SUBJECT: Lou Cannon; Reagan Nazi War Film Story

Simon Weisenthal Version: When in Signal Corps, RR went to Europe to film war camps, was deeply moved, saved film to show to people later.

Breger Version (according to WASHINGTON POST reporter Joanne Omaang): As Breger recalls it, President told story to Weisenthal, but said he saw film in U.S. while serving in the Army, saved the film to show later.

Israeli Newspaper version: Shamir told a group in a private session after his last visit to the U.S. that RR had confided that he went to Europe to film war camps, according to unnamed sources.

Shultz version: RR told Shamir in private meeting that he saw film while doing work with intelligence unit, was moved by it, kept the film, years later showed it to a Jewish friend who doubted the horror of the camps, but has kept it private because the film he kept was then classified SECRET. RR still has the film.

Cannon has held the story until we tell him what we find out from Shamir. Obviously wants to write that RR exaggerated the story (said he went to Europe personally), or made it up (never saw such a film). Lou says he's interviewed countless people who knew RR in his Army days, including RR, and nobody ever heard about this or told this story. He says RR told it in 1981.

Need to:

- Get RR version of what he told Shamir and Weisenthal.
- Alert him to potential credibility problem.

Either trying or improperly keeping fact prop.

Ambassador Lewis will try to get to Shamir to confirm that he recalls the story as Shultz does -- expect to hear from him today and to pass what he says to Cannon.
