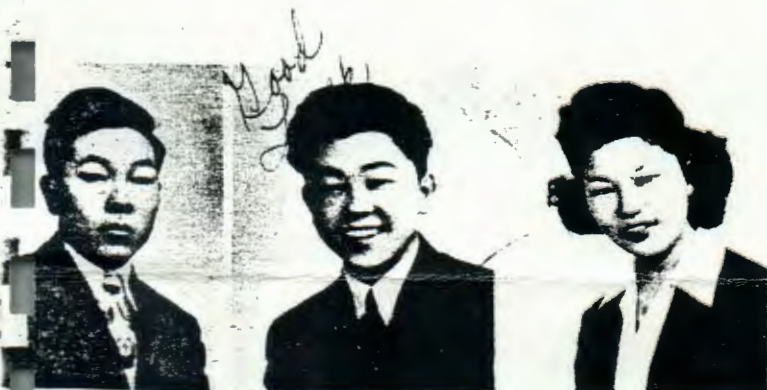
senior calendar

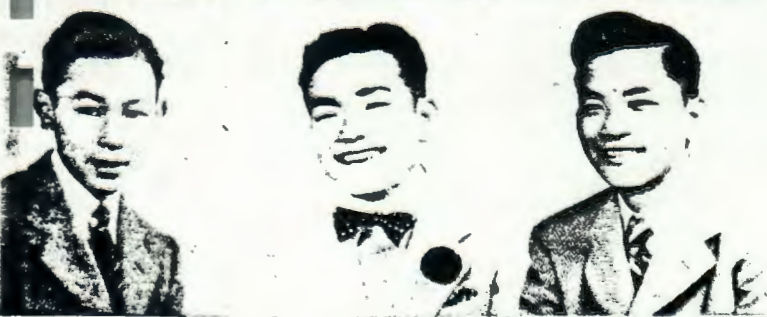

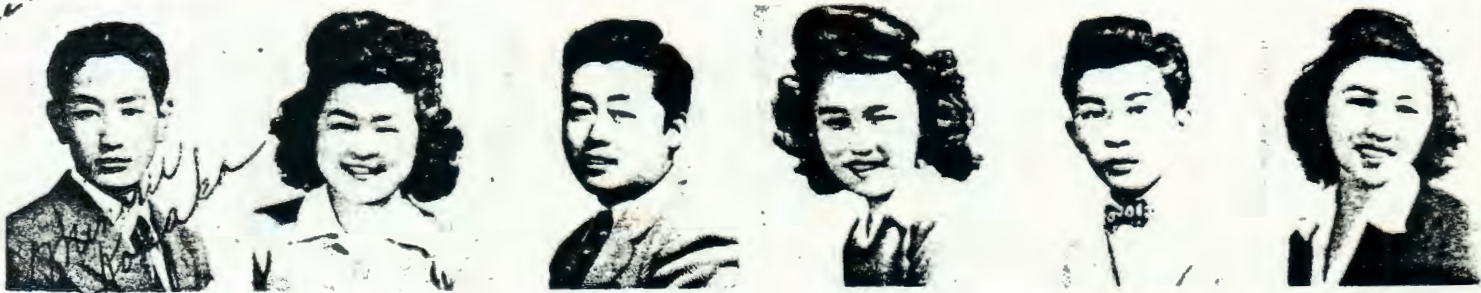

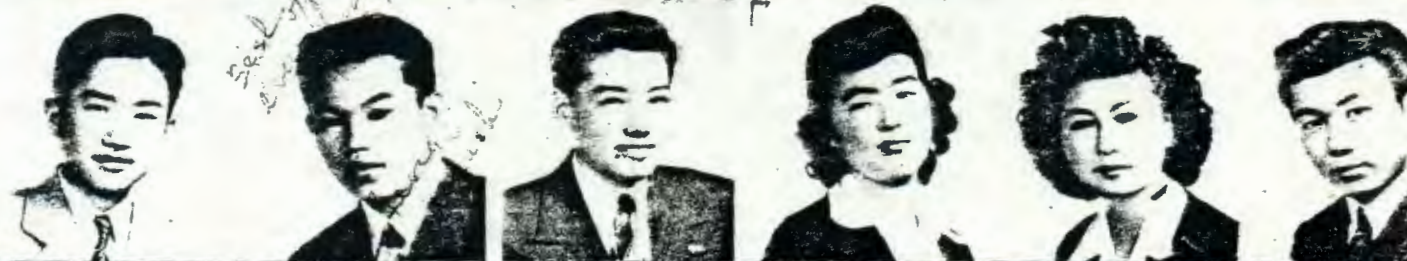

With the Junior-Senior Football game as a starter, the mighty "Duces" completed an activity laden year. Following the election of their officers for the first semester, an installation dance was held on October 23, 1943. Then the generous, thoughtful Juniors donated mirrors for the latrines on November 10, 1943 with Teddy Hayashi acting as chairman. A "Flunkers' Frolic" on December 10, this time with Yuki Shiba as chairman, was next on the list of their many activities. Under the supervision of Kats Marumoto, a "Christmas Seal Drive" was held with donations going to the Manzanar Hospital. For their first social of the new year, a Valentine Day Dance with "Be Careful It's My Heart" as the theme was held on February 7, 1944, with Tom Hashimoto as chairman. Bidding adieu to Miss Ely, on March 10, 1944, a "Farewell, Miss Ely" social was held with Yuki Shiba and Tommy Hashimoto directing the program. Next came the "Duces' Raffle and Dance" on April 21, 1944 with the chairmen Hisao Hashimoto and Teddy Hayashi. The highlight of the year, the Senior Prom, was given by the Juniors on May 27, 1944 with active Hisao Hashimoto, and Teddy Hayashi acting as chairmen. As the final fling of the year, the "Duces" enjoyed a picnic on June 7, 1944.

Known to the Student Body as the "solid" class, the Sophomore flag bearers completed a year of successful activities. With their monthly socials, they really went to town. Clad in jeans and cotton for the "Barn Dance" on the eve of November 20, 1943, the "Prospectors" gathered for their first social of the year. On this occasion, Akira Kishishita and Masako Koni waltzed away with the Waltz contest prize. Sharing the prevalent Christmas spirit of the camp, the Sophs held their Christmas Dance on December 18, with New Year resolutions being read. With Shoji Hamachi's "Paper Doll" and Kei Ono's tap dance to keep them in the mood, the Prospectors started the year off with the "Follies of '44." In honor of the Tule-bound Sophs, a Pre-Valentine Dance was held on February 8, 1943, the hi-light of the event being Mas Yano and Rosie Shizumura's duet. Other activities of the year were the "Ides of March" on the fifteenth, and an "April Fools' Day Festival." This was followed by the "May Day Dance" with the graduating Seniors present as honored guests. Inter-homeroom football games were some of the other activities of the year.
