2. <u>Saturday Radio Speech</u> : A draft discussing Jim Watt's achievements at Interior has gone in to the President. This topic is contingent on Judge Clark being confirmed today by the Senate.	Gergen
3. <u>Legislative Calendar</u> : A debt limit extension which will last until mid April passed the Senate and will be taken up today in the House. Revenue sharing, reconciliation, State Department authorization, and Judge Clark's nomination will all be voted on today. The Defense Appropriations conference report will also be voted on today (the compromise includes money for covert activities in Central America, but does not include funds for binary weapons). A close vote is expected in the House today on the IMF conference report.	Duberstein
4. <u>Baby Doe Case</u> : Question of whether to appeal the district judge's ruling rests with the Justice Department.	Fielding
5. <u>Natural Gas</u> : A compromise deregulation bill was supposedly worked out late last night, and is being reviewed carefully by DOE.	Fuller Duberstein
6. <u>Enterprise Zones</u> : Yesterday's testimony by three Cabinet officers had the desired effect in demonstrating the seriousness of the President's commitment. After the hearing, twenty additional co-sponsors signed the House legislation.	Duberstein Verstandig
7. <u>"The Day After"</u> : Secretary Shultz will be interviewed after this film, and a panel discussion will follow the interview. Op-ed pieces have been prepared for distribution following the film. It was emphasized that we should not attack the network for showing the film, nor should we attack the film itself. We agree with the premise that nuclear war is horrible; the key question for debate is how to prevent it. Guidance regarding a particular news report is that the President has seen the film, but did not suggest that changes be made in it.	Gergen
8. <u>Veterans Jobs Bill</u> : Although Sen. Simpson has requested a signing ceremony for this legislation, it is not considered advisable to hold such an event here at the WH. Alternative signing events can be explored.	Duberstein Whittlesey
9. <u>Revenue Sharing</u> : A signing ceremony will probably be scheduled for this bill.	Duberstein

10. Dairy Legislation: It was noted that this bill includes a tobacco provision, along with other provisions of importance to particular states. 
