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



Your Majesty:

I want you to know how gratified I am that the US Congress, in exercising its responsibilities under our laws, has supported my proposal to provide the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia with air defense enhancement equipment, including aerial reconnaissance aircraft.

I have made quite clear, on the public record, the importance the United States attaches to the security and strength of the Kingdom and my personal desire to continue working with you and your government to strengthen the Kingdom's defenses, modernize its armed forces, and begin to build greater security cooperation between us. This is important not only for Saudi Arabia but for the security and stability of the entire Middle East region.

Our two governments face enormous challenges--political, security, and economic--in which our continued close cooperation is essential if we are to meet our responsibilities toward the pursuit of peace, security and prosperity in the Middle East and in the wider international arena. Be assured of the value I place on the strong and solid cooperative relationship which has developed over the years between our two countries and of my determination to continue working with you to build on that close relationship. In this respect, we appreciate the Kingdom's recent decisions to extend additional support to Pakistan and the Sudan. Given the increased threat in the region much more will be

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required of us both. Similarly, we will need, as I discussed with Crown Prince Fahd at Cancun, to continue the close cooperation between our two governments in working for peace and national integration in Lebanon.

While there are many important problems which we must face together, one of the more critical ones involves achieving steady and sound progress toward a comprehensive, just, and lasting peace in the Middle East. The United States Government will continue to work diligently and effectively toward achieving peace in the Middle East. I remain confident that our two governments can work together in harmony and close cooperation in this endeavor.

Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

As you know, the Senate has voted to sustain my decision on arms sales to Saudi Arabia. We understand the difficulties this sale poses for Israel. At the same time, as was mentioned during your visit in September, this sale is of great importance to America's policy of strengthening the strategic consensus in the region.

Mr. Prime Minister, you have my reassurance that America remains committed to help Israel retain its military and technological advantages. The security of Israel remains an essential factor in our decisions on strategic issues in the region. This Administration has a continued interest in working with Israel on a wide dimension of strategic issues, efforts which serve our mutual interests.

I want also to underscore that our effort to strengthen our strategic position is dedicated to, and serves, our hopes for peace. In the next few months we all must do everything we can to achieve the vitally necessary progress needed to advance the Camp David peace process.

Mr. Prime Minister, it is in the spirit of close cooperation and friendship that has characterized our Israeli-U.S. relations over the past thirty-three years that this letter is directed. I look forward to continuing and building further on this relationship.



THE END OF ISRAELI OCCUPATION OF SINAL IS AN HISTORIC ACCOMPLISHMENT OF ENORMOUS IMPORTANCE TO THE PEOPLES OF THE MIDDLE EAST AND TO THE CAUSE OF PEACE IN THE REGION. THE FACT THAT IT HAS OCCURRED DESPITE CONSIDERABLE TENSION IS EVIDENCE OF A GENUINE DESIRE FOR PEACE ON THE PART OF THE GOVERNMENTS INVOLVED, AND ALSO OF THE VITALITY OF THE PROCESS UNDER WHICH THIS PEACE WAS ACHIEVED.

THE RETURN OF SINAI TO EGYPT IS OF COURSE BUT A STEP ON THE ROAD TO COMPREHENSIVE PEACE. THE UNITED STATES CONTINUES TO BELIEVE THAT JERUSALEM SHOULD REMAIN PHYSICALLY UNDIVIDED, OPEN TO MUSLIMS, CHRISTIANS AND JEWS SO THAT ALL MAY WORSHIP FREELY AT THEIR HOLY PLACES IN THE CITY. AS YOU KNOW WE HAVE NEVER ACCEPTED UNILLATERAL CHANGES IN THE STATUS OF JERUSALEM AND BELIEVE ITS FINAL STATUS MUST BE AGREED IN NEGOTIATION.

THE UNITED STATES, AS YOUR MAJESTY WILL APPRECIATE, HAS LIMITED INFLUENCE WITH EITHER BELLIGERENT. WHILE THERE HAS BEEN SOME IMPROVEMENT IN OUR ACCESS TO AND

DIALOGUE WITH IRAQ, NORMAL DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS DO NOT EXIST .

WITH REGARD TO IRAN, I SEE NO PROSPECT THAT IRAN'S REVOLUTION-ARY LEADERSHIP WOULD BE RECEPTIVE TO A DIRECTOR INDIRECT APPROACH FROM THE UNITED STATES, IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES THE US. SUPPORTS ALL

RESPONSIBLE EFFORTS TO BRING THE WAR TO A CLOSE, WHETHER THEY BE THROUGH THE UNITED NATIONS, THE ISLAMIC CONFERENCE OR INDIVIDUAL STATES WHICH MIGHT PLAY A MEDIATING ROLE. IN PARTICULAR, WE HAVE ENCOURAGED THE ALGERIAN GOVERNMENT, WHICH PLAYED A CENTRAL ROLE IN THE 1975 DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN IRAQ AND IRAN, TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITIES OF MEDIATION. THE ISLAMIC

CONFERENCE IS PERHAPS IN THE BEST POSITION TO ARRANGE A
CEASEFIRE, INCLUDING THE PROVISION OF PEACEKEEPING FORCES

WE HAVE CONSULTED RECENTLY WITH SEVERAL OF OUR EUROPEAN ALLIES REGARDING THE ADVISABILITY OF A NEW INITIATIVE IN THE UNITED NATIONS, BEARING IN MIND OUR STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION IN 1988 CALLING FOR AN URGENT, NEGOTIATED END TO THE CONFLICT. THOSE GOVERNMENTS CONSULTED HAVE BEEN UNANIMOUS IN THE JUDGMENT THAT A NEW INITIATIVE IN THE UN WOULD NOT BE WELL RECEIVED IN TEHRAN AND THAT U.S. SUPPORT FOR IT COULD NEGATIVELY INFLUENCE IRAN'S REACTION.

