2. <u>Taiwan</u> : Congressional meeting on Taiwan at 1:30 should be put on the public schedule. Further guidance on issue is being prepared by State and will arrive by 9:00. It was suggested that Laxalt or Goldwater should serve as spokesman after the meeting; we may provide a letter or some sort of written guidance for them to refer to.	Speakes Clark Duberstein

Guidance is to deal with the group as we would any other outside interest group: perhaps meeting with them to hear their views, but without any special WH channel.
