3. <u>Bills Awaiting Action</u> : At this point, possible veto candidates include the Bureau of Standards authorization bill, the American Conservation Corps legislation, and the Public Health Services and Health Research bills. The Equal Access to Justice bill has not yet been received, but is considered controversial. The staff will recommend approval of the Vietnam Veterans National Medal Act, despite a veto recommendation by Treasury. Approval will also be recommended for the bill renaming a federal building in honor of the Foley family. In addition, it was noted that the Justice Department will recommend a veto of the Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Act; this bill will be examined closely, with a decision due by October 31.
