
I passed this request to Dick Darman who has been in touch with you and Ed about it.

She reported the inclemency, promised umbrellas, but failed to forecast sunny skies. As a result, uncertainty burst into fear, which hits this city where it hurts the hardest —the financial solar plexus. Secretary Shultz completed talks with French and West German representatives, but officials on all sides said they made no progress toward resolving the dispute over U.S. sanctions against European firms supplying equipment for the trans-Siberian pipeline. State Department spokesman John Hughes asserted that the meetings produced a "lot of common ground" on many aspects of East-West relations. But he acknowledged that differences over the pipeline issue remain so strong that it was decided not to discuss the sanctions specifically "at this forum."
