2. <u>Tax Bill</u> : It was announced that Lyn Nofziger will be here from 10 to 14 days to devise a communications plan to help pass the tax bill. Also, a Legislative Strategy meeting will be held at 10:00 on the subject. Re news story on Social Security, it was stressed that staff should not be drawn into discussions on the subject by reporters; guidance is that we are awaiting the commission's report. 3. <u>Internal Revenue</u> : Congressman Rosenthal begins hearings August 11 on the disclosure of IRS information to the Selective Service. Hauser and Fuller will discuss and then make a recommendation.	Hauser Fuller
4. <u>Beirut</u> : There have been positive developments; however, the two key problems are that the Israelis have not yet agreed on a withdrawal timetable, and that commitments are not yet pinned down on where the PLO will go.	Clark
5. <u>General Supplemental</u> : Will be considered today in the Senate. Over \$700M in domestic spending has been added on the theory that we would not veto due to inclusion of CBI funds. Veto signal has been sent, however.	Duberstein Wright
6. <u>Tuition Tax Credits</u> : Senate Finance Committee begins markup on proposal today; a letter will be sent to all committee members before then.	Duberstein
7. <u>Federalism</u> : <u>Post</u> story on governors' break with the Administration is overstated; they have said they intend to continue working with the Administration in developing a plan, and have not rejected the President's proposal.	Williamson
8. <u>School Prayer</u> : Testimony begins today in the Senate Judiciary Committee; topic may also be discussed briefly in Legislative Strategy. We should consider sending another signal of our support to the Committee to avoid the type of misunderstanding that arose on tuition tax credits.	Duberstein Darman
9. <u>Firefighters Legislation</u> : Bill was again discussed that would provide a \$50,000 lump sum payment to certain federal employees killed in the line of duty. OMB opposes the bill, and a letter of opposition was sent to Carl Perkins on July 21 (a similar letter was also sent last year). Concern has been expressed about a possible campaign commitment to support such a bill; no evidence of such a commitment has been found, though. Dole, Fuller, Wright and others should meet to discuss our position.	Dole Wright


