1. <u>Today's Schedule:</u> There will be full press coverage of President Jorge Blanco's arrival and meeting with the President, the Fair Housing ceremony, and the signing of the Wheat Improvement Act. Wire photos will be taken during the signing of HR 4206, and a special effort will be made to provide information on this to veterans' publications.	Speakes McManus
2. <u>Jackson Plan:</u> It was noted that Senator Helms voted with the Democrats in committee yesterday, causing the Plan to fail. Helms apparently felt that military aid provided by the Plan was insufficient. A meeting may be held to discuss the possibility of reconsideration.	Oglesby McFarlane
3. <u>Mining of Nicaraguan Ports:</u> Bill Casey will brief the Intelligence Committee and Ken Dam will brief the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on this subject. Senator Kennedy has introduced "sense of the Senate" resolutions which would oppose use of U.S. funds for mining, and would overturn our refusal to accept World Court jurisdiction of the matter. We are taking steps to brief the Hill regarding international legal precedent for our action. Also, it was noted that none of the \$21 million in covert aid requested would be used for mining.	Oglesby McFarlane
4. <u>Budget:</u> The Senate continues to debate the Finance Committee package, with Senator Metzenbaum gaining very little support in his attempts at delay. The Senate Budget Committee is considering a budget resolution. though such a resolution has little prospect for success. Instead, emphasis will remain on passage of the deficit reduction package.	Oglesby
5. <u>Central American Aid Request:</u> We are attempting to secure House agreement to go to conference on the supplemental, Though Rep. Whitten is not supportive. We will continue to push for Congressional action on this before the recess.	Oglesby
6. <u>Bankruptcy Legislation:</u> A Senate hearing is being held today on <u>Bildisco</u> in an attempt to resolve that issue.	Oglesby Fielding
7. <u>Natural Gas:</u> It was mentioned that Rep. Dingell may be close to securing the votes necessary for approval of his bill by the House Energy and Commerce Committee.	Oglesby
8. <u>Child Nutrition Amendments:</u> This measure will be taken up by the House, and we hope to show veto strength.	Oglesby
9. <u>White House Conference on Small Business:</u> It was mentioned that the House has passed a resolution calling for such a conference to be held in 1985.	Oglesby

10. Saturday Radio Talk: No decision has yet been made on a topic, though Treasury has suggested that this week's speech discuss taxes. Darman
11. Olympic Games: Regarding recent Soviet complaints, it was stressed that the U.S. has been cooperative on virtually every request made by the Soviet government, with the exception of granting a visa to a suspected KGB agent. Speakes
12. National Association of Public Administration: A signing ceremony for a bill chartering this group cannot be scheduled since today is the last day for action. Wright
13. Conrail: Today, DOT will announce an offer from Allegheny to buy Conrail. It was noted that this will require legislation and that there may be other offers. Questions should be referred to DOT. Fuller
14. Economic Update: The April update of economic assumptions will be available today. For the most part, adjustments are minor, with a slight favorable change in the short-term deficit figures. Feldstein

1. <u>Today's Schedule:</u> The President's trip to Kansas City and Dallas will receive full press coverage.	Speakes
2. <u>Budget:</u> The Senate is continuing work on the Finance Committee package after voting down a repeal of indexing yesterday. They may complete work on the tax portion of the bill by Thursday night. The House is taking up the tax bill today, and will consider reconciliation tomorrow.	Oglesby
3. <u>Legislative Calendar:</u> It was noted that the House has passed the Defense Production Act conference report, and is continuing committee mark-up on natural gas legislation. The question of a conference on the supplemental, which includes aid to Central America, is still unsettled, and may not be concluded before the recess. Lastly, there is a possibility that the House and Senate could complete business by Thursday night.	Oglesby
4. <u>Nicaragua:</u> Senator Baker assisted in pulling down a Senate amendment regarding World Court jurisdiction over the mining of Nicaraguan ports. The Senate did pass a resolution opposing the mining, though the Administration did not contest it. There appears to be an agreement that no further non-germane amendments on Central America will be offered during debate on the Finance Committee package.	Oglesby McFarlane
Guidance will be formulated regarding questions as to whether the President approved the mining. Also, it was emphasized that the CIA has followed the applicable executive order in this area.	McFarlane Speakes
5. <u>Dual Primary System:</u> News reports have mentioned that DOJ is considering joining Jesse Jackson's lawsuit on this issue. Guidance is that we have had not contact with the Justice Department on their plans.	Fielding
6. <u>Saturday Radio Talk:</u> The topic of this week's speech will be Central America, with particular emphasis on our World Court action and on Nicaraguan attempts to subvert the Salvadoran government.	Darman


