PRESIDENTIAL TAPING: TRIBUTE TO IRVING BERLIN WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 8, 1986

Irving Berlin is the embodiment of almost a century of America's history. As a boy, he was part of that poor but proud immigrant's world on Manhattan's Lower East Side. In Tin Pan Alley, he got his start; and, with Alexander's Ragtime Band, became the first to make jazz acceptable and successful. From then on, it was one delightful musical success after another. He had brilliant careers in two uniquely American cultural institutions: the musical comedy stage and, as you've seen and I can't forget, the movies.

So it was that Irving Berlin became a national institution, a living legend; celebrate Christmas or Easter or sing about America and Irving Berlin is there. He and his music are a reflection of all the decency and goodness and heart in the American past: the sometimes zany quest for anything new, the dreams of true love, an attachment to hearth and home for the holidays and love of country -- freedom and fellowman.

Yes, America owes Irving Berlin -- for helping us to understand who we are and reminding us to live up to what's best about ourselves. As long as 30 or 40 years ago, Irving Berlin was getting gold medals from the United States Congress and the President of the United States, so I won't give him another one today. But I will say what millions of Americans would say if they had the chance; millions of Americans who, for almost a century, have been comforted and inspired and lifted up by his



Dear Miss Board:

I am writing to you to ask your assistance in arranging for a television appearance by President Reagan in conjunction with our PBS documentary special honoring the accomplishments of Irving Berlin.

The program, entitled IRVING BERLIN'S AMERICA, was commissioned by the Public Broadcasting Service for broadcast during its March 1986 Pledge Week period, during which the PBS stations encourage public contributions to help support their operations and programming. The 90-minute special, to be widely promoted and broadcast nationally, will combine celebrity interviews, film and television clips, and newsreel/archive footage to illustrate the lively relationship between the music of Irving Berlin and the spirit of 20th-century America.

Some of the people already interviewed about Mr. Berlin's work are: BOB HOPE, MARY MARTIN, ROSEMARY CLOONEY, HOWARD KEEL, PATTY ANDREWS, NANETTE FABRAY, SIDNEY SHELDON and a special musical tribute by MARVIN HAMLISCH and MAUREEN MCGOVERN.

Because of Mr. Berlin's passionate patriotism and singular contributions to American popular culture in this century, and because of his personal connection with President Reagan through the movie version of TRIS IS THE ARMY (1943), we are hoping that the President will consider a brief appearance on the program, in recognition of Irving Berlin as the "songwriter" laureate of America.

If we were allowed to tape a segment with the President, or were given a tape of his remarks, before the end of December, we could include it in the program itself. If the taping was done between January 1 - March 1, the segment would be used after the broadcast, as a special feature before the next program.

Last March, Camera Three Productions produced RODGERS AND HAMMERSTEIN: THE SOUND OF AMERICAN MUSIC for PBS and raised 1.5 million dollars on the first airing. We hope to do as well, and better, for PBS with our Berlin special, and we know that an appearance by President Reagan would be a wonderful addition to our program.

I hope this letter had provided enough background information for you to go forward with this request. Please call me if there is anything else that we can do from here. Thank you for your efforts on behalf of IRVING BERLIN'S AMERICA.

CAMERA THREE PRODUCTIONS INC., is an independent company which evolved from the production unit responsible for the weekly CBS Television series "Camera Three." That series of performance specials and documentaries in the arts and sciences won several Emmy and Peabody Awards, before finally bowing off the CBS Network, after 27 years, as one of the longest running program series in world television.

Currently in production is <u>Portrait of Philip Johnson</u>, an incisive profile of the architect for the forthcoming WNET series "American Masters."

Starting production this summer is <u>Only One New York</u>, a weekly arts magazine series for The Municipal Broadcasting Corporation (New York City).

The 90-minute special, to be widely promoted and broadcast nationally, will combine celebrity interviews, film and television clips, and newsreel/archive footage to illustrate the lively relationship between the music of Irving Berlin and the spirit of 20th-century America.

Some of the people already interviewed about Mr. Berlin's work are: BOB HOPE, MARY MARTIN, ROSEMARY CLOONEY, HOWARD KEEL, PATTY ANDREWS, NANETTE FABRAY, SIDNEY SHELDON and a special musical tribute by MARVIN HAMLISCH and MAUREEN MCGOVERN.

Because of Mr. Berlin's passionate patriotism and singular contributions to American popular culture in this century, and because of his personal connection with President Reagan through the movie version of THIS IS THE ARMY (1943), we are hoping that the President will consider a brief appearance on the program, in recognition of Irving Berlin as the "songwriter" laureate of America.

If we were allowed to tape a segment with the President, or were given a tape of his remarks, before the end of December, we could include it in the program itself. If the taping was done between January 1 - March 1, the segment would be used after the broadcast, as a special feature before the next program.

Last March, Camera Three Productions produced RODGERS AND HAMMERSTEIN: THE SOUND OF AMERICAN MUSIC for PBS and raised 1.5 million dollars on the first airing. We hope to do as well, and better, for PBS with our Berlin special, and we know that an appearance by President Reagan would be a wonderful addition to our program.

I hope this letter has provided enough background information for you to go forward with this request. Please call me if there is anything else that we can do from here. Thank you for your efforts on behalf of IRVING BERLIN'S AMERICA.
