I. PURPOSE

To provide compensation to Americans of Japanese descent relocated and interned in the United States during the Second World War.

II. BACKGROUND

The bill implements the recommendations of the Commission on Wartime Relocation and Internment of Civilians by authorizing a trust fund of \$1.2 billion for Japanese-Americans and Aleutian Island residents who were interned during World War II.

In your August 1, 1988 letter to the Leadership of the House of Representatives, you said that "the enactment of H.R. 442 will close a sad chapter in American history in a way that reaffirms America's commitment to the preservation of liberty and justice for all."



The bill passed the House and Senate by comfortable margins, supported by broad-based and bipartisan coalitions. While there was at one time a senior advisors veto threat on H.R. 442, a Presidential letter urging expeditious and affirmative action on the final version of the bill was sent to the Congress on August 3.

A Presidential signing ceremony prior to the August recess would highlight the President's concern for those who suffered internment and relocation during World War II. Members of the Japanese-American community who have long sought enactment of this legislation and the bipartisan coalition in the Congress could be invited to take part in this historic event.

SUBJECT: Signing Ceremony for H.R. 442

In the event that there is a signing ceremony for H.R. 442, the Civil Liberties Act of 1988 (Japanese Internment), at which individuals other than Members of Congress and Administration officials are present, I recommend that Angus MacBeth, a partner in the Washington office of Sidley & Austin be invited. MacBeth's interest was communicated by Carol Dinkins, who was Deputy Attorney General and Assistant Attorney General during the first five years of the Reagan Administration. Apparently MacBeth served as legal counsel to a commission which examined the Japanese internment issue and reported to Congress, and he apparently also testified before Congress on Japanese internment legislation. Dinkins knows him from his days as a Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the Land and Natural Resources Division (LANDS) at Justice where he was a holdover for a few months from the Carter Administration while Carol was in her first months as Assistant Attorney General for the LANDS Division. Carol and MacBeth since have worked together on Japanese internment and Hawaiian native claims issues as both allies and friendly adversaries; and she strongly recommends that he be invited.

I would be appreciative if your office would let me know whether this request can be honored as I would like to get back to Carol.
