2. <u>Economic Figures</u> : The CPI rose 0.2% in May, an increase of only 4.2% over the past 12 months. Also, advance durable goods orders were up 3.3% in May. Tomorrow's radio talk will emphasize the point that good economic news, such as we are seeing now, does not offer a basis for pessimism.	Speakes Darman
3. <u>Legislative Calendar</u> : After passing several appropriations bills yesterday, the Senate will not be in session today. The House will meet today to take up rules and the military construction bill. Next week, pay equity and comparable worth will likely reach the floor.	Oglesby
4. <u>Defense Authorization Bill</u> : The Speaker has announced the House conferees on this bill, and has included Rep. AuCoin, a prominent support of the nuclear freeze.	Oglesby
5. <u>Central American Aid</u> : Sen. Kasten's subcommittee on foreign operations has approved the amount of aid requested by the Administration.	Oglesby
6. <u>Embassy Move to Jerusalem</u> : This subject was raised in a House committee hearing yesterday, with Michael Armacost giving the Administration's position. It is considered likely that congressional pressure will continue to build on this issue.	Oglesby
7. <u>Deficit Reduction</u> : It was noted that the conferees have done an outstanding job in reaching an agreement on spending cuts. In the process spousal IRA's were cut, and no decision has been reached on enterprise zones or other tax issues (such as ACRS). We are hopeful that the package will reach the floor next week.	Oglesby
8. <u>Meetings with the President</u> : It was stressed that the names of persons meeting with the President should be turned in to the Secret Service as early as possible to allow time for proper clearance procedure.
