsila, will be in Washington April 21-24. The Department proposes that he pay a brief (five to ten minutes) courtesy call on the President Thursday, April 21 or Friday, April 22.

Siddhi has been one our staunchest and most effective allies in the senior ranks of the Thai Government for a number of years. Recently, for example, he has taken the lead in efforts to secure better protection of U.S. intellectual property rights and to preserve first asylum in Thailand for Indochinese refugees despite extensive popular opposition on both fronts. He has been willing to take serious political risks on issues such of these, which are high priorities for the Administration, both because he appreciates their importance to us and because he believes a true friend should honor commitments. The opportunity to meet the President, even if only briefly, will demonstrate our appreciation for the role he has played, encourage him to continue his efforts, and enhance his effectiveness within the Thai Government.
