WASHINGTON, Feb. 8 — At least two Cabinet members have privately expressed misgivings about President Reagan's "new federalism," and their concerns tend to diminish the prospects for Congressional approval of his proposals.

For different reasons, Richard S. Schweiker, the Secretary of Health and Human Services, and Drew Lewis, the Secretary of Transportation, have raised questions about the proposal to reshuffle Federal and state responsibilities for welfare, Medicaid, transportation, education and other domestic programs.

Mr. Schweiker's concerns focus on the administrative complexity of the scheme, Federal officials said, while Mr. Lewis is concerned about the way in which it would be financed, with revenues from the excise tax on gasoline and other products.

Resistance on Medicaid Move

Several high-ranking officials who share Mr. Reagan's conservative views on welfare policy resisted the move for a Federal takeover of Medicaid, which provides medical assistance for poor people.

In an interview today, Robert B. Carleson, a White House aide specializing in welfare policy, said that he and David B. Swoap, the Under Secretary of Health and Human Services, were "not enthusiastic" about the Medicaid proposal.

Mr. Carleson and other conservatives say they fear that complete Federal control of Medicaid, combined with continued Federal control over Medicare, might lay the groundwork for national health insurance under another President.

Mr. Carleson and Mr. Swoap were California welfare officials when Mr. Reagan was Governor of California.

Senior officials at the White House, the Department of Transportation and the Department of Health and Human Services confirmed that Mr. Schweiker and Mr. Lewis had voiced their concerns in Cabinet discussions of the President's proposal.

Education Secretary T. H. Bell said he was also worried about the large number of Federal education programs that would have been transferred to the states under some of the "new federalism" proposals, officials said. But he was reported satisfied with the proposal

finally announced by Mr. Reagan.

Mr. Schweiker and Mr. Lewis, like the heads of other Cabinet departments, were largely excluded from development of the proposal, which calls for Federal assumption of all Medicaid costs in exchange for the states' taking over welfare, food stamps and more than 40 Federal grant programs.

The Department of Health and Human Services is now responsible for Medicaid, welfare and one-third of the Federal grant programs that would be transferred to the states.

Mr. Schweiker, according to an official intimately familiar with his thinking, "was concerned that the mechanics of this proposal and the various ramifications had not been explored in sufficient detail."

The official refused to permit use of his name, saying he did not want to be chastised for publicizing dissent within the Administration. The official emphasized that Mr. Schweiker, as a "team player," now supported the President's decision and was trying to work out the details as fast as possible.

A White House official said he understood that Mr. Schweiker was "a little bit piqued" at having been excluded from the deliberations. "It doesn't take long before Cabinet officers become captive to their constituencies," the official said.

To help states pay for their new responsibilities, President Reagan proposed to establish a "federalism trust

fund" that would take half of the revenue now raised by the Federal excise tax on gasoline.

Mr. Lewis had recommended that the tax, now 4 cents a gallon, be increased to 9 cents to raise billions of dollars for the Highway Trust Fund, which has incurred deficits in the last two years.

In a letter to David A. Stockman, director of the Office of Management and Budget, last December, Mr. Lewis said there was an urgent need to replenish the highway fund so that the Federal Government could complete the interstate highway system and repair fast-deteriorating roads and bridges. The gasoline tax is supposed to provide \$2.2 billion a year for the new-federalism trust fund.

As originally conceived, "new federalism" was to have included additional excise taxes, but President Reagan rejected that part of the package. In so doing, he reaffirmed his support for the tax cuts that lie at the heart of his economic recovery program.

Questions on Medicaid Plan

Mr. Schweiker correctly anticipated that governors, mayors and members of Congress would pepper the Administration with questions about the proposed new Medicaid program.

Mr. Stockman could not answer some of the questions when he testified Thursday before the Senate Committee on Governmental Affairs. He said that most states would profit from Federal assumption of Medicaid costs, but he acknowledged that the federalism proposals might lead to a net loss of Federal money for some states after 1987.

Richard S. Williamson, President Reagan's Assistant for Intergovernmental Affairs, confirmed that there had been disagreements within the Administration over the new-federalism proposals, but declined to give details.

Pear called me the evening before the article came out to "check quickly." He said he had been told by a good source that I and others had "opposed" the federalization of Medicaid because at some future time (another Administration) it could lead to National Health Insurance. I told him I would not characterize my position as having "opposed" but conceded that I was not enthusiastic about federalizing Medicaid but that as promised by the President in the SOTU and accompanying release, the "swap" could be designed in a manner which would preclude the danger of future National Health Insurance.

He asked if Dave Swoap's position could be described as "not enthusiastic" also. I told him I couldn't answer that. He'd have to check with Swoap.

He later asked if in the past Swoap and I had been opposed to NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE. I said we were both on record on that through past years.

His article incorrectly attributed to me Swoap's position on the Medicaid issue and did not refer to my statement that the President's plan would be drafted so as not to result in National Health Insurance.

I called him the day the article appeared to complain. He had no excuse for including Swoap in reference to my quote. He simply said that another "task force" source had told him Swoap was "fit to be tied." I told him that falsely attributing that to me was wrong.

