CONVEYED TO SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER GROMYKO IN THE FORM OF YOUR PERSO AL MESSAGE WAS TIMELY AND I STRONGLY SUPPORT YOUR PROMPT ACTION AND THE RESOLUTE STANCE YOU HAVE TAKEN.

I TOO BELIEVE THAT THE PROBLEM OF POLAND SHOULD BE RESOLVED BY THE POLISH PEOPLE THEMSELVES FREE FROM ANY OUTSIDE INTERVENTION, AND I HAVE MADE THIS KNOWN PUBLICLY ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS INCLUDING IN MY STATE-MENT OF DECEMBER 6, 1980 AND IN MY FOREIGN POLICY SPEECH IN THE DIET ON JANUARY 26, 1981,

THE GOVERN ENT OF JAPAN IS AWARE OF THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE BY THE COUNTRIES OF THE WEST TO HELP POLAND OUT OF HER ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES. WE, DURSELVES, ARE ALSO CURRENTLY STUDYING THE MATTER. . I UNDERSTAND THAT POSSIBLE MEASURES TO BE TAKEN AGAINST THE SOVIET UNION IN THE CASE OF ITS INTER-

VENTION IN POLAND ARE BEING STUDIED BY NATO ON THE BASIS OF THE LIST OF MEASURES PREPARED BY YOUR GOVERN-

MENT.

THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN, AS A MEMBER OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEMOCRACIES, IS WELL AWARE OF THE NEED TO JOIN IN CON-CERTED STEPS AGAINST THE SOVIET UNION. IN THIS REGARD, IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT JAPAN IS FULLY CONSULTED ON THE MEASURES FOR WHICH HER COOPERATION IS EXPECTED. HOWEVER, THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN WISHES TO AVOID HAVING THE CON-SULTATION ON THIS MATTER DIRECTLY WITH NATO. INSTEAD IT IS OUR WISH TO CONSULT BILATERALLY WITH MAJOR IN-DUSTRIAL DEMOCRACIES INCLUDING THE U.S., AND AS FOR THE EUROPEAN COUNTRIES, WITH THE E.C. AS PART OF OUR POLITICAL DIALOGUE, WHICH HAS PROGRESSED CONSIDERABLY DURING THE PAST YEAR.

IT IS OUR BELIEF, HOWEVER, THAT WE SHOULD BE CAUTIOUS ABOUT THE CREATION OF A NEW MECHANISM FOR CONSULTATION ON THIS MATTER, IN VIEW OF THE RISK OF ITS EXISTENCE

BECOMING KNOWN PUBLICLY.

IN CLOSING, I SHOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU AGAIN FOR YOUR THOUGHTFUL MESSAGE AND REITERATE MY HOPE AND INTENTION TO MAINTAIN CLOSE CONSULTATIONS AND FRANK EXCHANGES OF VIEWS WITH YOU ON THIS ISSUE AND OTHER MATTERS OF MUTUAL CONCERN THAT MAY ARISE IN THE FUTURE. I LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU SHORTLY.