I SHARE YOUR CONCERN ABOUT THE CURRENT INTENSE ROUND OF FIGHTING AND BELIEVE WE MUST ALL BE ALERT FOR POSSIBLE MEDIATING OPPORTUNITIES ONCE IT ENDS. WE ARE IN CLOSE CONSULTATION IN A NUMBER OF CAPITALS ON THIS QUESTION. I ALSO BELIEVE THAT OUR POLICY OF NOT PERMITTING THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF US-CONTROLLED MILITARY EQUIPMENT TO EITHER SIDE HAS BEEN CONSISTENT WITH OUR STRONG EMPHASIS ON KEEPING THE WAR FROM SPREADING TO NEIGHBORING STATES. IN PRACTICE, IT CAN BE ARGUED CONVINCINGLY THAT OUR RESTRAINT ON SUPPLYING ARMS TO, OTH COMBATTANT HAS BEEN TO IRAQ'S NET ADVANTAGE SINCE THE UNITED STATES HAD NOT BEEN A SUPPLIER OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT TO IRAQ. 1. SECRET - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. IF BY APRIL 25 SINAI WITHDRAWAL HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED AND LEBANESE CEASEFIRE IS HOLDING, YOU SHOULD DELIVER THE FOLLOWING LETTER FROM PRESIDENT REAGAN TO KING KHALID IN ACCORDANCE WITH INSTRUCTIONS YOU WILL BE RECEIVING SEPTEL.

3. BEGIN TEXT:

HIS MAJESTY, KHALID IBN ABD AL-AZIZ AL SAUD, KING OF SAUDI ARABIA, RIYADH

YOUR MAJESTY:

MY GOVERNMENT AND I HAVE BEEN AWARE OF YOUR DEEP CONCERNS DURING THE LAST FEW DIFFICULT DAYS IN THE MIDDLE EAST. AT THIS CRITICAL TIME, IT IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT THAT NO MISUNDERSTANDINGS ARISE BETWEEN US WHICH MIGHT COMPLICATE OUR COMMON QUEST FOR A JUST, COMPREHENSIVE AND LASTING PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST CONFLICT.

THE END OF ISRAELI OCCUPATION OF SINAI IS AN HISTORIC ACCOMPLISHMENT OF ENORMOUS IMPORTANCE TO THE PEOPLES OF THE MIDDLE EAST AND TO THE CAUSE OF PEACE IN THE REGION. THE FACT THAT IT HAS OCCURRED DESPITE CONSIDERABLE TENSION IS EVIDENCE OF A GENUINE DESIRE FOR PEACE ON THE PART OF THE GOVERNMENTS INVOLVED, AND ALSO OF THE VITALITY OF THE PROCESS UNDER WHICH THIS PEACE WAS ACHIEVED.

THE RETURN OF SINAI TO EGYPT IS OF COURSE BUT A STEP ON THE ROAD TO COMPREHENSIVE PEACE. I AM DETERMINED TO MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO SUSTAIN PROGRESS TOWARD PEACE, FIRST BY ACHIEVING AGREEMENT ON THE PRINCIPLES GOVERNING AN AUTONOMOUS REGIME IN THE WEST BANK AND GAZA. OUR POSITION IN THESE NEGOTIATIONS AND IN THE FINAL STATUS TALKS TO FOLLOW IS BASED FIRMLY ON THE PRINCIPLES OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS 242 AND 338. WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THESE NEGOTIATIONS THE PARTIES ARE COMMITTED TO DEALING WITH THE PALESTINIAN ISSUE IN ALL ITS ASPECTS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ISRAEL IS FORMALLY COMMITTED TO RECOGNITION OF THE LEGITIMATE RIGHTS OF THE PALESTINIAN PEOPLE.

YOUR MAJESTY, I KNOW THAT YOU HAVE A SPECIAL CONCERN ABOUT JERUSALEM. THERE HAS BEEN NO CHANGE IN THE U.S. POSITION WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE STATUS OF JERUSALEM. THE UNITED STATES CONTINUES TO BELIEVE THAT JERUSALEM SHOULD REMAIN PHYSICALLY UNDIVIDED, OPEN TO MUSLIMS, CHRISTIANS AND JEWS SO THAT ALL MAY WORSHIP FREELY AT THEIR HOLY PLACES IN THE CITY. AS YOU KNOW WE HAVE NEVER ACCEPTED UNILATERAL CHANGES IN THE STATUS OF JERUSALEM AND BELIEVE ITS FINAL STATUS MUST BE AGREED IN NEGOTIATION.

YOUR WISE COUNSEL ON THESE MATTERS SO CRITICAL TO THE SAFETY AND WELFARE OF ALL THE PEOPLES OF THE MIDDLE EAST WILL CONTINUE TO BE OF GREAT VALUE TO ME AND MY ADVISORS. IN THE SPIRIT OF CLOSE COOPERATION AND FRIENDSHIP THAT HAS ALWAYS CHARACTERIZED OUR RELATIONS, I LOOK FORWARD TO REMAINING IN THE CLOSEST POSSIBLE CONSULTATION WITH YOU AS WE PROCEED DOWN THE DIFFICULT PATH TOWARD A LASTING PEACE IN THE MONTHS AHEAD.