He had no explanation for leaving out my positive reference to the design of the Medicaid portion of the swap.

If I had not challenged his description of my position as "opposing" he would have attributed to reliable sources my, and probably Swoap's, "opposition" instead of my being "not enthusiastic."

I don't know who in the White House were his original informants.

DIRECTIVE NUMBERPREPARATIONS FOR THE ECONOMIC AND NATO SUMMITSJUNE 1982

As announced on January 29, I will be attending the annual Economic Summit in Versailles, France, on June 4-5-6, 1982, and a special NATO heads of state/government meeting on June 9-10, 1982. This Directive clarifies the responsibilities of various agencies in preparing for the two Summit meetings.

I. Economic SummitA. Preparations With Other Governments - "Sherpa" Team

The Secretary of State will designate from the Department of State the President's Personal Representative to head the U.S. delegation to preparatory meetings for the Economic Summit. A representative of the NSC staff and of the Department of Treasury will also participate as official members of this delegation.

B. Preparations Within the U.S. Government

The President's Personal Representative will convene a Senior Interdepartmental Group with representatives from the Vice President's Office, the Departments of Treasury, Defense, Agriculture, Commerce and Energy, Director of Central Intelligence, USTR, NSC, and CEA to coordinate preparations for the Economic Summit. The NSC representative will serve as Executive Secretary of the SIG. The SIG will have responsibility for preparing all economic and political issues and briefing materials for the Economic Summit, including coordination of U.S. participation in Summit preparatory meetings and other international meetings where Summit issues are discussed.

The SIG will coordinate on a regular basis through the National Security Council apparatus with a Senior White House Group chaired by the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs and the Deputy Chief of Staff. The Senior White House Group will provide guidance on all matters relating to the Economic Summit.

Decisions relating to the Economic Summit will be taken in the National Security Council expanded to include the agencies participating in the SIG. Discussions of Summit-related issues may also take place in the relevant Cabinet Councils, as determined by the Senior White House Group.

II. NATO Summit

A. Preparations With Other Governments

The Secretary of State has primary responsibility for representing the United States in policy preparations with other countries for the NATO Summit.

B. Preparations Within the U.S. Government

The Department of State will convene and chair a Senior Interdepartmental Group with representatives from the Vice President's Office, the Department of Defense, the Central Intelligence Agency, the National Security Council, and the Joint Chiefs of Staff to coordinate preparations for the NATO Summit. The NSC representative will serve as the Executive Secretary of the SIG. The SIG will have responsibility for preparing all issues and briefing materials for the NATO Summit.

The SIG will coordinate on a regular basis through the National Security Council apparatus with a Senior White House Group chaired by the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs and the Deputy Chief of Staff. The Senior White House Group will provide guidance on all matters relating to the NATO Summit.

Decisions relating to the NATO Summit will be taken in the National Security Council.

MEMORANDUM TO THE PRESIDENT

Subject: Withdrawal of Wilderness

ISSUE: Should the Reagan Administration change its position by supporting a prohibition of entry into Wilderness areas, take the political leadership from the liberals and secure some "good" provisions in Wilderness legislation that will likely pass this year?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes - It is recommended that I be authorized to announce on February 21 on Meet the Press and then on February 22 before the House Interior Committee that the Reagan Administration will ask Congress for legislation that will:

1. Prohibit any leasing or mineral entry in Wilderness areas or Wilderness study areas for 10 years, except in the case of emergency, in which case the President would have to seek approval of Congress for mineral entry or oil and gas development.
2. Require that the Secretary of the Interior report to the Congress every five years the expected or potential minerals, timber, and oil and gas that may be available in the Wilderness areas if required in an emergency.
3. And, most important, that upon conclusion of existing studies of Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management Wilderness study areas, those areas determined to be unsuitable for inclusion in the Wilderness System will be released for multiple-use management.

POLITICS: The House and Senate Republicans would be relieved, and the liberal Democrats stunned at such a Reagan Administration position. It would take a volatile political issue away from the Democrats. Our business friends would be disappointed, but understanding, in that they have not delivered us the votes to do anything other than what I am recommending or some variation thereof. If we do nothing, I fear a total and indefinite lock-up of these vast resources without regard to any knowledge of their potential values for national security or improvement of our quality of life.

FACTS: Eighty million acres of Federal land have been set aside in their natural state as Wilderness. But the 1964 Wilderness Act provided for mining and oil and gas permits and leases in the Wilderness through 1983.

- ° However, no oil and gas lease with occupancy has ever been allowed in the Wilderness even though there is high potential in the Wyoming - Montana overthrust belt areas.
- ° There is no legal reason to deny the granting of the leases that are being sought in Wyoming and Montana.
- ° The political pressures to prohibit leasing or mineral entry have swept the country. There is little, if any support for leasing in the Wilderness at this time. The merits on the matter are totally disregarded. It is an emotional issue that has captured most, if not all, our Republican friends on the Hill. The liberals have been beating us from the very beginning of the issue.
- ° I am required to testify before the House Interior Committee February 22 and this issue will arise.
- ° It is my judgment that legislation will be passed this year, 1982, prohibiting any leasing or mineral entry in the Wilderness areas.
